FAITH starts off like a tiny seed in our soul. God plants it there when we are baptized. As we grow up our faith grows with us. We have to take care of it, just as a gardener takes care of a tiny plant. We must water it with prayer. We feed it with religion classes. We strengthen it with the grace of God.

Then when we grow up, our **FAITH** is a strong tree under which other people can find shelter. Our faith in God becomes like a strong light which brightens up the world.



" The King of Life

The liturgy for today's Feast of Christ the King tells us that his is "a kingdom of truth and life, a kingdom of holiness and grace, a kingdom of justice, love, and peace."
