Catholic Recipe: St. Michael's Waffles

This is an American version of St. Michael's Gaufres, or waffles. In France, paper-thin sweet wafers called gaufres were baked by street vendors who set up their stands near the great cathedral to lure worshipers coming from Mass on St. Michael's Day to taste their wares. Not many people have a gaufrier, the special waffle iron used in France, but if you wish to serve waffles for supper on St. Michael's Day, you'll be right with tradition. The Feast of St. Michael on September 29 has become a combined feast for the archangels Michael, Raphael and Gabriel. This feast is also called Michaelmas.

DIRECTIONS

Blend eggs and sugar. Add flour and milk alternately. Beat hard. Add butter and vanilla. The mixture is thin and should spread evenly on the preheated iron. If Gaufres tend to stick, butter both sides of the iron. Serve hot or cold.

INGREDIENTS

- 2 eggs
- 1 egg yolk
- 2/3 cup sugar
- 1-1/3 cups flour
- 3/4-1 cup milk
- 4 Tablespoons melted butter
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla

I have spoken many times about my trip to the Holy Land that I was able to go on 5 years ago. One of the things I was able to experience that we don't get here in the US is another group of Christians (the Orthodox). They are ones we don't see here in the US a lot as they are mostly set in the Middle East, whereas us Catholics are often called the Western Church (or Latin Rite). One of the things we were able to see was the Orthodox worship. It was something different and fascinating. Everything they said was chanted; there was no regular spoken thing said. The priest would chant one thing and the deacons and servers (and people) would respond in chant. They also continually burned incense, sweet smelling incense. Seeing their worship gave me great inspiration to continue to learn more about Holy Mass and how to fully celebrate it. Celebrating Holy Mass correctly is far more important than what many (and I mean MANY) realize. Over the past 50 or so years, we have treated Holy Mass more and more like a commodity than actual worship of God. We have endlessly changed, or put things into Mass that only reflect worship of ourselves, and as the saying goes "We become what we worship." This is something I remember: in order to grow in our relationship with God, we must fully worship Him, as He has taught us. While some may not like things like chant or incense, there are reasons for doing them. They are a part of full worship of God as is related in the Psalms and in the Book of Revelation. Remember: Lex Orandi Lex Credendi (as we pray, so we believe.)
