

## Second Sunday of Easter (Divine Mercy Sunday)

First Reading:  
Responsorial Psalm: ( Psalm 118)

— Give thanks to the Lord for he is good, his love is everlasting

Second Reading:  
Gospel:

Acts 2:42-47  
1 Peter 1:3-9  
John 20:19-31

It is Divine Mercy Sunday today.

There are two Devotions to the Heart of Jesus: the Sacred Heart Devotion that goes back to St. Mary Margaret Alacoque of France and the Divine Mercy Devotion that goes back to Sr. Faustina of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy of Poland. Margaret Mary Alacoque emphasized very much the love of Jesus' Heart; Sr. Faustina emphasized the mercy that flows from the heart of Jesus where we have the image of Jesus dressed in white garment, one hand raised for blessing, the other one pointing at his breast from where two rays came forth – one red, symbolizing his blood, the other set of rays which are pale in color symbolizing the water that came forth from the side of Jesus. As commanded by Jesus to Sr. Faustina in 1931, this image was painted by her alongside with the words, "Jesus, I trust in you". In that vision of 1931, Jesus expressed his desire that this picture be venerated, first in the chapel of the convent of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy and, later on, throughout the world and to work for the establishment of a "Feast of Mercy" to be officially celebrated in the church on the first Sunday after Easter. Pope John Paul II named the Second Sunday of Easter, Divine Mercy Sunday.

The mercy of Jesus comes from his heart. The heart designates the center of a person. It is considered to be the place of all emotions and feelings.

In the heart of Jesus, we venerate the immense mercy that Jesus has for all of us; we also venerate the love and submission Jesus showed towards the Father and his commitment and dedication to all, especially the sinners and the outcasts.

Thomas is the main character of our gospel of today . He represents all those who are struggling with their faith and in their faith. Jesus did not deride Thomas for his doubts but in his compassion for those struggling with their faith, gave in to Thomas' wish to see the marks of his suffering in his risen body. Jesus saw the pain in the heart of Thomas for his disbelief: the horrors of Good Friday were so overwhelming that Thomas had to struggle to accept the fact that Jesus rose from the dead.

And Thomas was looking for evidence. Jesus shows him the scars from the wounds inflicted on his side, his hands and feet. The scars are


evidence of the resurrection, evidence of healed wounds, evidence of new life.

Many among us have come from our own experiences of good Fridays. Our hearts may have been pierced in the past because of a broken relationship. Our hands and feet have been wounded because of a failed act of service or help. And from those wounds and hurts, we are covered with scars. "Scarred people are beautiful" as a poem goes. Sufferings have strengthened them for they have gathered the broken pieces and made themselves whole again. Sad memories will always be there as they look at their scars but those same scars will remind them all the more of a new life they have received.

We read in the gospel: "On the evening of that first day of the week, ... where the disciples were, ... Jesus came and stood in their midst...." The first day of the week, a Sunday, the disciples gathered. All the disciples were gathered and what do we notice? Thomas was not there. He is like a son or daughter, a friend or relative, mom or dad, one who does not go to church regularly on the first day of the week, a Sunday. They are not there in Church when the risen Lord meets his people to strengthen their faith. For Thomas, he resolves never again to miss the Sunday experience. The gospel says, "A week later, Thomas was with them, and Jesus came..." This time, Thomas had his own share of the resurrection experience. His doubts turned into faith after seeing Jesus who invited him to touch the scars from the wounds on his hands and his side. And he said, "My Lord and my God." It is when we leave the community of worship, when we stop joining in the celebration of the day of the Lord that our faith weakens.

What if Thomas stayed away from the Sunday gatherings? What if he would have just said, "Prove it, prove it to me that Jesus is risen before I come?

The mercy of Jesus is offered to all as it was offered to Thomas. Contemplating all that God, in Christ, has done for us, we cannot remain untouched. The action of God in the compassionate mercy of Jesus calls for a response on our part, to be there with the Christian community gathered in Sunday worship so that we can also have the experience of the risen Lord. Then we can truly pray: "Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world."❖





### Celebrating our Saint for the Week

#### April 16: St. Benedict Joseph Labre, beggar, Franciscan Tertiary

(1748-1783): Benedict was born in France near Boulogne, the eldest of 15 children. His parents sent him to a relative who was a priest, to be educated in the hopes that he would someday be a priest himself. However, as early as at the age of 16, Benedict wanted to be a Trappist monk instead. He was dissuaded as he was still too young. A couple of years later, he set off to join the Trappists, then eventually a couple of Carthusian monasteries, but none would have him because of his poor health and lack of learning. He discovered his vocation — the world

would be his monastery, living a life of self-denial, complete dependence on the providence of God, and in pilgrimage to various shrines and holy places. He had no abode, for sustenance he only had what people would give him and he only took what he needed, sharing his surplus with others. When he died, people in streets chanted, "A saint is dead." He was canonized by Pope Leo XIII in 1881.


### De las escrituras a la vida ...

**¿Alguna vez has tenido un momento en el que dudaste de que Jesús existiera?**

**II Domingo De Pascua (Divina Misericordia)****Primera Lectura: Hechos 2, 42-47****Salmo Responsorial: Salmo 118***—Den gracias al Señor porque es bueno, porque es eterna su misericordia.***Segunda Lectura: 1 Pedro 1, 3-9****Evangelio: San Juan 20, 19-31**

Hoy es el domingo de la Divina Misericordia.

Hay dos Devociones dedicadas al Corazón de Jesús: la Devoción al Sagrado Corazón transmitida por Santa María Margarita Alacoque de Francia y la Devoción a la Divina Misericordia transmitida por Sor Faustina de las Hermanas de Nuestra Señora de la Misericordia de Polonia. Margarita María Alacoque subrayó mucho el amor del Corazón de Jesús; Sor Faustina enfatizó la misericordia que brota del corazón de Jesús como lo demuestra la imagen de Jesús vestido con vestiduras blancas, una mano levantada para bendecir, la otra apuntando a su pecho de donde salen dos rayos, uno rojo, simbolizando su sangre, el otro conjunto de rayos que son de color pálido simbolizan el agua que brotó del costado de Jesús. Como indicó Jesús a Sor Faustina en 1931, esta imagen fue pintada dirigida por ella junto con las palabras "Jesús, en ti confío". En aquella visión de 1931, Jesús expresa su deseo de que esta imagen sea venerada, primero en la capilla del convento de las Hermanas de Nuestra Señora de la Misericordia y, más tarde, en todo el mundo y pidió la instauración de una "Fiesta de Misericordia" que se celebrara oficialmente en la iglesia el primer domingo después de Pascua. El Papa Juan Pablo II nombró el Segundo Domingo de Pascua, Domingo de la Divina Misericordia.



La misericordia de Jesús viene de su corazón. El corazón designa el centro de una persona. Se considera que es el lugar de todas las emociones y sentimientos.

En el Corazón de Jesús, veneramos la inmensa misericordia que Jesús tiene por todos nosotros; también veneramos el amor y la sumisión de Jesús al Padre y su compromiso y entrega a todos, especialmente a los pecadores y marginados.

Santo Tomás es el personaje principal de nuestro evangelio de hoy. Él representa a todos aquellos que luchan con su fe y en su fe. Jesús no se burló de Tomás por sus dudas, sino que en su compasión por los que luchan con su fe, cedió al deseo de Tomás de ver las marcas de su sufrimiento en su cuerpo resucitado. Jesús vio el dolor en el corazón de Tomás por su incredulidad: los horrores del Viernes Santo fueron tan abrumadores que Tomás tuvo que luchar para aceptar el hecho de que Jesús resucitó de entre los muertos.

Y Tomás estaba buscando pruebas. Jesús le muestra las cicatrices de las heridas infligidas en el costado, las manos y los pies. Las cicatrices son evidencia de la resurrección, evidencia de heridas sanadas, evidencia de nueva vida.

Muchos de nosotros hemos vivido nuestras propias experiencias de Viernes Santo. Nuestros corazones pueden haber sido traspasados en el pasado debido a una relación quebrantada. Nuestras manos y pies han sido heridos por un acto fallido de servicio o ayuda. Y por esas heridas y dolor, estamos cubiertos de cicatrices. "Las personas con cicatrices son hermosas", como dice un poema. Los sufrimientos las han fortalecido porque han reunido los pedazos rotos y con ellos son uno de nuevo. Los recuerdos tristes siempre estarán allí cuando miren sus cicatrices, pero esas mismas cicatrices les recordarán intensamente la nueva vida que han recibido.

Leemos en el evangelio: "Al anochecer del día de la resurrección, ... donde se hallaban los discípulos, ...Jesús se presentó en medio de ellos ...". El primer día de la semana, un domingo, se reunieron los discípulos. Todos los discípulos estaban reunidos y ¿qué notamos? Tomás no estaba allí. Es como un hijo o una hija, un amigo o un pariente, una mamá o un papá, alguien que no va a la iglesia con regularidad el primer día de la semana, un domingo. No están allí en la Iglesia cuando el Señor resucitado se encuentra con su pueblo para fortalecer su fe. Santo Tomás, decide no perderse nunca más la experiencia del domingo. El evangelio dice: "Ocho días después, estaban reunidos los discípulos a puerta cerrada y Tomás estaba con ellos. Jesús se presentó de nuevo ..." Esta vez, Tomás tuvo una experiencia personal de la resurrección. Sus dudas se convirtieron en fe después de ver a Jesús que lo invitó a tocar las cicatrices de las heridas en sus manos y su costado. Y él dijo: "¡Señor mío y Dios mío!". Es cuando dejamos la comunidad de fe, cuando dejamos de unirmos a la celebración del día del Señor que nuestra fe se debilita.

¿Qué hubiera pasado si Santo Tomás hubiera permanecido alejado de las reuniones dominicales? ¿Y si simplemente hubiera dicho: "Pruébalo, pruébame que Jesús resucitó antes de que yo vaya?

La misericordia de Jesús se ofrece a todos como se ofreció a Santo Tomás. Contemplando todo lo que Dios, en Cristo, ha hecho por nosotros, no podemos permanecer ilegos. La acción de Dios en la misericordia compasiva de Jesús exige una respuesta de nuestra parte, estar ahí con la comunidad cristiana reunida en el culto dominical para que también nosotros podamos tener la experiencia del Señor resucitado. Entonces podremos orar verdaderamente: "Santo Dios, Santo Fuerte, Santo Inmortal, ten piedad de nosotros y del mundo entero". ♦
