Working together, then, we appeal to you not to receive the grace of God in vain. For he says: In an acceptable time I heard you, and on the day of salvation I helped you. Behold, now is a very acceptable time; behold, now is the day of salvation. 2 Corinthians 6:1-2

Dear Parishioners of Saint Thérèse, Little Flower:

We heard these words at the beginning of the season of Lent. Every Ash Wednesday St. Paul urges us to "be reconciled to God," "as if God were appealing through" him. Little did we know then what that would mean for us now. Indeed, now is a very special time. Certainly it is a unique time.

This has been challenging for all of us. It is only in times like this that we realize how true it is that "man is a social animal," as Aristotle said, meaning we were created for relationship: with God and with other persons. We know this from the revelation of God as well: we were made by love, for love - and to love is to give oneself and give everything. So perhaps our lives seem less full at this time since we may be apart from so many that we love.

But not all. Many of us have others under the same roof whom we can care for and reach out to. God wants us to continue to live concretely His command to love your neighbor even in the home, when our neighbor is our relative or housemate. So I need to really love well Seminarian Vince Faurote (who just got back from seminary to do "homeschool") and Fr. William Orbih. For those traveling out for groceries or other necessary excursions, you may encounter others you are called to love. In fact, even keeping our six feet from others is an act of love of neighbor.

One important note, the church will remain open for prayer from 8 am to 10 pm, daily. It is one of the "essential entities" that our governor Eric Holcomb has allowed to remain available to the people, as long as the CDC's regulations for social distancing are observed and no official gatherings are occurring. So come individually or as a family for some quiet time in church. I bet it is the quietest you will ever find it!

And in truth, distance cannot fully separate us. Our hearts may be of one accord, even when we are not physically close, as our global Catholic communion of faith attests, and that is the unity that matters most in God's eyes. Thanks be to God, technology can also have a good side to it. There are many ways to stay connected to your parish family. Please see below the ways you can keep up with what is happening in the parish through the website, bulletin, and social media. (Although the bulletin will not be printed for at least the next two weeks, we will still have the digital copy online).

I continue to post regular videos each day, as well as many other great things from our parish staff. We hope you may consider joining in our book study of The Chronicles of Narnia, the series by C.S. Lewis that is as entertaining and beneficial for adults as it is for children. Keep your eye out for all the other things we are doing to stay connected.

Many people will struggle with this time of separation, when many of their ordinary ways of living are curtailed or gone. Now is the time for us to share the joy that we have in Christ, for now is a time when people can really be open to receiving the good news that can shine from our lives. Live the quiet, peaceful joy that is shown in forgiveness, patience, thoughtfulness, kindness, and generosity. The fruits of the spirit should be alive in you, and "where the spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom," a freedom that does not feel "trapped" in this time of social isolation, a freedom that makes others want the same. Don't forget to sing, to garden, to play games, to laugh and tell jokes, to show forth the joy of a life that knows God is still God, and He is here.

And above all, keep praying, placing yourself before the gaze of love that God wants to shower over you and bring healing to your soul.

3. Orațio

Responding to the sacred words in prayer, either silently or out loud, or in writing.

2. Meditatio

A reflective dwelling on the text-think about the word or words that the Holy Spirit has called to your attention, holding them in your mind and considering them from different angles.

4. Contemplatio

Resting in God's presence & love, quieting yourself & listening for God's response to your prayer.

Healing Prayer Corner: Say Yes To Love




"And turning to the black man, the hostess said: 'Which means, Sir, we have reserved you a seat in first class."
