



How to Truly Know and Love God



When Mary was confronted with an unusual request that God made of her, she didn't hesitate, even though she did not understand it. Mary loved God above all things and did what He asked, without regard to what anyone else thought about it, including her own family, fiancé, and the community in which she lived.

Could we do the same? Do we really trust God enough to do anything that He should ask of us? Do we love Him enough to overcome our own hesitation, without regard to what others may think of us, and do what He says?

In order to obey God, we have to know Him first, and then we have to spend enough time with Him in prayer to have a personal relationship with Him. We do a lot of things out of a sense of obligation, or because it is the right thing to do, but we only go to extremes because of love.

“You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment.”

Most of the time we are tempted to skim over this commandment and go on to the one we are more familiar with:

“The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself.”

It is very easy in life to get the two great commandments reversed and put ourselves and other people first in our life, and give God what's left over. Most good Catholics and Christian people in general, work hard at loving other people though, just as much as we love ourselves. We understand the second commandment pretty well, and work to apply it in our lives.

However, it isn't always easy to love God. You can't hug Him. You can't detect Him with your five senses. He is invisible, because He is a Spirit and not made of temporal matter, but He exists none the less. The only way to truly get to know God, and to love Him like the gospel says, “with all of your heart, with all of your soul, and with all of your mind,” is through a regular prayer life. The sacraments of the church help to predispose us to His grace, but that alone is not enough. He wants our time and attention, in regular conversations with Him through prayer. He has our complete undivided attention then. It is also good to spend some time listening for God in the quiet, after we have said our prayers.

Silence, solitude, nature, manual labor, and time spent in prayer are excellent means of becoming more aware of God's presence in your life. Surely, we can carve out at least a half hour a day to spend some time to get to know our creator better. When we reach for God, He always reaches back for us.

Your life will begin to change in ways you cannot even begin to imagine, if you do this. It's like scales that fall off the eyes of your heart, and you will begin to see the world around you in a completely different way. His love will surround you, and permeate everything, strengthening you and supporting you, so that life is so much easier to handle, and gentler on your soul and in your heart, than what you may have ever experienced before. www.acatholic.org

FAITH FORMATION CORNER

Silent Prayer



Every time I enter into silent prayer it takes quite a while to get situated. I'm thinking about the endless number of tasks that need to be done at

my job and my apartment. My mind never shuts off, unless I put my foot down and say, *Enough is enough*. Entering into silent prayer takes work. It takes discipline and courage to cut through all the little things that distract our minds and hearts to arrive at a sacred and productive silence.

I have some good days and I have some terrible days when I attempt to enter into silent prayer. However, the more I try, the better I get.

When I'm at my best in silent prayer, I get an overwhelming feeling that I am not in charge. While that sounds cliché, it seems to me that this simple mindset is the remedy to my stress, heartache, and anxiety. Day to day I get tricked into believing that my daily tasks, obstacles, and struggles are bigger than they are. Some days I even feel cheated that people don't recognize them or validate them, but my prayer puts things into the proper perspective. I get a profound sense that God is in charge and that life is mysterious. And no matter what struggles come my way, God has a way to redeem them. I like to think that I trust God, but silence helps me to live that trust.

God isn't some "thing" we can quantify; God is mystery. Silence is one of the most profound ways to dive deeper into the mystery that is God.

Silent prayer: it creates a deeper relationship with an infinite and mysterious God. It takes us down a path that ultimately leads to a deep friendship.





Operation Christmas Child



Hi,

My name is Sean O'Hara and I am a senior at Ridgefield High School. This fall I am once again working with Samaritan's Purse on their **Operation Christmas Child ("OCC") project which delivers shoeboxes filled with small toys, hygiene items, and school supplies to needy children all over the world.** In its first year, 1993, OCC sent 28,000 shoebox gifts to children in the Balkans. Since then, **more than 188 million children in more than 170 countries have received an OCC shoebox.**

I'm hoping you could fill a shoebox and help us bring joy to children around the world!

You can choose a boy or girl, ages 2-4, 5-9, or 10-14, include a personal note and even track your package online! You can use any shoebox or I would be happy to deliver and pickup OCC preprinted shoeboxes. I'm also happy to be supported by Tiger Sports (27 Catoonah Street) which will also act as a pickup/drop off location for the shoeboxes. In addition, I will have bins with shoeboxes to pick up/drop off on the stone wall on my driveway (25 Tally Ho Road). I can provide a list of suggestions of what to include in your shoebox but they include such things as a "wow" item (doll, toy truck, soccer ball, etc.), personal items (comb, hairbrush, toothbrush, etc.), school supplies, small articles of clothing, crafts, etc. You can find out more by following Operation Christmas Child on Facebook or by going to the OCC website (<https://www.samaritanspurse.org/what-we-do/operation-christmas-child/>). I need to collect all shoeboxes by Monday November 15th.

In addition, all are welcome to our "Packing Party" which we will be hosting at the Ridgefield Rec Center on Saturday, November 6th from 2:30 to 4:30. Get into the Christmas spirit early! Stop in and get involved by packing a preprinted shoebox with donated items we have been collecting. There will be music and OCC giveaways. You can also pickup preprinted shoeboxes to fill on your own.
