Sacraments

Baptism

Parents & Godparents are required to attend a Baptism class. Parents of the child or persons requesting letters to be godparents must be parishioners for at least six (6) months. For more information please contact the parish office.

First Communion

Children are prepared for First Holy Communion by participating in the CCD program. Students must be enrolled for at least one (1) year prior to enrolling in the sacramental preparation class.

Reconciliation

Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4:15 to 4:45pm or by appointment, (615) 254-8847.

Confirmation

Preparation classes are conducted through our CCD program.

Candidates must be enrolled for at least one (1) year prior to enroll in the Confirmation class.

Matrimony

Preparation is conducted by parish clergymen and the Diocese of Nashville. You must be registered parishioner for at least one (1) year and then contact the parish office at least six (6) months before the proposed date.

Anointing of the Sick

Anyone may request for major or minor health problems. If you anticipate surgery or a stay in the hospital, request the sacrament before (surgery).

PASTOR'S CORNER.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

When I look at the history of the Church of the Most Holy Name of Jesus (Holy Name), I am always short of words for the enthusiastic spirit of our founding fathers and mothers. The people who crossed the Cumberland river on Christmas Eve in 1854, to make their intentions known to the late Bishop Miles, about having a church across the river in the area known as Edgefield (now East Nashville). Once this permission was granted they began gathering together as a body of Christ. The light they started still burns today.

We continue to consolidate on the baton handed over to us by our ancestors in faith, while sharing our faith within the community and beyond through our sacrificial giving of time, talent, and treasure. With the changing nature of Nashville and East Nashville, in particular, we will continue the work of evangelization with focus on our young men and women who will eventually continue sharing the faith after us. Our mission as a vibrant, welcoming community of faith has not changed. Our unification through liturgical participation and service to our neighbors also remains the same. We are grateful that, as a diverse community, we share who we are under the same roof and with the same cup. This is proof of the example of fellowship like the early Christians and I hope you and your family will join in this fellowship.

Meanwhile, my dear friends, in the next few weeks we will be hearing about our "Consolidating the Past, Sharing the Faith through Sacrificial Giving" program. This program reminds us of our history; the contributions of our fathers and mothers when this ground became a parish church. For the work of evangelization to continue and to fulfill our mission, I ask each of you to prayerfully consider how you can help the church with your time, talent, and treasure. Next Sunday you will be hearing from Deacon Bob while we launch this program on February 17 and 18. Together we can do better and spread the gospel across East Nashville.
