MLTF Tax Credits Available

Individuals wishing to donate to the Monsignor Lafferty Tuition Foundation (MLTF) can receive an Iowa Tax Credit worth 75% of their donation. For example, if you donate \$1,000 you will receive a 75% tax credit. Your cost is \$250 and there is the potential you may receive a Federal Tax Deduction as well. Each Catholic school in the Diocese is allotted a set number of tax credits to be distributed locally. In Boone, we have filled 82% of those credits already. If you typically donate to this program you may want to contact Deb in the Development Office at 515-432-1971 as the Des Moines Diocese has used their entire allotment of credits. We now run the risk of those individuals looking to receive their credits from another Diocese.
