### The Most Holy Rosary

After she died, I received them from all over the world. They would arrive, some beautifully boxed and others sent in a none descript envelope with a letter explaining their history. Some were made by children, others acquired on a trip or passed down through family. They were rustic, exquisitely elegant, or charmingly simple, each drawing my attention and stirring my soul. More than just beads strung together to help keep count, these rosaries contained a lifetime of prayers, questions, and contemplations. Each bead captured a moment of prayer from Mary's beloved children.

My beads are simple wooden ones that had been pressed into my palm December 14th. At first, I would hold them so tightly they left impressions in my fingertips. I would reach for them in my pocket; they were my anchor when anxiety bubbled and doubt brewed. Now, they can be found beside my Bible and are used when my thoughts stray and my gaze wanders. I have come to realize that I am drawn into my heavenly Father's fold while praying the Most Holy Rosary. It is in the focused recollections of our faith's mysteries and repeated utterance of prayers that my thoughts are refined and my gaze restored. It is here that I need not search for words or perform deeds; I simply need to roll my fingers over the wooden beads and pray the rosary, contemplating and remembering the beauty and graces our Savior affords.





## A Light Unto My Path

### Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The holy mountain is an extraordinarily powerful spiritual metaphor in the Book of the Prophet Isaiah. In the second chapter of that great text, the mountain is presented as rising above the surrounding mountains, and all the tribes of Israel are depicted as streaming toward it. The sacred hill, of course, is Mount Zion, where the Temple is located, and its supremacy is meant to symbolize the unsurpassable importance of worshiping the Lord. A rightly ordered humanity, Isaiah implies will be drawn ineluctably to this place of right praise.

In the eleventh chapter, Isaiah shows us the holy mountain again, this time as the place of peace and reconciliation, where *lion and lamb lie down together* and where the *child plays by the adder's lair*. The point is that worshiping the Lord brings all people, indeed all creation, together. When we try to find peace in some other way, through either purely political machinations or military intervention, we will always fall short.

In the twenty-fifth chapter, he revisits the splendid height once more, portraying it now as a place of *rich food and choice wines*, where the Lord feeds his hungry people. Here again, the lesson is simple but profound: when we attempt to quiet the hunger of the heart through anything other than God, we will be frustrated.

So don't bother with the hills that surround Mount Zion. Join the tribes of Israel as they stream toward God's mountain.

## Isaiah 25:6-10a

He will swallow up death forever, and the Lord God will wipe away tears from all faces., and the reproach of His people he will take away from all the earth; for the Lord has spoken! it will be said on that day,
