PASTORS'S NOTES: "As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another" (John 13:34b-35). The kind of love Jesus had for us was sacrificial and was fiercely honest. Jesus did not shy away from the truth even if that meant that he would suffer and die for it. We are now seeing the same kind of Spirit in the Acts of the Apostles. Paul and Barnabas told the new Christians, "It is necessary for us to undergo many hardships to enter the kingdom of God" (Acts 14:22). They did not tell them that this was going to be any easy journey, that they could have everything they wanted, have all the toys they could afford, have two houses, and retire early if they live this faith. No, they warned them clearly that they "would have to suffer many hardships to enter the kingdom of God." Today we bless the graduates and tell them the same thing. This faith will have to be your priority if you are going to enter the kingdom of God. There is another statement Jesus makes about love and entering the kingdom of God that often strikes me: "Try to come in through the narrow door. Many, I tell you, will try to enter and be unable" (Luke 13:24). The only way, we will be able enter, is if we accept the Spirit that Jesus is giving us and become new creatures. We want to become like Jesus, to love as Jesus did. The sign of the cross helps us remember Jesus' kind of love. He died for us. John in the second reading has this vision of heaven, "The one who sat on the throne said, 'Behold, I make all things new" (Rev 21:5a). To love as Jesus loved is to be willing to suffer many things to enter the kingdom of God. In fact, the Apostles said we have to suffer many things to enter the Kingdom of God. We can not make our life goal the biggest paying job, or most prestigious positions, the toys of life, but our goal must be to enter the Kingdom of God. Fr. Tim
