

Children are prepared for First Holy Communion by participating in the CCD program. Students must be enrolled for at least one (1) year prior to enrolling in the sacramental preparation class.

#### Reconciliation

Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4:15 to 4:45pm or by appointment, (615) 254-8847.

#### Confirmation

Preparation classes are conducted through our CCD program. Candidates must be enrolled for at least one (1) year prior to enroll in the Confirmation class.

#### Matrimony

Preparation is conducted by parish clergymen and the Diocese of You must be Nashville. registered parishioner for at least one (1) year and then contact the parish office at least six (6) months before the proposed date.

#### **Anointing of the Sick**

Anyone may request for major or minor health problems. If you anticipate surgery or a stay in the hospital, request the sacrament before (surgery).

#### PASTOR'S CORNER.

My dear brothers and sisters, in October 2021, Pope Francis convened the whole church in a synod that began with consultation of the people of God. On October 4, 2023, the Holy Father will open the first session of the 16th Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops, "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, Mission." Mario Cardinal Grech, the Secretary General of the Synod on behalf of Pope Francis, has given us ways in which we can participate through prayer. Here are excerpts from Cardinal Grech's script:

"The Synod is, above all, an event of prayer and listening that involves not only the members of the Synodal Assembly, but every baptized person and every particular Church. Indeed, all of us are called at this time to unite in communion of prayer and insistent invocation of the Holy Spirit to guide us in discerning what the Lord is asking of his Church today. Therefore, I write to you (on behalf of the Church) for 'an unceasing prayer' (Acts 12:5) for the Holy Father, Pope Francis and for all the members of the Synodal Assembly.... I ask every Christian community to pray for the synod.

The different forms of prayer are but the multi-dimensional expressions of the Church's Synodal life. First and foremost, prayer is listening; listening to the Word of God, listening to the Spirit. The second form of prayer is adoration. Listening must be followed by adoring silence in awe for what God is saying to his Church and for what the Spirit arouses in the Church today. The third face of prayer is intercession. We must believe in the efficacy of intercessory prayer, which is not about bending God's will to ours. Rather, intercession is about asking the Lord to enlighten our heart with the power of his life-giving Spirit so that we might discern and do his will. Finally, prayer is Thanksgiving, recognizing the primacy of God's action and grace in all our works and in the life of the Christian community.

With the prayer of listening, adoration, intercession, and thanksgiving, the whole ecclesial community will be present, in the power of the Spirit, at the Synodal Assembly as an event that concerns all the baptized. Please pray for the Synodal assembly that begins in Rome on October 4, 2023."


