**RENEWAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE:** I thank Jeanne Thorpe for updating us and giving us a history of our parish buildings last Sunday. As of September 14th, we have achieved around 45.78% of our goal, \$343,350 and \$145,410 of new money given. My last report showed more new money but that was an error. I am sorry for that. (This money does not include the 10% match the Diocese will give when the pledges are completed; that figure is \$14,541 at this point) I remind you that my pledge and cash given are ALREADY part of this total because I decided to pledae \$50,000 and start paying over the next 4 vears rather than match at 5%. I wanted to aet out in front and lead rather than wait for people to give and then respond. There are many aspects of what we are updating: We are enlarging and updating the bathrooms on the west side to make them handicapped accessible; we are updating the air conditioning and heating system for house and church making them computer controlled; we are updating the electrical; we are expanding the entrance area; creating a family room, making office spaces more visible and welcoming. The "chiller" for cooling the church from the sixties went down two weeks ago and it took 6 – 8 hours to fix it. We had auality equipment in the beginning, but everything mechanical comes to the end of its life at some point. We have had incredible financial support for the family room and entrance way. I hope you can find something that you can support in this project, if not the whole project. It seems there are always reasons one can find not to give, but see if you can find one to give. Thank you! PS. As a parish council we sought out bids to fix the parking lot, and have proceeded with the bid. It was just under \$20,000, but the entrances will need more work that were not done now. Fr. Tim

PASTOR'S NOTES: Jesus predicts his suffering three times in the middle chapters of Mark's gospel and each time the disciples seem not to hear or reject it out right. Last week we heard Peter rebuke Jesus (8:32), today we hear the disciples simply start arguing who is the greatest (9:32), and then James and John come to him to seek the high places in the kingdom (10:37). It is very obvious that they cannot let go of a military leader who will liberate the Jewish people from the power of the Romans, the foreigners. Most likely they thought of themselves as those in the "inner circle" of

power and decision makina. Today Jesus takes a child, who had no power or protection apart from his dad in those days, and says they have to become like the child. The second reading fits in here really nicely. The letter of James says, "Where jealousy and selfish ambition exist, there is disorder and every foul practice (3:16)... Where do the wars and where do the conflicts among you come from? Is it not from your passions that make war within your members" (4:1)? The reality is when you put away ambition and associate with lowly many times you experience persecution. If you stand up for someone who is being bullied or being talked down to, you will receive the same treatment. That is exactly what the book of Wisdom is expressing about the "just one." "The wicked say: "Let us beset the just one, because he is obnoxious to us; he sets himself against our doings, reproaches us for transgressions of the law and charges us with violations of our training (Wisdom 2:12)... With revilement and torture let us put the just one to the test that we may have proof of his aentleness and try his patience. Let us condemn him to a shameful death; for according to his own words, God will take care of him" (2:19-20). Control, Pride or Arrogance and Ambition are different names for the same first sin that led to humanity's fall away from God's grace. Adam and Eve wanted to become like God in power without the amazing selfgiving love that ebbs from the core of whom our God is. God gives life and holds into being every little creature. All powerful is a central attribute of God, but his all loving nature is what makes God come to us in the person of Christ to suffer and die for us while we were yet still sinners. Power without care and love is what a dictator is. When rulers and leaders truly try to lead as a service to the many, they will suffer greatly. That is why I think true servant leadership is one of the highest callings. May we accept in all humility our call to be like Jesus who leads without destroying free will and the dignity of the each person created in God's image.
