Sixth Sunday of Easter

First Reading:

Acts 15:1-2.22-29

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 67

— O God, let all the nations praise you.

Second Reading:

Revelation 21:10-14; 22-23

Gospel:

John 14:23-29

We are on the 6th Sunday of Easter. Today's readings speak of the promise to send the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, entrusting him with the task of leading his Church, of teaching, and of reminding them of all that he has said. Today's gospel also spells out how to prepare to receive the Holy Spirit.

The second reading from the Book of Revelation tells us what will be the wonderful conclusion of this work of the spirit in the Church while the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles shows us an example of this intervention by the Spirit within the early Christian communities as the apostles find answers to their problems and questions as they pray, discuss and keep their ears and hearts open to the voice of the Spirit.

There are times when we experience pain caused by someone who would leave us. Here, we have Jesus gently breaking the news of his departure to his apostles. Did the disciples finally understand that Jesus was about to leave them? They probably were numb as the future without him would be bleak and meaningless as the whole focus and direction of their lives would be gone.

But Christ will not abandon them. His departure is with the promise not to leave them alone without protection and guidance. The Spirit will be with them as their Advocate, "whom the Father will send," says Jesus in the gospel. And what's more, he left them the offer of peace which the world cannot give. The promise of peace that he will give them was not meant to preserve them from hardships and sufferings, but a promise to bring them safely to eternal life.

Then, he promised them the Spirit. Who is this Spirit that Jesus is talking about. Two are the tasks of the Spirit. First, to teach. The Holy Spirit is going to teach Christ's disciples how they will adopt the teachings of Jesus to peoples and cultures.

We know very well how impossible it can be if we are to live the teachings of Jesus

literally. Think for instance of the many problems waiting for answers and solutions such as how to live in peace with Muslims and non-Christians as well as fellow Christians hostile to the Catholic Church; or how to plan a family where children are well cared for and educated properly; or what stand to take on economic and political systems.

The second task of the Holy Spirit is "to remind". Many are the words of Jesus that, though present in the Gospel, run the risk of being set aside or easily forgotten. Up to a few years ago, many Christians distinguished between just and unjust wars and even spoke of "holy wars", approving the use of arms to defend one's rights and even death to criminals. Now, few people hold this view, thank God. But why is it that the disciples of Jesus forgot for so long his very clear words forbidding any form of violence against anyone? It seems impossible but it has happened. The Holy Spirit will keep on reminding us of the words of Jesus: "Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, to one who slaps you on one cheek, give him the other cheek."

For many centuries, many Christians closed their ears to the call of the Spirit, but now, anybody trying to justify violence is more and more moved by the Spirit, reminding him or her of the words of Jesus to be peace makers, to share goods, and that man and woman have equal dignities in front of God and therefore to reject any form of domineering over other people.

When we open ourselves to the Holy Spirit, we open up to a new way of relating with others, a relationship that stops us from seeking dominance or superiority over others, wanting to be the first and the best, a relationship that, instead, gives way to service, to disinterested love for the last and the least. Then can the words of Jesus be realized: "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you." Amen ♡

**Cast into the Deep
Remain in My Love

Scholars consider the Gospel of John as the “Gospel of Love” due to its profound emphasis on this theme. While the other Gospels touch on love, John’s perspective and focus make it particularly unique.

This is especially evident in last Thursday’s gospel from John 15:9-11. It starts with Jesus saying, “*As the Father loves me, so I love you.*” (John 15:9). He establishes the source and quality of His love for his disciples, a love that is eternal, perfect, unconditional and immeasurable. The LOVE between the Father and the Son is the epitome of divine communion, characterized by complete intimacy, delight, and affirmation.

Jesus extends this very same quality of LOVE to His disciples: “*so I also love you.*” This immediately elevates the disciple’s relationship with Jesus to a high and privileged status. Think about that for a moment, The perfect unreserved, boundless love that exists within the Godhead, that very love, is the measure of Christ’s love for us. We are loved with the very same love that God has for His Son. It’s not a lesser love, not a watered-down version, but the same infinite, unfathomable love.

Following the declaration of His love, Jesus issues a clear command to His disciples, “*Remain in my love.*” It is an invitation to continually dwell, abide and live within the sphere of His grace and mercy. It is not about earning His love (it’s already given) rather, experiencing it and living within its embrace. It means trusting in His LOVE, returning His AFFECTION and allowing that LOVE to shape our lives.

But how do we remain in His love? Jesus gives us a clear path: “*If you keep my commandments, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father’s commandments and remain in his love.*”


This is not burdensome legalism or command, rather, it’s a revelation of the nature of love. Love, in its truest form, desires what is best for the beloved. And God, in His infinite wisdom and love, gives us commandments not to restrict us, but to guide us into the fullness of life, into a deeper intimacy with Him, and into right relationship with one another.

And what is the ultimate fruit of remaining in Jesus? He tells us in verse 11: “*I told you this so that my joy might be in you and your joy might be complete.*” This is the pinnacle, the glorious outcome of dwelling in God’s love and living in obedience. It’s not just a joy, but Christ’s joy.

What kind of joy is this? It’s a joy that triumphs over trials, a joy that endures through sorrow, a joy that flows from an unshakable relationship with God. It’s the joy that Jesus Himself experienced, even in the face of immense suffering, because He was always perfectly abiding in the Father’s love. It’s a joy that is full, overflowing, complete. It’s not dependent on external circumstances, but on the internal reality of being loved by God and loving Him in return.

In our world often filled with anxiety, despair, and a desperate search for fleeting happiness, Jesus offers us something far more profound: it is a joy that strengthens us, sustains us, and overflows into every aspect of our lives. It’s a joy that allows us to face difficulties with hope and to celebrate blessings with gratitude, a joy that is complete, a joy that lasts.

My brothers and sisters, Jesus’ words to us are not just a nice sentiment; they are a blueprint for a life of purpose, peace, and profound joy. May we all strive, by God’s grace, to remain in His love, to keep His commandments, and to experience the complete joy that only He can give, a joy that is Himself. Amen. ♦

Age-appropriate curiosity in school-aged children



Last week, we covered young children and natural curiosity about their bodies. This week, we will explore natural curiosity behaviors in school-aged children (around 7-12 years old). It's important to understand the difference between appropriate and inappropriate, as inappropriate behaviors could be a sign of abuse. Common curiosity at this age includes playing games with same-aged friends like "family" or "dating," or wanting privacy. Children at these ages may also begin to take an interest in members of the opposite sex and ask questions about relationships. VI Domingo De Pascua**Primera Lectura: Hechos 15, 1-2. 22-29****Salmo Responsorial: Salmo 67**– *¡Oh Dios, que te alaben los pueblos, que todos los pueblos te alaben!***Segunda Lectura: Apocalipsis 21, 10-14. 22-23****Evangelio: Juan 14, 23-29**

Estamos en el sexto domingo de Pascua. Las lecturas de hoy hablan de la promesa de enviar al Consolador, el Espíritu Santo, encomendándole la tarea de guiar a su Iglesia, enseñar y recordarles todo lo que ha dicho. El Evangelio de hoy también explica cómo prepararse para recibir el Espíritu Santo.

La segunda lectura del Apocalipsis nos revela la maravillosa conclusión de esta obra del Espíritu en la Iglesia, mientras que la primera lectura de los Hechos de los Apóstoles nos muestra un ejemplo de esta intervención del Espíritu en las primeras comunidades cristianas, donde los apóstoles encontraban respuestas a sus problemas y preguntas al orar, dialogaban y mantenían sus oídos y corazones abiertos a la voz del Espíritu.

Hay momentos en que sentimos dolor por la idea de que alguien nos abandona. Aquí, Jesús anuncia con ternura su partida a sus apóstoles. ¿Entendieron finalmente los discípulos que Jesús estaba a punto de dejarlos? Probablemente estaban aturdidos, pues el futuro sin él sería sombrío y sin sentido, pues perderían todo el enfoque y la dirección de sus vidas.

Pero Cristo no los abandonará. Su partida conlleva la promesa de no dejarlos solos, sin protección ni guía. El Espíritu estará con ellos como su Abogado, “a quien mi Padre les enviará”, dice Jesús en el Evangelio. Y, además, les dejó la paz que el mundo no puede dar. La promesa de paz que les daría no tenía como fin protegerlos de las dificultades y el sufrimiento, sino llevarlos a salvo a la vida eterna.


Luego, les prometió el Espíritu. ¿Quién es este Espíritu del que habla Jesús? Dos son las tareas del Espíritu. Primero, enseñar. El Espíritu Santo enseñará a los discípulos de Cristo cómo instruir a los pueblos y diferentes culturas las enseñanzas de Jesús.

Sabemos muy bien lo imposible que puede ser vivir las enseñanzas de Jesús al pie de la letra. Pensemos, por ejemplo, en los numerosos problemas que esperan respuestas y soluciones, como cómo vivir en paz con musulmanes y no cristianos, así como con otros cristianos hostiles a la Iglesia católica; cómo planificar una familia donde los niños estén bien cuidados y reciban una educación adecuada; o qué postura adoptar ante los sistemas económicos y políticos.

La segunda tarea del Espíritu Santo es “recordar”. Muchas son las palabras de Jesús que, aunque presentes en el Evangelio, corren el riesgo de ser ignoradas o fácilmente olvidadas. Hasta hace unos años, muchos cristianos distinguían entre guerras justas e injustas e incluso hablaban de “guerras santas”, aprobando el uso de las armas para defender los derechos e incluso la muerte de los criminales. Ahora, gracias a Dios, pocos comparten esta opinión. Pero ¿por qué los discípulos de Jesús olvidaron durante tanto tiempo sus claras palabras que prohibían cualquier forma de violencia contra nadie? Parece imposible, pero ha sucedido. El Espíritu Santo nos seguirá recordando las palabras de Jesús: “Amar a sus enemigos, hagan el bien a los que los odian, y al que los abofetea en una mejilla, dale la otra”.

Durante siglos, muchos cristianos cerraron los oídos al llamado del Espíritu, pero ahora, quienquiera que intente justificar la violencia se siente cada vez más conmovido por el Espíritu, recordándole las palabras de Jesús de ser pacificadores, compartir los bienes, y que el hombre y la mujer tienen la misma dignidad ante Dios y, por lo tanto, rechazar cualquier forma de dominio sobre los demás.

Cuando nos abrimos al Espíritu Santo, nos abrimos a una nueva forma de relacionarnos con los demás, una relación que nos impide buscar el dominio o la superioridad sobre los demás, queriendo ser los primeros y los mejores, una relación que, en cambio, da paso al servicio, al amor desinteresado por los últimos y los más pequeños. Entonces se hacen realidad las palabras de Jesús: “La paz les dejo; mi paz les doy”. Amén.❖



**Pescando en lo Profundo
Permanezcan en mi Amor

Los eruditos consideran el Evangelio de Juan como el "Evangelio del Amor" debido a su profundo énfasis en este tema. Si bien los demás Evangelios abordan el amor, la perspectiva y el enfoque de Juan lo hacen particularmente único.

Esto es especialmente evidente en el Evangelio del jueves pasado, Juan 15,9-11. Comienza con Jesús diciendo: "Como el Padre me ama, así los amo yo" (Juan 15,9). Él establece la fuente y la calidad de su amor por sus discípulos, un amor eterno, perfecto, incondicional e incommensurable. El AMOR entre el Padre y el Hijo es el epítome de la comunión divina, caracterizada por una intimidad absoluta, deleite y afirmación.

Jesús extiende esta misma cualidad de AMOR a sus discípulos: "Así los amo yo". Esto eleva inmediatamente la relación del discípulo con Jesús a un estatus elevado y privilegiado. Piénsalo un momento, el amor perfecto, sin reservas e ilimitado que existe en la Deidad, ese mismo amor, es la medida del amor de Cristo por nosotros. Somos amados con el mismo amor que Dios siente por su Hijo. No es un amor menor, ni una versión diluida, sino el mismo amor infinito e insondable.



Tras la declaración de su amor, Jesús da un mandato claro a sus discípulos: "Permanezcan en mi amor". Es una invitación a morar, permanecer y vivir continuamente en la esfera de su gracia y misericordia. No se trata de ganarnos su amor (ya nos lo ha dado), sino de experimentarlo y vivir en su abrazo. Significa confiar en su AMOR, corresponder a su AFECTO y permitir que ese AMOR moldee nuestras vidas.

Pero ¿cómo permanecemos en su amor? Jesús nos da un camino claro: "Si cumplen mis mandamientos, permanecen en mi amor; lo mismo que yo cumple los mandamientos de mi Padre y permanezco en su amor".

Esto no es un legalismo pesado ni una orden, sino una revelación de la naturaleza del amor. El amor, en su forma más auténtica, desea lo mejor para el amado. Y Dios, en su infinita sabiduría y amor, nos da mandamientos no para limitarnos, sino para guiarnos hacia la plenitud de la vida, hacia una intimidad más profunda con él y hacia una relación correcta entre nosotros.

¿Y cuál es el fruto máximo de permanecer en Jesús? Él nos dice en el versículo 11: "Les he dicho esto para que mi alegría esté en ustedes y su alegría sea plena". Esta es la cumbre, el glorioso resultado de morar en el amor de Dios y vivir en obediencia. No es solo un gozo, sino el gozo de Cristo.

¿Qué clase de gozo es este? Es un gozo que triunfa sobre las pruebas, un gozo que perdura en el dolor, un gozo que brota de una relación inquebrantable con Dios. Es el gozo que Jesús mismo experimentó, incluso frente a un inmenso sufrimiento, porque siempre permaneció perfectamente en el amor del Padre. Es un gozo pleno, desbordante, completo. No depende de las circunstancias externas, sino de la realidad interna de ser amado por Dios y amarlo a cambio.

En nuestro mundo, a menudo lleno de ansiedad, desesperación y una búsqueda desesperada de una felicidad efímera, Jesús nos ofrece algo mucho más profundo: una alegría que nos fortalece, nos sostiene y se desborda en cada aspecto de nuestra vida. Es una alegría que nos permite afrontar las dificultades con esperanza y celebrar las bendiciones con gratitud; una alegría plena, una alegría que perdura.

Hermanos y hermanas, las palabras de Jesús no son solo un bonito sentimiento; es el plan para seguir para una vida con propósito, paz y profunda alegría. He was born in Florence on July 21, 1515 as one of four children. At the age of 18, he was sent to live with a wealthy relative to learn and possibly inherit the business. But.

Shortly after, he received a mystical vision and decided to be a priest instead. Philip was an evangelist. He loved to share the Gospel and help people to find or rediscover their faith in Jesus Christ. His days were dedicated to helping others, but his nights were set aside for solitude spent praying. His warm personality and sense of humor drew people to him.





What is a Pilgrimage In the Words of Pope Francis

"Making a Pilgrimage to shrines is one of the most eloquent expressions of the faith of God's people... It would be a mistake to think that those who go on a pilgrimage live a spirituality that is not personal but rather of the masses. The reality is that the pilgrim carries within him his own history and faith and the lights and shadows of his own life. Each person carries within his or her heart a special wish and a particular prayer. Those who enter the shrine immediately feel they are at home, welcomed, understood, and supported. Gazing upon the Crucifix or a image of Our Lady, a prayer is offered with tears in their eyes, brimming with faith. A shrine is truly a privileged space to meet the Lord and physically touch his mercy. To confess in a shrine is to have the experience of physically touching the mercy of God " ~ To those engaged in Pilgrimage Work, January 21, 2016

The Christian Pilgrimage is characterized by three signs:

1. "silence [which] allows one to listen, to listen with the heart, and in this way to find, while one walks, through the effort, the answers that the heart is looking for, because the heart asks questions. Indeed, God speaks in silence, like a gentle breeze..."
2. "the Gospel – always have the Gospel in your pocket ...The pilgrimage is made by re-reading the journey that Jesus took, up to the extreme gift of Self. ... when one reads the Gospel, there is someone beside us. It is the Holy Spirit. It is He who makes us understand well what the Gospel does."
3. "Matthew 25 Protocol": "Whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me" (Mt 25:40)...doing good, to people who also smaller, the most disadvantaged people. Always do good. Along the way, be attentive to others, especially those who struggle the most, who have fallen, who are in need..." Local Pilgrimage Sites

Throughout this Holy Year, a plenary Indulgence in the usual form of the Church will be granted to all the faithful who are truly repentant and detached from any sin and confess their sins sacramentally, receive Holy Communion, pray for the intentions of the Holy Father, and go on a pilgrimage visit to the [Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels](#) or [Mission Basilica San Buenaventura](#), or perform corporal or spiritual works of mercy.

What is a plenary indulgence?

God never ceases to offer us his mercy. When we sin, an unhealthy attachment to earthly things remains even after the guilt of sin is forgiven. Such attachments can be purified here on earth through an indulgence or in purgatory; this purification is known as the remission of temporal punishment due to sin (Catechism of the Catholic Church 1472).

During the Jubilee, a plenary indulgence - the complete remission of temporal punishment due to sin (CCC,1471) - in the usual form of the Church will be granted to all the faithful who are truly repentant and confess their sins, receive Holy Communion, pray for the intentions of the Holy Father, and perform one of the following:

1. a pilgrimage visit to the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels or Mission Basilica San Buenaventura to pray;
2. participation in a parish mission or study of the documents of the Second Vatican Council or the Catechism of the Catholic Church;
3. corporal or spiritual works of mercy;
4. penitential practices.

¿Qué es una peregrinación? En palabras del Papa Francisco

Peregrinar a los santuarios es una de las expresiones más elocuentes de la fe del pueblo de Dios... Sería un error pensar que quienes peregrinan viven una espiritualidad no personal, sino de masas. La realidad es que el peregrino lleva en sí su propia historia y fe, así como las luces y sombras de su vida. Cada persona lleva en su corazón un deseo especial y una oración particular. Quienes entran al santuario se sienten inmediatamente como en casa, acogidos, comprendidos y apoyados. Al contemplar el Crucifijo o una imagen de Nuestra Señora, se ofrece una oración con lágrimas en los ojos. Un santuario es verdaderamente un espacio privilegiado para encontrar al Señor y tocar físicamente su misericordia. Confesarse en un santuario es tener la experiencia de tocar físicamente la misericordia de Dios, 21 de enero de 2016.

La peregrinación cristiana se caracteriza por tres signos:

1. "El silencio [que] permite escuchar, escuchar con el corazón, y así encontrar, mientras se camina, mediante el esfuerzo, las respuestas que el corazón busca, porque el corazón se pregunta. En efecto, Dios habla en silencio, como una suave brisa..."

Eucharistic Revival

Three years ago, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops launched the National Eucharistic Revival, the high point of which was the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis last summer. As the culmination of this three-year initiative, the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage will start in Indianapolis on May 18, 2025 and end in Los Angeles. Eight perpetual pilgrims will travel with the Blessed Sacrament across the country, logging 3,340 miles and passing through 20 dioceses.

On Friday, June 20, 2025, the pilgrimage will travel up the coast to Mission Basilica San Buenaventura and then to Sacred Heart Church in Altadena. The next day, Saturday, June 21, it will stop at St. Vincent de Paul Church and end at Mission San Gabriel. Finally, on **Sunday, June 22, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels will host the Corpus Christi Celebration, with Mass and a Eucharistic procession through downtown Los Angeles.**

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
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
