PASTOR'S NOTES: Today, on the Second Sunday of Easter, we close out the first 8 days (the Octave) of the Easter season which is 50 days in total. I have mentioned how the early Christians recognized that Jesus had begun a new creation on the first day of week, so they called it the 8th day, or a day outside of this creation. Genesis describes how in the beginning on the first day God created the heavens and the earth. "Then God said, 'Let there be light,' and there was light. God saw how good the light was. God then separated the light from the darkness"(1:3-4, NAB). God spoke the word and it happened on this first day. Then in John's gospel we hear, "In the beginning

was the Word: the Word was in God's presence, and the Word was God. He was present to God in the beginning. Through him all things came into being, and apart from him nothing came to be. Whatever came to be in him found life for the light of men. The light shines on in darkness, a darkness that did not overcome it" (John 1:1-5, NAB). John the Evangelist is using the same language of Genesis, to tell us there is a new beginning in the Word becoming flesh. The Word that became flesh rose on the first day of week, which put that day outside of our seven day week. It became the 8th day; outside of our time as we know it. In the resurrection of Jesus God separated the light from the darkness. God put darkness to flight. God in Jesus began a new beginning of goodness & forgiveness when he breathed his Spirit upon his disciples. "Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.' And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them and whose sins you retain are retained" (John 20:21-23). He has created a new beginning of goodness because His Divine Spirit dwells with us. We hear in the Acts of the Apostles, "(Barnabas) encouraged them all to remain firm in their commitment to the Lord since he himself was a good man filled with the Holy Spirit and faith" (Acts 11:24). In this new beginning God has given us the same Spirit of his Son who was able to forgive his torturers from the cross, "Father, forgive them; they do not know what they are doing" (Luke 23:34a). This great feast of the resurrection we are celebrating also began a new beginning of the body, the glorified body. It is a great mystery, but it is transformed physically and yet it can be touched. I heard once someone grappling with how physical forms can be changed. Think about the different forms of H2O, ice, water, vapor. In some ways the body we have now is comparable to ice and the body that we will have will be like vapor. One can feel vapor, but what a

difference. This time of year as we read the resurrection stories we can think about our death and resurrection. Jesus came that we might have life and have it to the fullness (see John 10:10). Then see Paul's letter to the Philippians, "He will give a new form to this lowly body of ours and remake it according to the pattern of his glorified body, by his power to subject everything to himself" (3:21). More importantly he will give us his Spirit so that we can forgive like Jesus forgave. Fr. Tim
