PRAYER & WORSHIP

DEAR PARISHIONERS,

I really enjoy the fact that people like to ask questions in our parish. I have had many good discussions in regard to those questions. Two weeks ago, I wrote about young men being prepared for the priesthood. I mentioned seminary. Most people know that seminary is where young men go to learn how to become priests. However, in that article, I also mentioned the “Kairos” year. I have had a couple of people ask, “What is the Kairos year?” That is a great question, because if we are going to encourage young men to be priests we should be aware of the process.

When I approached the diocese about priesthood, they accepted me and three

months later I was studying in the seminary. Nobody had taught me how to pray, or about Catholic basics, or how to live my faith. They just sent me to school. Since then, we have learned that young men want time to explore the idea of priesthood. When a young man approaches the diocese today, they are accepted and then they spend a year living in community and learning the basic elements of priesthood before they enter seminary. They learn how to pray, how to live the Christian life, the basics of Christian beliefs and actions, basic human and communication skills, and even history of our diocese. During this time the young men live together, learn together, and pray together at the

Holy Name of Jesus House of Formation in Green Bay. This special year of exploration and Christian formation is called: The Kairos Year.

If you know someone who is considering priesthood, let them know that the Kairos Year allows them time to think about it and learn more. Many young men struggle when they are discerning. This program is a great opportunity to get together with like-minded young men and explore the idea.

Please pray for vocations to the priesthood, and keep asking questions. I enjoy answering them in my article.

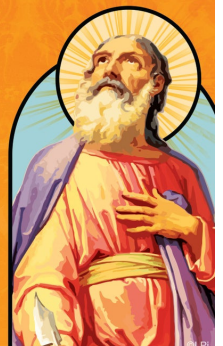

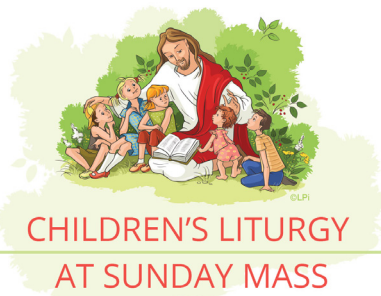

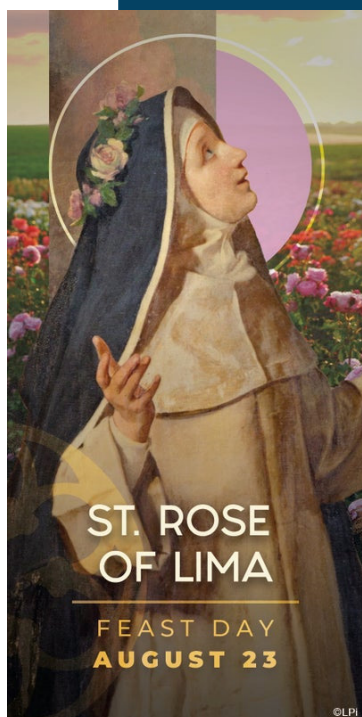

Born Isabel Flores de Olivia in April 1586 in Lima, Peru to Spanish colonists, Saint Rose of Lima took the name Rose at her confirmation in 1597. Legend holds that she received this nickname as an infant because a servant saw her face transformed into a rose.

Even as a child Saint Rose was dedicated to Christ. Growing up she made many secret penances. And when she was old enough to be married, deterred suitors by cutting off her hair and rubbing pepper on face to make it blister. She took a vow of chastity even though her parents wished her to marry. She fasted many times a week and permanently abstained from meat.

Eventually her parents gave in and allowed her to join the Third Order of St. Dominic, although she was not permitted to live in a convent. Saint Rose undertook severe penances, allowing herself only two hours of sleep a night in order to have more time to pray, wearing a heavy silver crown with spikes on the inside imitating Christ's crown of thorns, and even burning her own hands. However, she also cared for the sick and hungry, and sold her beautiful embroidery and fine lace, as well as flowers she grew to help raise funds for the poor.

She died at the age of 31 on August 24, 1617. Pope Clement X canonized her in 1671, she was the first saint of the New World, born in the Americas. Saint Rose of Lima is the patron saint of Latin America and the Philippines.

MASSES NEXT WEEKEND: MISSIONARY COOPERATION PLAN (MCP)

Father Tom will be gone the weekend of August 27-28. We have invited priests from The Order of St. Camillus to celebrate Masses with us. Please offer a warm welcome to Father Matthew Perumpil, who will be here for Saturday's Mass, and Father Johnson Varghese, who will celebrate our Sunday Masses.

The Order of St. Camillus is an international Religious Community founded by St. Camillus de Lellis in the year 1582 in Rome. The Order is spread across the globe in 40 countries caring for the sick and suffering, especially the most vulnerable. The Order came to the United States in 1921 to spread its mission of healing and they are celebrating their 100 years of Presence in the USA.

As followers of St. Camillus, united in love for the sick and the poor, the Order has an international missionary activity called CAMILLIAN

DISASTER and INTERNATIONAL SERVICE (CADIS USA). This is our global disaster and worldwide relief network in the field responding to the needs of others, especially in healthcare.

CADIS USA responds throughout the world where there is a Camillian-led need and presence addressing immediate medical, physiological, grief-stricken, and spiritual needs of those less fortunate. It focuses on the developing countries in South America, Africa and Asia in various projects related to health care and responding to the relief work when disasters disrupt normal lives. The most recent support helps the Ukrainian refugees in Poland.

MCP support provides immediate relief by delivering food and non-food items, basic medical services, psycho-emotional and spiritual needs. Donations also assist the affected families in recovery of what is lost like shelter and other related infrastructures.
