

### Hallow's Daily Miracle

Curious to hear how God is at work in the world today? Check out Hallow's Daily Miracle stories and hear amazing stories of hope and joy. It is a great practice as we continue this Jubilee Year of Hope to remind ourselves to hope in the loving, merciful, and awesome power of God.

## Do you enjoy praying for other people?

We want to know who you are!

We want to grow our intercessory prayer ministry and gather prayers for those who ask. When we practice intercessory prayer, we are bringing the needs and asks of others to God. God already knows what we need and when we ask God to help us, we honor him and we participate in the mediating power of Christ.

We not only want to say prayers for these petitions but we want to keep track of how God is working in their lives. We want to hear the victories and glorify God accordingly. Oftentimes, when we are asked to pray for someone, we don't follow up on their intentions to appropriately rejoice with them.

In today's readings, we hear the story of Naaman the Syrian who is healed and comes back to the prophet Elisha glorifying God. Then we hear about Jesus healing ten lepers, one, after being healed, returns to Jesus glorifying God. We don't know what happens to the other lepers.

God is still working today. It may be in a moment of healing or it could be in how he places people in our lives to be present at just the right time. In this society, God working may be called coincidence or luck. When we choose to see with eyes of faith, we can see God at work in our lives and glorify Him.

## Choosing to See with Eyes of Faith

In February, my then-five-month-old baby boy, was having stomach issues and had to go to the doctor - he couldn't keep anything down. They ran a bunch of tests and came to the conclusion that it could only be resolved with surgery and that surgery needed to happen TODAY. When we heard this, we immediately called Fr. Julius for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick and started sending out the prayer requests to absolutely everyone we could think of. We took him to the Hospital and waited for them to admit us, getting texts back of support and prayer.

After waiting for almost five hours, they finally admitted us. They ran more tests and we waited more hours only to be told we were getting an ambulance ride to Indianapolis. The pediatric surgeon we were waiting to see was unavailable and the next closest was in Indy. So the paramedics came, my son and I started the three hour, middle-of-the-night ambulance ride to Indianapolis while my husband buttoned up the house, packed bags, and drove out to meet us, narrowly avoiding a speeding ticket on the way.

My son and I arrived in Indianapolis to be admitted for more tests and sleepless hours of frustrating crying and endless bouncing. He was hungry but still couldn't eat because of the tests. They ran some new tests and reran some old tests. And we waited. There was only so much I could do. Eventually my husband arrived. About an hour after, they discharged us from the hospital saying that my son didn't need surgery - he just had a stomach bug and acid reflux. We were LIVID. All this aggravation and waiting and testing and driving for a stomach bug.

We dutifully visited our regular doctor when we got home, as instructed. At that appointment, it was revealed to us that the pediatric surgeon had been on vacation and the other pediatric surgeon in South Bend was sick. So we had to go to Indianapolis. Not only that, the hospital in Indy couldn't access the cloud servers to view the test results from the tests done in South Bend - that was why so many tests were rerun. Then they had to run more tests because some were inconclusive. What he said next flipped this whole frustrating saga on it's head. He said how lucky we were that the regular surgeons were unavailable so that they had to send us to Indianapolis. It was also very fortunate they reran the tests; imagine opening up a five month old for a stomach bug! He explained that some tests are harder than others to gage what is going on because there is a lot of room for human error when looking at imaging on a tiny, squirming, crying baby.

As my husband and I were reflecting on this with each other and all those we had asked for prayers, someone shared with us that it wasn't just "luck" or "a coincidence" for these circumstances. This was a miracle. Maybe God allowed the wait time to work a miracle of healing in my little boy. Maybe it was a miracle of God putting people where they needed to be and technology not working as it should. Either way, in choosing to see these sorrowful and testing 24 hours with eyes of faith, we see God at work in our lives for the better. In this miracle, God revealed His power and glory to us and we are privileged to witness and attest to His goodness. ~Kelly Russell, Pastoral Associate for the Mission

## Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick

The healing hand of Christ is a sign of the presence of God; that same hand is extended to us in this sacrament now, to console and strengthen us.

Oftentimes when we are sick in the hospital, or about to go into surgery, we are so worried about many things, our loved ones, the bills, not to mention making sure there are enough tissues nearby for the next time we need one. So frequently, we forget to call on the Divine Physician!

In the Church's Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, through the ministry of the priest, it is Jesus who touches the sick to heal them from sin – and sometimes even from physical ailment. His cures were signs of the arrival of the Kingdom of God. The core message of his healing tells us of his plan to conquer sin and death by his dying and rising.

The Rite of Anointing tells us there is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness or surgery is sufficient.

When the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. But even if there is no physical healing, the primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing by which the sick person receives the Holy Spirit's gift of peace and courage to deal with the difficulties that accompany serious illness or the frailty of old age. So next time, call a priest!
