PASTOR'S NOTES: I have always liked John Henry Newman's works. He started out as an Anglican and became Roman Catholic. That was a tough journey for someone in England at his time. He suffered because of being true to following the truth. He is articulate and expressive in his homilies. He wrote a prayer to the Holy Spirit: "Come O Holy Spirit. Come as Holy Fire and burn in us. Come as Holy Wind and cleanse us within. Come as Holy Light and lead us in the darkness. Come as Holy Truth and dispel our ignorance. Come as Holy Power and enable our weakness. Come as Holy Life and dwell in us. Convict us, convert us, consecrate us, until we are set free from the service of ourselves to be your servants to the world. Amen" (Come, O Holy Spirit by John Henry Newman). The way he followed his convictions, though he suffered because of them, inspires me and many to follow the Truth and invite the Holy Spirit of Truth to truly take possession of our souls no matter what the cost. The reading we are using on Saturday night from the prophet Joel makes me think of Newman and his willingness to follow his call. "I will pour out my spirit upon all flesh. Your sons and daughters shall prophesy, you old men shall dream dreams, your young men shall see visions" (Joel 3:1)...Newman could see truth clearly and express it. On the day of Pentecost, we always read from the Acts of the Apostles 2:1-11. There was a sound like a strong driving wind and tongues of fire appeared to settle on the Apostles. In nature if you have wind and fire, there is the possibility of a raging fire if the conditions are right. It is destructive and we do not like to think of that combination in our lives. Nobody likes to see that in nature! Yet when the Holy Spirit is seen as wind and fire, the last thing that you have is indifference which is the curse of our modern society. When the Holy Spirit is truly involved, things that need to change, will change and new life is right around the corner. We need to invite the Holy Spirit into our lives so that we

can experience being set free from self-serving to being "servants to the world."
