PASTOR'S NOTES: The Presentation of Lord is on February 2nd. This feast is forty days after the birth of Jesus. In Leviticus 12:1-8 we hear what should occur after a woman aives birth. There is a purification process that must happen because blood was always seen as something dangerous and impure. This process took forty days for a boy. We hear in Leviticus the protocol: the first option is to offer a yearling lamb and a pigeon or a turtledove for a holocaust but if "she cannot afford a lamb, she may take two turtledoves or two pigeons" (Lev. 12:8). We hear in Luke's account how Mary and Joseph "came to offer in sacrifice 'a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons' in accord with the dictate in the law of the Lord" (Luke 2:24). Luke guotes directly out of Leviticus to show that they were fulfilling that law, but also more subtly making clear that they were poor for they would have offered a lamb if they could have afforded it. The church has had a long tradition of blessing candles and having a procession of light on the feast of the Presentation of the Lord, forty days after the birth of the Lord. If you want candles blessed for your home, bring them on or before weekend Masses, Feb 3rd & 4th. Why do candles fit into this feast? They are appropriate because Mary and Joseph were bringing, Jesus, the light of the world, to the temple. Simeon takes Jesus into his arms saying, "Now Master, you can dismiss your servant in peace; you have fulfilled your word. For my eyes have witnessed your saving deed displayed for all the people to see: a **revealing light** to the Gentiles and the alory of your people Israel" (Luke 2:29-32). This is where the candles come in during this dark time. Christ is light and we are to glorify the Lord by our lives of light. In a sermon by Saint Sophronius, bishop, which we read on The Presentation of the Lord every year (Feb 2nd) we hear. "In honor of the divine mystery that we celebrate today, let us all hasten to meet Christ. Everyone should be eager to join the procession and to carry a light. Our lighted candles are a sign of the divine splendor of

the one who comes to expel dark shadows of evil and to make the whole universe radiant with the brilliance of his eternal light. Our candles also show how bright our souls should be when we go to meet Christ." Fr. Tim
