*Fifth Sunday
of Lent*

First Reading: Jeremiah 31:31-34
Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 51
– Create a clean heart in me, O God.
Second Reading: Hebrews 5:7-9
Gospel: John 12:20-33

We are on the Sunday preceding Palm Sunday and Holy Week. All the readings point in their different ways to the passion and death of Christ.

Jeremiah, in the first reading, tells of a shattered Jewish people, going into exile as a punishment for breaking the Old Covenant, that God will not forsake them. He foresees a time when God will form a new relationship with His people: placing His law within them and writing it in their hearts. He will put a new heart and a new spirit in His people.

We certainly need the change of heart promised by Jeremiah—each of us individually, and as a church, a nation, and citizens of our world. We do not need to catalogue all the things that we need to change.

The second reading tells us that because Jesus suffered and prayed “with loud cries and tears to God, who was able to save him from death.” Jesus knows our plight, is touched by our anguish, and pleads with God the Father in our behalf.

In the Gospel, Christ, in his prayer, speaks his thoughts out loud; his soul is troubled at the prospect of Calvary. However, he cannot ask to be spared his agony as God’s kingdom will only come through crucifixion and death.

A few days before Holy Thursday, some Greek converts to the Jewish religion, having heard about Jesus, wanted to meet him. They turned to Philip for help, he in turn asked Andrew, and together they informed Jesus about the wish of the Greeks.

The Greeks were not interested in how Jesus looked like. These Greeks may have gone through a long spiritual journey before feeling the need to see Jesus. Their request is proof of the thirst to see and to know Christ which is inherent in every person’s heart which longs for a lasting happiness.

They did not go directly to Jesus. They first approached the disciples but not just any disciple. They chose Philip and Andrew, the only ones with Greek names and in their mind, the most suitable people to represent them to Jesus.

Someone who knows Jesus more intimately led them to Jesus. Is it not the same with us? We became Christians because of someone who knew Christ and introduced him to us. They may be our parents who brought us up in the Christian faith or a catechist who led us through the Rites of Initiation for Christian Adults.

The Gospel does not tell us what happened to the Greeks. Instead, we are told of important words of Jesus. The first words recall an everyday experience of ours: that nothing is produced without passing first through death: “Unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat.”

The death of the grain of wheat which was accomplished in Jesus must also take place within us, his disciples. Our lives, like Christ, must resemble the grain of wheat that goes down into the ground to produce new life.

Life and death have a place in God’s plan for all. In every place and in every heart, the struggle between good and evil is still with us. The way of the cross begins at our doorstep, and we are called to follow its path.

In the early years of Christianity, when Christians were being persecuted, there were thousands of martyrs. The Roman Empire thought that killing Christians would put a stop to Christianity. The contrary happened. The more Christians were martyred, the greater the growth and strength of Christianity. One grain that dies gives life to hundreds of new grains. This is the mystery of our faith. Tertullian, one of the famous Fathers of the Church, wrote: “The blood of the martyrs is the seed of Christianity.”❖

Esto incluye eventos que victimizan directamente a los niños o eventos de este tipo de los cuales los niños son testigos presenciales, particularmente cuando la persona perjudicada es un ser querido. La comprensión que un niño tiene de la seguridad depende de la seguridad de sus cuidadores. V Domingo De Cuaresma**Primera Lectura: Jeremías 31, 31-34****Salmo Responsorial: Salmo 51***– Oh Dios, crea en mí un corazón nuevo.***Segunda Lectura: Hebreos 5, 7-9****Evangelio: San Juan 12, 20-23**

Falta una semana para que llegue el Domingo de Ramos y Semana Santa. Todas las lecturas apuntan de diferentes maneras a la pasión y muerte de Cristo.

Jeremías, en la primera lectura, habla de un pueblo judío quebrantado, que es exiliado como castigo por romper la Antigua Alianza, que Dios no los abandonará. Él prevé un tiempo en el que Dios formará una nueva relación con su pueblo: colocará su ley dentro de ellos y la escribirá en sus corazones. Pondrá un corazón y un espíritu nuevo en su pueblo.

Ciertamente necesitamos el cambio de corazón prometido por Jeremías: cada uno de nosotros individualmente y como iglesia, nación y ciudadanos de nuestro mundo. No necesitamos catalogar todas las cosas que necesitamos cambiar.

La segunda lectura nos dice que, porque Jesús “ofreció oraciones y súplicas, con fuertes voces y lágrimas, a aquel que podía librarlo de la muerte”. Jesús conoce nuestra situación, se conmueve por nuestra angustia y suplica a Dios Padre por nosotros.

En el Evangelio, Cristo, en su oración, expresa en voz alta sus pensamientos; su alma está turbada ante la perspectiva del Calvario. Sin embargo, no puede pedir ser libre de agonía, ya que el reino de Dios sólo llegará mediante la crucifixión y la muerte.

Unos días antes del Jueves Santo, algunos griegos conversos a la religión judía, habiendo oído hablar de Jesús, quisieron encontrarlo. Pidieron ayuda a Felipe, él a su vez le pidió ayuda a Andrés y juntos informaron a Jesús sobre el deseo de los griegos.

A los griegos no les interesaba el aspecto de Jesús. Es posible que estos griegos hayan atravesado un largo viaje espiritual antes de sentir la necesidad de ver a Jesús. Su petición es prueba de la sed de ver y conocer a Cristo, que está unido al corazón de cada persona, que anhela una felicidad duradera.

No fueron directamente a Jesús. Primero se acercaron a los discípulos, pero no a cualquier discípulo. Eligieron a Felipe y Andrés, los únicos con nombres griegos y, en su opinión, las personas más adecuadas para representarlos ante Jesús.

Alguien que conoce a Jesús más íntimamente los condujo a Jesús. ¿No ocurre lo mismo con nosotros? Nos convertimos en cristianos gracias a alguien que conoció a Cristo y nos lo presentó. Pueden ser nuestros padres que nos criaron en la fe cristiana o un catequista que nos guió a través de los Ritos de Iniciación para Adultos Cristianos.

El Evangelio no nos cuenta qué pasó con los griegos. En cambio, nos habla de palabras importantes de Jesús. Las primeras palabras recuerdan una experiencia nuestra cotidiana: que nada se produce sin pasar primero por la muerte: “Si el grano de trigo no cae al suelo y muere, queda sólo un grano de trigo”.

La muerte del grano de trigo que se cumplió en Jesús debe realizarse también en nosotros, sus discípulos. Nuestras vidas, como Cristo, deben parecerse al grano de trigo que desciende a la tierra para producir vida nueva.

La vida y la muerte tienen un lugar en el plan de Dios para todos. En cada lugar y en cada corazón, la lucha entre el bien y el mal sigue con nosotros. El camino de la cruz comienza en nuestra puerta y estamos llamados a seguir su camino.

En los primeros años del cristianismo, cuando los cristianos eran perseguidos, hubo miles de mártires. El Imperio Romano pensó que matar cristianos pondría fin al cristianismo. Sucedió lo contrario. Cuanto más cristianos eran martirizados, mayor era el crecimiento y la fuerza del cristianismo. Un grano que muere da vida a cientos de granos nuevos. Éste es el misterio de nuestra fe. Tertuliano, uno de los famosos Padres de la Iglesia, escribió: “La sangre de los mártires es la semilla del cristianismo”. ❖


