

The Epiphany of the Lord

First Reading:

Isaiah 60:1-6

Responsorial Psalm:

Psalm 72

- Lord, every nation on earth will adore you.

Second Reading:

Ephesians 3:2-3a,5-6

Gospel:

Matthew 2:1-12

On the Sunday after New Year's Day, the Church celebrates the Epiphany of the Lord. It is a feast that encapsulates the meaning of Christmas: that Jesus, who was born to humanity belongs to all and not just to the Jews. Jesus belongs to those who found him and also to those who continue to search for God. Holy Mother Church, the new Jerusalem, is now resplendent with the beauty of her spouse – the Emmanuel.

Jerusalem, once covered in darkness by the destruction of the temple and the Babylonian exile, now shines forth resplendent and beautiful. She is once again a young and beautiful girl clothed in light and resplendent with colors. The prophet, Isaiah, in the first reading invites her to shed all signs of mourning since Yahweh, her spouse, has taken her back. And there they are in a caravan with multitudes of camels and dromedaries loaded with the precious goods of the Orient: gold and incense. They are all moving towards the holy mountain because the light of the Lord has illumined her. Who does this city point to? The Church. When God's people, the Church, have accepted this light from God, she will become God's own people as Paul tells us in the second reading.

The Magi have always been a popular subject for Christians. Yet it seems that Christians were not satisfied with the few details given in the gospel account. Questions such as the following were asked: Where did the Magi come from? What were their names? How did they travel? Were there only three of them? How did they consider the child they saw in the manger?

The number three for the magi comes from the gifts of gold, frankincense (see first reading) and myrrh (added in the Gospel). And there were many legends told in the early Christian communities to answer all these questions. It was said that they were three kings (Gaspar, Melchor and Balthazar); that one of them came from Africa, one from Asia and one from Europe and so one was black, one an oriental brown and one was white; that they met at a certain point and traveled together guided by a star. The old story goes that the original wise men went back home and when they turned 120 years old, they set out once again and came together in a city of Anatolia where they attended a Christmas mass and died there on the same day full of joy. Their relics are now in the Cathedral of Cologne, Germany. But all these are just stories.

Let us look now at the Gospel and try to understand what Matthew, the Evangelist, wants to tell us.

The Magi mentioned in the gospel were not kings but magi or astrologers who studied the heavenly bodies and discovered the meaning of human life on earth. They were able to interpret ordinary and extraordinary events such as the appearance of a star which was interpreted as a message from heaven.

Regarding the star, in ancient times, there was a belief that the birth of a person destined to do great things was accompanied by the appearance of a star in the sky. Even now, many believe in horoscopes where the arrangement of the stars is said to influence the destiny of a person. This is astrology but astronomy debunked this belief as unscientific.

When Matthew relates the story of the Magi in the gospel, it is to tell us that the long-awaited deliverer is finally here: he is Jesus that the Magi recognized and worshiped. He is the star.

The wise men represent all of us. They stand for the people of the world who allowed themselves to be guided by Jesus' message of peace and love. They are the image of the Church, the Church which is made up of people from every race, tribe, language, and nation. It is the Church where one's identity is not given up or lost; it is a Church where we do not submit to a false and unjust uniformity for it is a Church where peoples keep their cultural characteristics and enrich the universal Church with their distinct identities.

The Magi brought out their gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh and presented them to Jesus. Gold befits a king and stands for the kingship of Jesus. The aroma and smoke of incense or frankincense rising heavenward speaks of the divinity of Jesus. And ancient peoples used myrrh to prepare the dead for burial as the women brought myrrh to the tomb of Jesus. Myrrh stands for the humanity of Jesus.

Men and women in the present day have different attitudes towards Jesus. Some, like the Magi recognize in him the light of the world; others are just indifferent while still others try to put out that light: different responses to the newly born child. Who can recognize him? Only those who allow God's Word to penetrate their minds and hearts.

And so, as we sally forth from this Christmas Season, let us not forget that in all our joys and trials, Jesus is with us... God is with us.



Epifanía del Señor

Primera Lectura: Isaías 60, 1-6

Salmo responsorial: Salmo 71

– Que te adoren, Señor, todos los pueblos.

Segunda Lectura: Efesios 3, 2-3. 5-6

Evangelio: San Mateo 2, 1-12

El domingo siguiente al Año Nuevo, la iglesia celebra la Epifanía del Señor. Es una fiesta que capta el significado de la Navidad, Jesús, nació para la humanidad, pertenece a todos y no sólo a los judíos. La Santa Madre Iglesia, la nueva Jerusalén, resplandece ahora con la belleza de su esposo – Emanuel.

Jerusalén, una vez cubierta de oscuridad por la destrucción del templo y el exilio a Babilonia, ahora brilla resplandeciente y hermosa. Ella vuelve a ser una joven bella vestida de luz y resplandeciente con colores. El profeta, Isaías, en la primera lectura la invita a despojarse de todo signo de duelo ya que Yahvé, su esposo, la ha tomado de nuevo. Y ahí aparecen en una caravana con multitud de camellos y dromedarios cargados con bienes preciosos de Oriente: oro, e incienso. Todos se dirigen hacia la montaña santa porque la luz de Dios la ha iluminado. ¿A quién apunta esta ciudad? La Iglesia, cuando la gente del Señor, la Iglesia, haya aceptado esta luz de Dios, ella se convertirá en el pueblo de Dios como San Pablo nos dice en la segunda lectura.



Los Reyes Magos siempre han sido un tema popular para los cristianos. Sin embargo, parece que los cristianos no están satisfechos con los pocos detalles que aparecen en el relato del evangelio. Preguntas como las siguientes se hacen: ¿De dónde vinieron los Reyes Magos? ¿Cuáles son sus nombres? ¿Cómo viajaron? ¿Eran sólo tres? ¿Cómo consideraron al infante que vieron en el pesebre?

El número tres para los magos se deriva de los regalos de oro, incienso (ver en la primera lectura) y mirra (agregado en el evangelio). En las primeras comunidades cristianas existían muchas leyendas que se contaban para dar respuesta a todas estas preguntas. Se decía que eran tres Reyes Magos (Gaspar, Melchor y Baltazar); que uno de ellos vino de África, uno de Asia y uno de Europa y entonces uno era de tez oscura, uno de tez café y uno era blanco. Y se encontraron en un punto determinante del viaje, juntos viajaron guiados por una estrella. La vieja historia cuenta que los magos originales regresaron a su casa y cuando cumplieron 120 años, partieron una vez más y se encontraron en la ciudad de Anatolia donde asistieron a una misa de Navidad y murieron allí el mismo día llenos de alegría. Sus reliquias se encuentran ahora en la Catedral de Colonia, Alemania. Todo esto son sólo historias.

Miremos ahora el evangelio y tratemos de entender lo que San Mateo, el Evangelista, nos quiere decir.

Los magos probablemente no eran reyes sino personas capaces de interpretar la voluntad de Dios a través de eventos ordinarios y extraordinarios como la aparición de una estrella que fue interpretada como un mensaje del cielo.

En cuanto a la estrella, en la antigüedad existía la creencia de que el nacimiento de una persona destinada a hacer grandes cosas iba acompañado de la aparición de una estrella en el cielo. Incluso ahora, muchos creen en los horóscopos donde se dice que las posiciones de los astros influyen el destino de una persona. Esto es astrología, pero la astronomía desacreditó esta creencia como no científica.

Cuando San Mateo relata la historia de los Reyes Magos en el evangelio, es para anunciaros que el tan esperado salvador finalmente está aquí: él es Jesús al que los Reyes Magos reconocieron y adoraron. Él es la estrella.

Los Reyes Magos nos representan a todos. Representan a las personas del mundo que se dejaron guiar por el mensaje de paz y amor de Jesús. Son la imagen de la Iglesia, la Iglesia que está formada de gente de todas las razas, tribus, lenguas, y naciones. Es en la Iglesia donde nuestra identidad no se abandona ni se pierde; es en la Iglesia donde no nos sometemos a una uniformidad falsa e injusta, porque es en la iglesia donde los pueblos mantienen sus características culturales, y enriquecen a la Iglesia universal con sus distintas identidades.

Los Reyes Magos llevaron regalos de oro, incienso y mirra y se los presentaron a Jesús. El oro corresponde a un rey y representa la realeza de Jesús. El aroma y el humo del incienso que se eleva al cielo habla de la divinidad de Jesús. Y los pueblos antiguos usaban la mirra para preparar a los muertos para el entierro como las mujeres que llevaron mirra a la tumba de Jesús. La mirra representa la humanidad de Jesús.

Los hombres y mujeres de la actualidad tienen diferentes actitudes sobre Jesús. Algunos como los magos lo reconocen como la luz del mundo; otros simplemente son indiferentes mientras que otros tratan de apagar esa luz: diferentes respuestas al niño recién nacido. ¿Quién lo puede reconocer? Sólo aquellos que permiten que la Palabra de Dios penetre en sus mentes y corazones.




