Sacraments

Baptism

Parents & Godparents are required to attend a Baptism class. *Parents must also be a parishioner for at least six (6) months.* For more information please contact the parish office.

First Communion

Children are prepared for First Holy Communion by participating in the CCD program. Students must be enrolled for at least one (1) year prior to enrolling in the sacramental preparation class.

Reconciliation

Confessions are heard on Wednesdays after the 8am daily mass, Saturdays from 4:15 to 4:45pm or by appointment.

Confirmation

Preparation classes are conducted through our CCD program. Candidates must be enrolled for at least one (1) year prior to enroll in the Confirmation class.

Matrimony

Preparation is conducted by parish clergymen and the Diocese of Nashville. *You must be a registered parishioner for at least one (1) year* and then contact the parish office at least six (6) months before the proposed date.

Anointing of the Sick

Anyone may request for major or minor health problems. If you anticipate surgery or a stay in the hospital, request the sacrament before (surgery).

Pastor's Corner.

The first reading on Palm Sunday, from Isaiah 50: 6-7, stated as follows; "I gave my back to those who beat me... My face I did not shield from buffets and spitting... knowing that I shall not be put to shame." It is an indication that Christ, despite his pain, did not run away in the midst of suffering. His vision was clear and he remained resolute until the end. Today, light has overcome darkness with Alleluia choruses. Yes, Alleluia! Christ Is Risen from the dead!

Thus, Easter Sunday offers us a new life. In other words, hope once shattered is renewed in a way that brings courage into a fearful and hopeless situation. Easter is, therefore, about hope in the midst of the despair and devastation of the agony in the garden, in Pilate's house, on the way to Calvary, on Calvary and in the tomb. Now the tomb is empty, He Is Risen! The celebration has begun! We are celebrating the fullness of the reality of the Risen Lord. With courage, the people on the way to Emmaus returned to Jerusalem to bring the good news of the Risen Christ to the disciples. Evangelization began and that is what Easter is all about.

By rising from the dead, Christ justified his words, "Destroy this temple and on the third day, I will raise it up." (John 2:19) Furthermore, St. Paul said, "If Christ has not been raised, your faith is vain; you are still in your sins" (1 Corinthians 15:17). Christ has power over sin and death and beyond the grave. By conquering death, his followers can live in newness of life. The Resurrection of Christ is the foundation of our Christian faith. Easter is the feast of all feasts. Let us rejoice and be glad for this redemptive work of God in Christ.


