PASTOR'S NOTES: Jesus is dealing with deceptive people who are desiring to entrap him. He knows their duplicity. They ask him, "Is it lawful to pay the census tax" (Matt 22:17b). The hardcore religious position would be that you don't pay it. Not only is it supporting the Romans, a foreign occupying power, but it is also using a coin that professes the Roman Emperor as divine. If Jesus would say that they should not pay the tax, he would lead people into sedition against the Romans, a penalty that would be death for all in his group. If he said to pay the tax, then he could be accused of blasphemy because it would be "giving honor" to a leader who considered himself God. Jesus did not advocate religious rebellion & violence. He wanted his followers to have the wisdom to live in society without killing others while still holding on to God's authority and keeping God as primary before all else. In living in this world we have to avoid idols. On its own money is neutral, but if we pursue gain just for the sake of getting more, it becomes an idol. Money must be used by the Christian to build up the kingdom of God, not our own kingdom. If we take extravagant vacations, and if we have the toys we want, while we do not give to the poor with whom Jesus took the part, we are not giving to God what is God's. Jesus says at the judgment we will hear that if we failed to give to the poor, we failed to give to him and our destiny will be the place of fire prepared for the devil and his angels. This weekend's World Mission Collection is a prime opportunity to give to God what is God's. There are other realities that threaten our total adherence to God as number one. Political parties or leaders can become more important than our faith. Our adherence to sports as well can be idolatrous. Even though Jesus commands to celebrate the Eucharist "in memory of him," and if we do not eat his body and drink his blood we have no life in us, we simply dismiss this command for sporting events; that is not giving to God what is God's.
