PASTOR'S NOTES: "These last ones worked only one hour, and you have made them equal to us who bore the day's burden and the heat" (Matthew 20:12). Isn't there something in us that does not want to put ourselves in the same category at those in prison? We are not "equal" to them, right? And we are certainly not equal to the illegals, or those without proper papers. And vet when it comes to God, the Creator, The Redeemer, The One Who Sanctifies, there is such a great gap that it is hard to fathom. "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the Lord. As high as the heavens are above the earth, so high are my ways above your ways and my thoughts above your thoughts" (Isaiah 55:8-9). We are all creatures who have been made by the Creator. There is only one God, only one Creator. We are all sinners in need of his mercy. Every one of us without his mercy would be in torment for eternity. God wanted us to be like him so he sent his Son to dwell among us and give us the grace to be saved and continue the journey. The only way we continue in the journey is to acknowledge the rest of humanity as in need of our mercy not our condemnation. I think that is why in Jesus' parable he is very hard on the ones who think they are entitled to the Owner's generosity more than those who came on the scene late. Remember this is not about fair labor practices. The parable is about the kingdom of God. And the daily wage is what each one needed to provide for himself and his family, the arace that is needed today. The Owner is always generous because this Owner is God himself. God gives each one what he or she needs to enter the kingdom of God no matter when the person comes to the vineyard of the Lord. But if they do not go to the vineyard today, when he gives the order, that is a different matter. We do not have to worry about our past as long as we are committed to do what the Lord asks today. All are sinners and need the arace, love, and hope that God offers. May we accept God's mercy and be instruments of God's mercy today. Fr. Tim
