# The Hour of Grace (Rosa Mystica)

At the request of our Blessed Mother, will be on



Friday December 8th, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception. The hour will start at 12:00 Noon and will continue until 1:00pm (one full hour of prayer).

During this hour the person making the "Hour of Grace" either at home

or in Church just put away all distractions (do not answer the telephone, or answer any doors, or do anything but totally concentrate on your union with God during this Special Hour of Grace).

Begin the Hour of grace by praying three times the 51st Psalm.

The rest of the Hour of Grace may be spent in silent communication with God, meditating upon the Passion of Jesus, saying the Holy Rosary, praising God in your own way or by using favorite prayers, singing hymns, meditating upon other Psalms, etc.

Please join us in St. Andrew Catholic Church on Friday, December 8th at 12:00 noon to pray. Put away all distractions, <u>NO PHONES</u>.

### What is Advent?

Advent is the Catholic liturgical season of preparation leading up to Christmas Day. The word *advent* is derived from the Latin word *adventus*, which means *coming*. During Advent we anticipate the coming of Jesus as a baby. It's a penitential time full of reflection, excitement, and hope as we prepare to celebrate his birth.

### When Does Advent Begin?

Advent officially begins four Sundays before Christmas and ends on December 24. It marks the beginning of the Catholic Church's liturgical calendar year. This year Advent begins on Sunday, December 3, 2023. Christmas Eve is the Fourth Sunday of Advent, with Christmas falling on a Monday. Four weeks isn't long, but that still leaves plenty of time to spend some quiet time preparing for Jesus' coming.

### Is Christmas Day a Holy Day of Obligation in 2023?

Holy Days of Obligation are days Catholics should attend Mass and do their best to avoid unnecessary work. All Sundays and other important feast days, like Christmas, are Holy Days of Obligation. To fulfill this requirement Catholics can attend a vigil the evening before or a day of Mass.

Christmas falls on a Monday in 2023. This means that a vigil Mass on Saturday, December 23 or a morning Mass on Sunday, December 24 fulfills the Fourth Sunday of Advent obligation. A vigil Mass on Sunday, December 24 or Mass on Christmas Day fulfills the Holy Day obligation.

The Mass is essential to Catholic spirituality. Holy Days of Obligation, sometimes jokingly referred to as Holy Days of Opportunity, provide chances to deepen our faith and grow in our relationship with God through worship and reflection. https://www.dynamiccatholic.com/advent/about-advent.html

## **Mass Celebrated Every**

Wednesday evening at 6:00pm followed by Novena to St. Michael the Archangel Rite Questions: Christmas 2023 falls on Monday: what Masses ought a parish celebrate—and which Masses are the faithful obliged to attend—during the previous weekend?

A: After Sunday, the "primordial holy day of obligation" (Canon 1247), the Code of Canon Law lists 10 Holy Days of Obligation: "the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Epiphany, the Ascension, the Body and Blood of Christ, Holy Mary the Mother of God, her Immaculate Conception, her Assumption, Saint Joseph, Saint Peter and Saint Paul the Apostles, and All Saints. Some of these may be suppressed by the local bishops' conference (such as Sts. Peter and Paul in the United States); others can be transferred to Sunday (as is Corpus Christi in the U.S.); and still others can be added to the list (such as St. Patrick in Ireland).

Another exception allows for a bishops' conference to lift the obligation to attend Mass on a Holy Day when it falls on a Saturday or Monday (such as Mary, Mother of God on Monday, January 1, 2024 in the United States). The obligation to attend Mass on Christmas, however, is *never* abrogated, regardless of the day of the week. Consequently, the faithful are obliged to attend Mass for the Fourth Sunday of Advent—which is also never abrogated—and for Christmas Day. One Mass does not fulfill two obligations (see Bishops' Committee on the Liturgy *Newsletter*, February 2017, 5-6, for more information).

But *which* Masses the faithful attend allows for some curious leeway. The Norms on the Liturgical Year and Calendar and its Table of Liturgical Days envisions a parish schedule of Masses this upcoming Christmas along these lines:

- Saturday, December 23: Evening Mass for the Fourth Sunday of Advent
- Sunday, December 24: Morning Masses for the Fourth Sunday of Advent; Evening Masses for the Solemnity of Christmas
- Monday, December 25: Morning and Daytime Masses for the Solemnity of Christmas.

The Code of Canon Law, however, simply states that "A person who assists at a Mass celebrated anywhere in a Catholic rite either on the feast day itself or in the evening of the preceding day satisfies the obligation of participating in the Mass" (Can. 1248 §1). In other words, the laity's only obligation is to attend Mass twice, but not necessarily one Mass with readings and orations for the Fourth Sunday of Advent, and a second Mass using readings and prayers for the Solemnity of Christmas (although this would be ideal). For example, one could conceivably attend the first Mass on Sunday afternoon to fulfill the obligation for the Fourth Sunday of Advent (even though this Mass would celebrate the Vigil of Christmas) and attend Midnight Mass to fulfill the Christmas obligation.

In any case, parishes will follow the norms of the liturgical calendar, with Christmas Vigil beginning the evening of December 24, and parishioners will follow the requirements expresses in Canon 1248 of the Code of Canon Law.
