In her lifetime, she established 67 missionary institutions (orphanages, schools and hospitals) to serve the sick and poor. PASTOR'S NOTES: "The Spirit drove Jesus out into the desert..." If you look at this passage in the Greek language, you will see the intensity of the Spirit's driving force. When the Spirit comes at Pentecost in Luke's gospel, there was a sound like a strong driving wind. This is the sense of Mark's gospel here. It is not a tiny whispering sound but a driving force. Of course, as the God-Man, Jesus was very aware of the Spirit's movements. Yet in Mark's gospel Jesus' humanness is also expressed pointedly. In the garden of Gethsemane, the Evangelist allows us to experience the emotions of Jesus, "Then he began to be filled with fear and distress" (Mark 14:34, NAB). I remember a deacon saying how he prefers John's gospel because the divinity of the Jesus is emphasized. In John's gospel which we always read on Good Friday; Jesus is in control even when they are arresting him. Jesus is giving the orders even to the soldiers that come for him. It is not the same way in Mark's gospel. Mark continues the theme of isolation, fear and distress that Jesus experienced as a fully human being who was doing God's will in the face of opposition. Last week we heard how Jesus takes the place of the leper who was healed. After the leper spread the healing abroad, "it was impossible for Jesus to enter a town openly. He remained outside in deserted places..." (Mark 1:45b). Now as we begin Lent, Jesus, one with the Spirit, is driven into the desert. He knows that he had to confronted the isolation and separation that would be his because he had chosen to do God's will. We, too, have to confront isolation and separation and have to be willing to accept that reality if we are going to do God's will. Even well-meaning people do not always understand when we do something for God. It can be that way in Lent when you choose to do extra stuff or try to abstain or fast. We always have to remember charity and love of neighbor, but we do not have to give up things that we feel called to do just because other people are uncomfortable with our choices. Fr. Tim
