PASTORS'S NOTES: A few weeks ago, in Luke chapter 12, we had the story of the guy who has a huge harvest and he wants to store treasure for himself, but not grow "rich in what matters to God." When God comes to him, he tells him that very night his life will be required of him and he is a fool. Then last week in Luke 12 Jesus encourages his disciples to give to the poor and tells us how we have to be servants who are found distributing food when the master knocks at our door. He adds that those who know their masters wishes but do not prepare to do them will get a severe beating. The more we know the more we are prepared to do what we need to do, but that also makes us more guilty if we are not doing the Master's wishes. Now this week in Luke 12, we hear how Jesus has come to establish a fire on the earth. A fire cannot be cold or lukewarm, it must be hot. We receive a fire, a lit candle, at our baptism. Jesus wants that fire of his love and his uncompromising virtue, and strong teaching to remain in us. In the book of Revelation we hear, "I know your works; you are neither cold nor hot. I wish that you were either cold or hot. So, because you are lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I am about to spit you out of my mouth. For you say, 'I am rich, I have prospered and I need nothing.' You do not realize that you are wretched, pitiable, poor, blind, and naked" (NRSV, Revelation 3:15-17). Then the image of Jesus knocking at our door is repeated in Revelation 3:20. In our first reading we hear Jeremiah, the prophet, is thrown into the cistern because he will not stop telling the people their sins and what they are failing to do. In the second reading, St. Paul writes, "Since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us rid ourselves of every burden and sin that clings to us and persevere in running the race that lies before us while keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus... Jesus endured the cross for us and we will need to struggle against sin until the end. That means always examining what we have done and what we are failing to do. Jesus gives us his very self in communion so that we can continue "running the race." Fr. Tim
