PASTOR'S NOTES: It is hard to over emphasize the importance of the Resurrection of Jesus. Because Jesus rose from the dead the disciples no longer had fear of death. It was so real for the disciples that many, maybe even most, died for their faith. After Judas went his way, ten of the eleven remaining eleven died martyrs except for John the Evangelist who was allowed to write the fourth gospel after receiving much more insight from living many years after the resurrection. John has a keener view of the Jesus' divinity after visions that he relates in the book of Revelation. John also took the mother of Jesus, Mary, into his home so he had the advantage of being with her as well and learning about her insights. And of course, the out pouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost continued to enlighten John for many years. Jesus promised that he would be with them to the end of time. His presence enlightened John who in turn enlightened the church. There were and continue to be situations that the living Jesus needs to address through his church. We have two options to read for this Easter Sunday morning John 20:1-9 or Matt 28:1-10. In both of these gospels we hear that Mary of Magdala was the first to be at the tomb. In John's gospel she goes to tell Simon Peter. In Matthew's gospel "Mary Magdalene and the other Mary" see and hear angels. Then they they get to see Jesus on the way to the other disciples. They were there. They were faithful to being present and they received a great reward. We will never know what we miss when we are not present to Jesus, attending with open eyes and ears. I wonder how many times I have missed moments of Jesus' resurrected presence because I was attending to something that was not what the Lord wanted me to do. It does not have to be something extra ordinary. If we are present to what we are supposed to be doing, and simply having our eyes and ears open for the risen Lord, we will experience him.
