

## 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Lent

**First Reading:**  
**Second Reading:**  
**Gospel:**

**Genesis 12:1-4a**  
**Timothy 1:8b-10**  
**Matthew 17:1-9**

Every year, on the second Sunday of Lent, the readings focus on the changes that should happen to Christians as they journey through lent into Easter, changes that speak about a renewed heart that ultimately leads to a renewed humanity. Our lives could be compared to a journey to be taken in the company of God. Abraham was the first man to start off on the journey in answer to a call from God (first reading). The second reading is addressed to all, and tells us not to be discouraged because of difficulties we are to endure along our journey with Christ.

The Transfiguration story shows us that each of us is called to be open to God's revelation of His Son who will soon suffer and therefore, all of us must live in faith and not in fear and doubt.

The account of the transfiguration can be found in the gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke. But there is something distinct in Matthew's account as we have it today: Jesus goes up to a mountain with Peter, James and John. Every time something important happens, Jesus is up on a mountain. His last temptation takes place on a high mountain; the Beatitudes are proclaimed on a mountain; bread is multiplied on a mountain and at the end of the gospel of Matthew, the risen Lord ascends to heaven from a mountain.

In the Old Testament, it was Moses who received God's revelation on a mountain. There are more instances in the Book of Exodus where we see that Moses went up the mountain with two companions and was covered by a cloud and the face of Moses was also transfigured on the mountain by the light of divine glory.

It is now clear that Jesus transfigured on the mountain is the new Moses, the one to lead the new people, represented by the three disciples, that Jesus is the one who will give the new law, the final revelation of God.

His shining face and his clothes as white as light together with the cloud that covered him show the presence of God in the person of Jesus. And the voice from heaven affirms who Jesus is: "This is my son, the Beloved," and we are told, "Listen to him."

Who are Moses and Elijah who appeared

when Jesus was transfigured? Moses was the one who gave the law to God's people; Elijah represented the greatest of all the prophets. Both Moses and Elijah represent the whole of the Old Testament. Thus, the Old Testament (Moses and Elijah) speaks to Jesus, goes to Jesus, and gets its meaning from Jesus because Jesus is the final explanation and full realization of the Law and the Prophets.

Peter, as usual, fails to understand what is going on. That is why he comes out with the idea of pitching three tents: one for Jesus, one for Moses and one for Elijah. But Jesus is more than Moses and the prophets. Thus, when they raised their eyes again, after falling prostrate, all they saw was Jesus. Peter must have been so thrilled by what he saw that maybe, he would have wanted to remain in that experience forever.

We are also like Peter. When we experience the loftiness of prayer and the presence of the Divine, we want to stay there; to pitch our tents there and not want to go back to our own real world.

Now, Jesus leads them down from the mountain of the transfiguration, back to the real world of suffering and pain with its joys and moments of triumphs. And this will always be the case for Christians. We have to face the world where the real drama of sickness, pain and death with its joys and triumphs awaits us. And we are ready to do so because we have experienced the presence of Jesus himself.

These three disciples who had seen the glory of Christ would shortly see him reduced to a point of deep human weakness in his agony on that dreadful and solitary night in the garden of Gethsemane.

In Lent, the Church has us proclaim the story of the transfiguration to teach us that there is no place for Christians to pitch a tent on fleeting moments of success and truth which occasionally come our way because to just settle for the seeds of the promise while still on the journey would be to miss the promise itself and that to arrive with Jesus in glory, we must follow the suffering Jesus went through along the way of the cross. ❖

## Cast into the Deep (March 08)

### Thwarting Temptations

Watching the game show Deal or No Deal is a good illustration of the workings of temptations. A person is offered a hundred dollars but is tempted to get much more. Staking everything on future unwise moves, the person brings home just a couple of dollars or nothing at all. If only this person would just know how to stop and when to stop, then feverything would be okay.

Every one of us is enticed by a temptation for more in life. Every temptation is custom-made for us. It is suited and fitted to the kind of person we are and to the desires of our hearts. Temptations attack us where we are weakest. Some people are easily drawn to the casinos, or to drinking or to illicit affairs. Others are prone to harbor ill will and hatred against others. There are those who just are so lazy, and we also find some people whose lives revolve around their petty, closed and greedy selves.

Last Sunday, the Gospel showed us that the Lord Jesus was not exempt from the devil's temptations. Evil was trying to destroy Jesus' mission of salvation. Yet, we notice something in him: He was strong and resolute. He resisted every tactic and fought the devil with wisdom and deep faith.

Temptations are not sins while "falling into temptation" is a sin. Temptations are experiences natural to all of us. But temptations are dangerous. Once you say "yes," then it's no longer a temptation: you have moved away from the Lord as you have fallen into temptation and committed sin.

If we are to overcome temptations, let us follow what Jesus did.

First, Jesus did not play games with the devil. He aborted temptation from the very start by refusing to play along. Many times, this is our biggest fault. We know where we are weak, but we are overconfident that exposing ourselves to it will not harm us. So a person starts renting a porno disc or visiting the website. Soon, he or she is hooked on it and would very soon result into sins of the flesh. There are also those who hang out at the bar where they will surely be enticed to heavy drinking.

There is wisdom in the ancient spiritual advice to "avoid occasions of sin." Let us not underestimate temptations and let us not overestimate our own power. Pull the temptation from the roots. Don't play along.



Secondly, the Lord prayed. He called on God. Remember, he was in the desert with the Holy Spirit. He was there praying all the time before the temptations came. We feel weak against temptation because our prayer life has become weak. How often do we pray? Sometimes, we are distracted when praying and this points to the truth that prayer is not something that is easy to do. Jesus taught us how to pray and what to pray for when he taught his disciples the prayer, "Our Father." In and through prayer, we develop a relationship with God. The strength of Jesus came from his strong relationship with the Father in prayer.

Many of us are more attached to the television or the cell phone or to the computer than to the Lord. Lent offers us the opportunity to grow in our faith through prayer, sacrifice and acts of charity rather than playing along with temptations. Let us continue to ask God to train our hearts to resist temptations that ruin our lives and the lives of the ones we love.

## Guidelines for the Flu Season
