**Fourth Sunday
of
Advent**

First Reading: 2 Samuel 7:1-5, 8-12, 14-16
Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 89
– *For ever I will sing the goodness of the Lord.*
Second Reading: Romans 16:25-27
Gospel: Luke 1:26-38

There is something unique in our liturgical celebrations today. For we shall not dwell more than a day into the fourth Sunday of Advent before we shift our celebration to Christmas. From Saturday evening at the Vigil Mass of the fourth Sunday of Advent until 4:00 in the afternoon of Sunday, the Fourth Sunday of Advent is celebrated. Then from 4:00 until Monday evening, the 25th of December, we celebrate Christmas Day.

As Christmas approaches, the readings for the Fourth Sunday of Advent focus our attention on the notion of a dwelling place for God. In the first reading, King David finds himself free in that he no longer has to fight his enemies. Instead, he can devote his time and energy to whatever he likes, so he plans to build a splendid temple for God. At first the prophet Nathan approves this plan, but then he hears a word from God that turns the plan upside down: "Should you build me a house to dwell in?" God then explains that all the successes that David has were in God's doing, which now culminates in God establishing a house, a kingdom and dynasty for David that shall last forever before the Lord. The fulfillment of this prophecy went far beyond what David could ever imagine or even what Nathan intended. They were thinking of an earthly kingdom, while God gave David a descendant who was really to reign forever: Jesus the Son of Mary.

In the gospel reading, Gabriel's message to Mary is that God now takes up residence in human flesh. While there is a place for magnificent temples and churches where we can gather as a people to glorify God, the Holy One would have us first recognize that divinity walks around in our midst in human flesh.

Moreover, those who are the least by human standards are the most favored by God when it comes to revealing God's mystery. David, for example, was the youngest and the least qualified one, when God took him from pasturing his sheep to lead his people. Mary was an ordinary young woman making wedding plans in a little-known town in Galilee, when she was asked to take on a seemingly impossible role.

In both the first reading and the gospel, there is a startling twist: it is not we who make dwelling places for God but God who builds the house. Likewise, on Christmas Day, John's Gospel speaks not only of how wondrous it is that God takes on the form of a child but also of how our reception of the Word

enables us to become children of God. We keep on becoming children of God by receiving this lowly child, not only the one in the manger, but all the ones who seem insignificant and the least among us.

For Mary, what God is asking is incomprehensible. Mary questions, "How can this be, since I have no relations with a man." While not spelling out how, the angel reassures Mary that in the midst of this messy situation, God will bring forth blessing, holiness, and salvation for all. Twice the angel Gabriel assures her that she is grace-filled and have found favor with God. He also reassures her that she is not alone. Her relative, Elizabeth has also conceived a son in her old age. Without knowing how God will accomplish all this, Mary opens a space for God to dwell within her, enabling the Son of God to make a new home within all humankind.

During this time of Advent, we think about the birth of the baby, Jesus, and the coming of Christ. Yet Advent reveals more. It is about preparing ourselves for Christ to come and dwell within us and within our world. God takes up residence not in beautifully adorned buildings but in the humblest of persons, in the most difficult of circumstances. The irony is that in trying times we may feel abandoned by God, or question why God is punishing us or why we have lost God's favor. It is precisely in such times that God dwells most intimately within us, assuring us that we are full of grace and favor, asking us to trust that God can and will bring forth blessing, even if we cannot see how, for "nothing is impossible for God." Mary, in her humility and lowliness shows us how to receive Jesus, our Savior, God's greatest gift to us.

Like Mary, could we humbly trust and surrender to God and say, "I am the servant of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word"?

We ask this question because many of us would rather place our plans before God and pray that God will help us achieve our goals. But not for Mary. This is not how Mary behaved. She did not come up with any plans of her own to propose to God. All she did was to humbly accept her role in God's divine plan and she humbly and willingly accepted it.

Like Mary, if we are ready to accept God's plan, then we are ready for Christmas — the coming of the Lord into our life, making our life not just a series of personal plans, but a dwelling place of God's light and love and His will. ❖

What is a trial balloon?



One of the best ways safe adults can help children who are suffering from abuse is to recognize and listen to their disclosures — even if they are done in stages or in subtle ways. A child may float a "trial balloon" disclosure, meaning he may use a single sentence or phrase to see if a safe adult will respond appropriately. Be on the lookout for sudden disclosures like, "I don't want to go to So-and-so's house anymore," and try responding in a way designed to let the child continue to open up: "Do you want to tell me why?" or "Let's talk about that," for example. IV Domingo De Adviento**Primera Lectura: 2 Samuel 7, 1-5, 8-12, 14-16****Salmo responsorial: Salmo 88***– Cantaré eternamente las misericordias del Señor.***Segunda Lectura: Romanos 16, 25-27****Evangelio: San Lucas 1, 26-38**

Hay algo único en nuestras celebraciones litúrgicas de hoy. Porque no nos detendremos más de un día en el cuarto domingo de Adviento antes de comenzar nuestra celebración de Navidad. Desde el sábado por la tarde en la Misa de Vigilia del cuarto domingo de Adviento hasta las 4:00 de la tarde del domingo se celebra el Cuarto Domingo de Adviento. Luego, desde las 4:00 hasta la tarde del lunes 25 de diciembre, celebramos el día de Navidad.



A medida que se acerca la Navidad, las lecturas del cuarto domingo de Adviento enfocan su atención en la noción de una morada para Dios. En la primera lectura, el Rey David se encuentra libre porque ya no tiene que luchar contra sus enemigos. En cambio, puede dedicar su tiempo y energía a lo que quiera, por lo que planea construir un templo para Dios. Al principio el profeta Natán aprueba este plan, pero después de escuchar a Dios cambia el plan: “¿Piensas que vas a ser tú quien me construya una casa, para que yo habite en ella?”. Dios luego explica que todos los éxitos que David tuvo fueron por obra de Dios, que ahora termina con el establecimiento de una casa, un reino y una dinastía para David que durará para siempre ante el Señor. El cumplimiento de esta profecía fue mucho más allá de lo que David jamás pudo imaginar o incluso de lo que Natán pretendía. Estaban pensando en un reino terrenal, mientras que Dios le dio a David un descendiente que realmente reinaría para siempre: Jesús, el Hijo de María.

En la lectura del evangelio, el mensaje del ángel Gabriel a María es que Dios hará su morada en ella. Si bien hay un lugar para magníficos templos e iglesias donde podemos reunirnos como pueblo para glorificar al Señor, Dios Santo quiere que primero reconozcamos que su divinidad está entre nosotros en piel humana.

Además, aquellos que son los más pequeños según los estándares humanos son los más favorecidos por Dios cuando se trata de revelar su misterio. David, por ejemplo, era el más joven y menos calificado, Dios lo sacó de pastorear sus ovejas para dirigir a su pueblo. María era una jovencita ordinaria que hacía planes de casarse en un pueblecito poco conocido en Galilea, cuando se le encomienda una tarea aparentemente imposible.

Tanto en la primera lectura como en el evangelio, hay un giro sorprendente: no somos nosotros lo que hacemos moradas para Dios, sino que Dios es el que construye la casa. Del mismo modo, en Navidad, el evangelio de San Juan habla no sólo de que el Señor tomó la forma de un niño y que maravilloso es, sino también de cómo nuestra recepción de la Palabra nos permite convertirnos en hijos de Dios. Seguimos convirtiéndonos en hijos de Dios cuando recibimos a este humilde infante, no sólo el que está en el pesebre, sino a todos los que parecen insignificantes y a todos los más pequeños entre nosotros.

Para María, lo que Dios pide es incomprendible. María se pregunta, “¿Cómo podrá ser esto, puesto que yo permanezco virgen?” Sin explicar cómo, el ángel le asegura a María que, en medio de esta situación confusa, Dios traerá bendición, santidad y salvación para todos. Dos veces el ángel Gabriel le afirma que está llena de gracia y que ha encontrado el favor de Dios. También le asegura que no está sola. Su prima, Elizabeth también ha concebido un varón en su vejez. Sin saber cómo Dios logrará todo esto, María abre su corazón a Dios para que more en ella, permitiendo al hijo de Dios hacer un hogar nuevo en medio de toda la humanidad.

Durante este tiempo de Adviento, pensamos en el nacimiento del niño Jesús, y en la venida de Cristo. Sin embargo, el Adviento revela más. Se trata de prepararnos para que venga Cristo y haga su morada en nosotros y en nuestro mundo. Dios no reside en edificios costosamente adornados sino en los humildes, en medio de las circunstancias más difíciles. La ironía es que en tiempos difíciles nos sentimos abandonados por Dios, o nos preguntamos por qué nos está castigando o por qué hemos perdido el favor del Señor. Es precisamente en esos momentos, cuando Dios habita más íntimamente dentro de nosotros, asegurándonos que estamos llenos de gracia y favor, pidiéndonos que confiemos que el Señor puede y traerá bendiciones, aunque no podamos ver cómo, porque “nada es imposible para Dios”. María en su humildad y mansedumbre nos enseña como recibir a Jesús, nuestro Salvador, el regalo más grande de Dios para nosotros.

Como María, ¿seremos capaces de humildemente confiar y entregarnos a Dios y decir, “Yo soy la esclava del Señor; cúmplase en mí lo que has dicho.”

Hacemos esta pregunta porque muchos de nosotros preferiríamos poner nuestros planes delante de Dios y orar para que Dios nos ayude a alcanzar nuestras metas. Pero no para María. María no se comportó así. A ella no se le ocurrió ningún plan propio para proponerle a Dios. Todo lo que hizo fue aceptar humildemente su papel en el plan divino de Dios, y lo aceptó con humildad y voluntad.

Como María, si estamos listos para aceptar el plan de Dios, entonces estamos listos para la Navidad – la venida del Señor a nuestra vida, haciendo de nuestra vida no sólo una serie de planes personales, sino una morada de la luz y el amor de Dios y de su voluntad. ❖





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
