PASTOR'S NOTES: "Whoever has ears ought to hear." Jesus often ends his parables with this exhortation. If we think purely in physical terms, it is hard to understand. Ears were created for hearing so if there are sound waves, we will hear. Jesus, of course, is talking about a deeper hearing, to understand. We know that Understanding is a Gift of the Holy Spirit. Last week in the gospel of the Sower and the Seed, Jesus invited us to look at what kind of soil we are and whether we are producing fruit. The parables this week give us a way to think about the existence of evil in the world next to the good. Many would like to make it their mission to destroy all evil, but it is impossible to destroy evil without also destroying the good. You kill someone who is made in the likeness and image of God. If a person is actively killing others, we accept it because we are stopping further killing. But if we have the evil contained, then we do not use further violence because of the past. In the parable the slaves suggest that they go pull the weeds up. The master points out that they would also pull up the wheat, the good. They were to leave it until the end of time, the harvest, then the angels would cut it all down, and separate the good and the evil. The wheat had to mature and produce the fruit. It seems that The Owner wants to see us produce fruit, even if it means that we have to do it in the face or in the presence of evil. Of course, many Saints in history became holier when confronted with obvious evil that they resisted. I often think of Saint Maximillian Kolbe who gave his life for a father who had children at home. Father Kolbe was put in maximum confinement with others, but that couldn't stop his goodness. He tended to the others as they died and after 14 days without food or water, he was murdered by SS guards. His goodness and sanctity shine all the more next to such evil. God the Holy Spirit can do great things with one whose only desire is to do God's will. "Whoever has ears ought to hear!" Fr. Tim
