#### **Sacraments**

#### Baptism

Parents & Godparents are required to attend a Baptism class. Parents of the child or persons requesting letters to be godparents must be parishioners for at least six (6) months. For more information please contact the parish office.

#### **First Communion**

Children are prepared for First Holy Communion by participating in the CCD program. Students must be enrolled for at least one (1) year prior to enrolling in the sacramental preparation class.

#### Reconciliation

Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4:15 to 4:45pm or by appointment, (615) 254-8847.

#### Confirmation

Preparation classes are conducted through our CCD program.

Candidates must be enrolled for at least one (1) year prior to enroll in the Confirmation class.

#### Matrimony

Preparation is conducted by parish clergymen and the Diocese of Nashville. You must be registered parishioner for at least one (1) year and then contact the parish office at least six (6) months before the proposed date.

#### **Anointing of the Sick**

Anyone may request for major or minor health problems. If you anticipate surgery or a stay in the hospital, request the sacrament before (surgery).

#### PASTOR'S CORNER.

Last week we talked about our history as a reminder to us that we continue to consolidate what was handed over to us. We do this as we share the faith through our stewardship of time, talent, and treasure. So, united in God's love, we are a visible sign of the body of Christ and together we can do great things. Nourished by prayer and the sacraments, the members of our parish community continue the journey of the past, along the path of discipleship, as we grow in relationship with Jesus Christ daily. With 184 families, we had 11 baptisms, 7 First Holy Communions, 9 Confirmations, 2 marriages, and 7 funerals last year. This year we have 44 children in Religious Education classes. We give thanks for our catechists who volunteer to assist with the children's faith formation.

As a community, everything we have is a gift from God. As we strive to love one another, good stewardship plays a key role. Stewardship consists of receiving God's gifts with gratitude and sharing them in love and justice to further the mission of our Lord. And this mission includes participation in our liturgy where more than 365 Masses are celebrated in our church each year, 104 Hours spent in Eucharistic Adoration, 30 Parishioners serving in liturgical ministries, and 19 Lectors proclaiming the Word.

As we go forth to proclaim the good news after Masses, we go on with our witness to others. Thus, we know the importance of bringing the love of God to our neighbors. Through our many ministries, and our social and service-oriented outreach programs, we put into action the words of St. John the Apostle: "If God so loved us, we also must love one another." (1 John 4:11) We do this through volunteers maintaining our parish, 11 Days of providing meals to the needy by the Holy Name Loaves and Fishes team, while 20 different countries are represented in our parish community.

Like Jeremiah, I ask you to prayerfully respond, "Here I am, send me," to our Consolidating the Past, Sharing the Faith through Sacrificial Giving program.
