PASTOR'S NOTES: Today Jesus is "tested" again by the religious leaders of the day. "Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" (Mt 22:36). There were over 600 particular laws in the Mosaic law so to sum them all up was not an easy task. Jesus quotes Deuteronomy 6:5 followed by Leviticus 19:18. "He said to him, 'You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: you shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Mt 22:37-39). By putting these together in a sense he has created something new. Or at least this combination brings everything into focus. Of course a few more chapters further in chapter 25 of Matthew Jesus put them together again when he says "whatever you do to the least of my brothers and sisters you do for me" and that is said when the Son of Man comes in all is glory surrounded by his angels. Every once in the Litural of the Hours I am struck by I John 3:17, "I ask you how can God's love survive in a man who has enough of this world's goods vet closes his heart to his brother when he sees him in need?" One reason why this statement challenges me so much is that it is about a **failure** to act rather than doing something evil and, of course, that is a very serious matter because if God's love does not survive. If God's love does not survive. how can one be saved? God is love. As different scriptures are pondered over, I think most of them would lead us to the combination that Jesus talked about. Think about the ten commandments. The first three commandments speak about the love of God while the last seven address our relationships with people around us. I suppose it should not surprise us how important human beings are to God, after

all, in Jesus humanity and divinity is wedded together. Jesus is God and man. Jesus as the Word of God from the beginning would give his life for us humans, sinners though we be.
