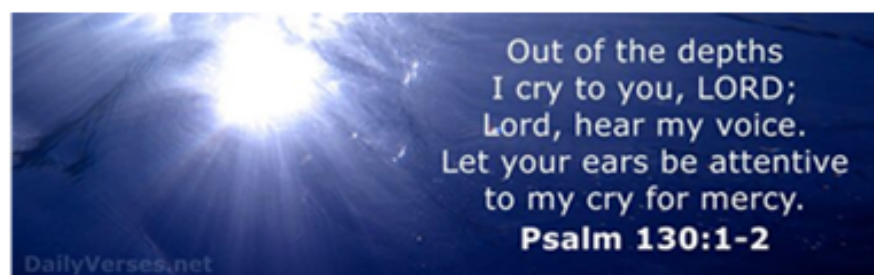


The Holy Father's Intentions for the Month of November

EUCCHARISTIC MIRACLES EXHIBIT GRAND OPENING ON NOV. 12

St. Patrick Catholic Church – Cedar Falls, Iowa

In November, Saint Patrick will host an internationally renowned exhibition, "Eucharistic Miracles of the World." The experience includes more than three dozen museum-quality panels which document Eucharistic Miracles that have occurred across the world over the centuries and will be available to see at no cost. The exhibits will be displayed in the lower-level gym, directly below the Church, and will be available to view beginning Sunday, November 12, from 10:30 a.m. to 3 p.m., and each following Sundays in November at these same times.

The displays will also be available to view each Tuesday and Thursday evening from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m., and on Wednesday mornings from 9:30 a.m. to 11:15 a.m. The last weekday availability will be Wednesday, November 22, and the final Sunday availability will be on November 26. The panels are being provided by Iowa Catholic Radio; a free-will donation box will be available to assist Iowa Catholic Radio with this project.

Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord; Lord, hear my voice!

The month of November is dedicated to the Holy Souls in Purgatory. The Church commemorates all her faithful children who have departed from this life but have not yet attained the joys of heaven. St. Paul warns us that we must not be ignorant concerning the dead, nor sorrowful, "even as others who have no hope ... For the Lord Himself shall come down from heaven ... and the dead who are in Christ shall rise.

The Church has always taught us to pray for those who have gone into eternity. Even in the Old Testament prayers and alms were offered for the souls of the dead by those who thought "well and religiously concerning the resurrection." It was believed that "they who had fallen asleep with godliness had great grace laid up for them" and that "it is therefore a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead, that they may be loosed from sins." We know that a defiled soul cannot enter into heaven. (Excerpted from *Liturgical Meditations*, The Sisters of St. Dominic)

Purgatory is not eternal. Its duration varies according to the sentence pronounced at each particular judgment. It may be prolonged for centuries in the case of the more guilty souls, or of those who, being excluded from the Catholic communion, are deprived of the suffrages of the Church, although by the divine mercy they have escaped hell. But the end of the world, which will be also the end of time, will close forever the place of temporary expiation. God will know how to reconcile His justice and His goodness in the purification of the last members of the human race, and to supply by the intensity of the expiatory suffering what may be wanting in duration. But, whereas a favorable sentence at the particular judgment admits of eternal beatitude being suspended and postponed and leaves the bodies of the elect to the same fate as those of the reprobate; at the universal judgment, every sentence, whether for heaven or for hell, will be absolute, and will be executed immediately and completely.

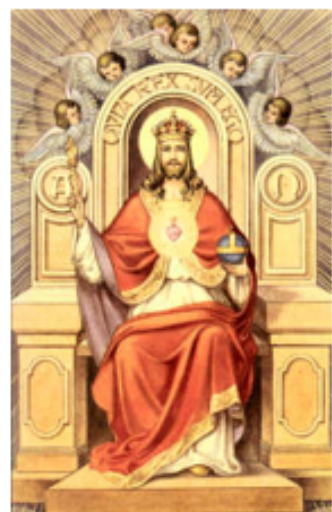

Solemnity of Christ the King

The last Sunday of the Liturgical Year. This feast is a public, social, and official declaration of the royal rights of Jesus, as God the Creator, as The Word Incarnate, and as Redeemer.

'Though already present in his Church, Christ's reign is nevertheless yet to be fulfilled 'with power and great glory' by the King's return to earth. This reign is still under attack by the evil powers, even though they have been defeated definitively by Christ's Passover. Until everything is subject to him, 'until there be realized new heavens and a new earth in which justice dwells, the pilgrim Church, in her sacraments and institutions, which belong to this present age, carries the mark of this world which will pass, and she herself takes her place among the creatures which groan and travail yet and await the revelation of the sons of God.' That is why Christians pray, above all in the Eucharist, to hasten Christ's return by saying to him: *Marana tha!* 'Our Lord, come!'
