

The Temptations of Jesus:

The first Temptation:

Knowing that our Lord was hungry, Satan pointed down to some little stones that resembled round loaves of bread and said, "If you are the Son of God, tell these stones to become bread." Remember that in the garden of Eden, where God had planted a tree of the knowledge of good and evil, the tempter said, "God knows that the moment you eat of the fruit of the forbidden tree, you will be like gods." Now, the temptation is "turning stone into bread."

This first temptation is economic in nature: Provide bread and feed hungry stomachs. The first need of humans is economic in nature: Food. And the devil was saying, "Start with the primacy of the economic, 'turn stones into bread.'" But the answer of our Blessed Lord was that while even accepting human nature with all its failings and trials and self-denials, He nevertheless was not without Divine Help. "Scripture says, Man cannot live on Bread alone, he lives on every Word that God utters."

We are tempted like Jesus whenever we try to become rich alone; whenever we harbor in our hearts the conviction that one has to go all by himself to seek comforts and well-being without giving a thought for the others. But Jesus preferred to be among the poor rather than be a lonely rich and a lonely winner.

The Second Temptation:

Seeing that our Lord refused to subscribe to the belief that man is an animal with a mere stomach, Satan now tempted his pride and egoism: "Throw yourself down. For scriptures say, 'He will put his angels in charge of you and you shall not strike your foot against a stone.'"

We so often ask God to reveal his love through signs and wonders. We know of Christians who believe that God loves them only when things go well, when they can see and touch the signs of God's protection. But once they become ill or meet some accident, they begin doubting and say, "God has forgotten me."

The Third Temptation:

This assault of the devil took place on the mountaintop. Showing in a flash all the

kingdoms of the world, the devil tempts Jesus: "I will give you all this power and their splendor, for it has been handed over to me." Moses received the Ten Commandments on Mount Sinai; Isaiah encountered God on a mountain; Jesus would be transfigured on Mt. Tabor and crucified on Mt. Calvary. Now, it's on the mountaintop that the devil took him and showed to him all the cities of the world. The third temptation is about power.

Wherever authority means dominion over others, when men and women fight in order to overcome each other; wherever power conferred means taking the right to deprive others of their own rights, freedom and civil liberties; wherever a person is enslaved and forced to bow in front of another person, there is the devil.

Three temptations of Jesus: Wealth, Fame and Power. A person who is rich, famous and powerful assumes that he or she can do anything. He or she can molest, deprive people of their liberties, get around the laws of the land and bribe enforcers of the law.

Satan is the Great Seducer, the one who remains in control by exploiting our human weakness. He hides his real agenda for riches, power and fame behind our human weaknesses. "Oh, everybody's doing it, so I can do it" is the sentiment that the tempter puts deep within us all. But what about being faithful to what is right no matter how many people don't care about what is right?

Christ knows well what's deep within the human heart. He knows how easily we can be swayed and how powerful the "easy way" tempts us. When we are beset by trials and sufferings, sickness and death, we blame God. But God doesn't tempt us and never will; neither does he test us to our limit. Temptations come from people around us and from the evil one but not from God. That's why we pray with the Lord: "Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil." ✠

Cast into the Deep (March 01)
Reacting on Impulse Can Be Embarrassing

Many times we are offended by people who do not mean to offend us. In this season of Lent, a season of soul-searching and addressing areas in our lives we can work on, let me take this time to address one area when we feel someone did something offensive that may not have been meant to offend.

An American was traveling in Europe on a Bullet Train. He did not know he sat on the wrong seat in the train coach until he was told so by a man wearing a black hat, a black overcoat and carrying a black leather briefcase and underneath his left armpit was stuck a black umbrella. His shoes were also black and polished.

With his train ticket in his hand, the man looked at the American and said, "Excuse me, please, but that is my seat." The American searched his pocket for his own ticket to check its number. Indeed, he had made a mistake. His seat was the one right across the seat he had taken. "I'm sorry, Sir," he said as he stood up to collect his things and transfer to the right seat. There were four other travelers in the coach for six: three were busy reading. The other appeared to be looking out at the horizon but was actually observing the man in black through the reflection on the train's window.

While the American was already peacefully settled in his seat, the man in black remained standing. He was quite skillful in balancing himself while the train sped and sometimes made a slight curve. He had unstrapped his old-fashioned leather briefcase and was now opening a bottle of rubbing alcohol. He had put his other things on his seat as he took out from his pocket something that looked more than a piece of rag than a handkerchief. He dabbed some alcohol on the rag and started wiping the seat just vacated by the American with the rag now moist with alcohol while the American felt his ears burn at the tips with a mixture of anger and embarrassment. The whole coach now reeked of the disinfectant. Even the others in the compartment were now watching. The men who were reading lowered their books and newspaper to observe the unusual scene that was unfolding before them.

Restraining himself from being the werewolf about to show its fangs, the American, pretending like the other man looking out through the window, took a deep breath and pretended also to look out the window to get a glimpse of the man who had made him feel like a leper.

With the same piece of rag, the man started wiping his umbrella, then the exterior of the briefcase itself, each time dabbing more alcohol on the piece of rag. By then, the American already understood what was going on. So did his other companions in the coach.


The man with the newspaper threw a well-meaning smile at the American and, with sympathetic eyes, was somehow able to communicate a message of apology on behalf of his compatriot who did not really mean to insult this American, after all.

Sometimes, we take offense at something we interpret as an insult meant for us. If only we can prevent ourselves from reacting on pure impulse, if only we can keep our cool and hold our tongue and allow things to further manifest themselves, we would probably be embarrassed about the very thought of having taken offense at all.

The man meant no offense at all; he was probably just suffering from an obsessive-compulsive disorder that called for understanding and acceptance rather than judgment or condemnation.

It can happen on the Hospitality Patio, it can happen in Church . . . it can happen anywhere.

Stay calm and be peaceful during this Lenten Season and you will have a Blessed Penitential Season.
