PASTOR'S NOTES: Some are so shocked by Jesus' response to the Canaanite woman that they wonder if Jesus was racist. We always after to remember that Jesus had two natures. Divine and Human. The Church teaches that Jesus is fully human and fully divine and we have a phrase that expresses this: the hypostatic union. Jesus was fully human so Luke says, "And Jesus increased in wisdom and in years, and in divine and human favor" (Luke 2:52, NRSV, Catholic Edition). God cannot grow or increase because God is all wise and all knowing. When we encounter these things, it is hard to wrap our heads around this so some try to change the meaning to make it clear that Jesus is fully God. At other times when Jesus performs miracles those who want to emphasize that he is fully human try to explain it way. We must avoid either one of these approaches. One thing we know is that Jesus never sinned but that does not mean that he was always fully aware of his mission because he was fully human and growing in wisdom. It is amazing that Jesus allowed others to influence him and women played a role in his growth. Rabbis of that day would not even respond to women in the public especially if they were not their wives. We read about Jesus in public encountering the Woman at the Well in John's gospel. Also, in John's gospel Jesus responds to his mother when the family runs out of wine at the wedding feast even though he said that his time had not yet come. In this week's gospel the Canaanite woman asks for healing of her daughter but Jesus did not say a word to her at first according to the custom of the day. When she is persistent, he tells her that his mission is to Israel only and one does not take food from the table and throw it to the dogs. It should be noted that by responding to her it encourages her. It is also the case that the Greek word the evangelist uses for "dog" is not the vicious dogs of the street, but the dogs that are in the house like pets. And when the woman persists, "Please, Lord, for even the dogs eat the scraps that fall from the table of the masters" (Matt 15:27, NABRE). Jesus is obviously moved by her response. She is saying that he is the Master and there is enough for everyone at God's table. "Woman, great is your faith" (Matt 15:28a, NEBRE). She was willing to humble herself out of love for her daughter. May we have the faith of that woman and the humility of Jesus to allow those around us help us to grow and increase in wisdom. Fr. Tim
