

PASTORS'S NOTES: The feast of St. Peter and St. Paul does not fall on a Sunday very often, but since it is of such high importance, it becomes the feast for the day, rather than the 13th Sunday of Ordinary time. After Vatican II there was a desire to reclaim the Sunday celebration which celebrates primarily the resurrection of Jesus. Jesus' resurrection is the core celebration that give relevance to the rest of the saints' feasts. These two saints preached the resurrection with their lives and their deaths, both dying in Rome. They are why our church's center became Rome and why the successor of Peter, Pope Leo, is in Rome and not Jerusalem or some other city. The Catholic faith went out from Rome. We have plenty of material for this feast in the Bible so we are able to have different readings both for a Vigil Mass and a Sunday Mass. We hear how Paul was called directly from the Lord to preach the gospel. We hear that Peter, before the resurrection, was declared to be the rock in which Jesus was to build his church. Then, after the resurrection, when Peter was back fishing on the sea of Galilee, the same sea which Jesus had earlier called him to become a Fisher of Men, Jesus came to him after the resurrection to ask him three times if he loved him. It is easy to draw the conclusion that Jesus wanted him to know that love of Jesus, himself, was primary after he had denied three times, out of fear, that he knew Jesus. In Acts 12:1-11 Peter is imprisoned for his preaching of Jesus. Peter had become a different man who was very bold and had even rejoiced because he was judged worthy to suffer persecution for the sake of the name of Jesus (See Acts 5:41). Peter had been humbled because he had so adamantly proclaimed to Jesus that he would not deny him and could not remain faithful to that assertion when came to moment of facing Crucifixion with the Lord. Later, when Paul confronted Peter about what he had done, recorded in Galatians (2:11-14), it did not cause a rift in the Church because of Peter's humility was firmly established. The Catechism says we are saved by grace. I think Peter and Paul realized that it is through grace that we are able to remain faithful to any of our commitments not through our own strength. In the end, both of these great saints died for the Lord and are united in the heavenly realm. May they intercede for us to be passionate about our faith and give our lives for the sake of the name of Jesus. Fr. Tim
