The Feast of the Ascension of the Lord

First Reading: Acts 1:1-11

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 47

– God mounts His throne to shouts of joy: a blare of trumpets for the Lord.

Second Reading:

Hebrews 9:24-28.10:19-23

Gospel:

Luke 24:46-53

Ascension Day is celebrated 40 days after Easter Sunday and the 40th day from Easter Sunday was last Thursday. However, many Archdioceses, including the Archdiocese of Los Angeles, other Dioceses, Apostolic Vicariates and Apostolic Prefectures moved the celebration to this Sunday to allow for greater participation and to emphasize the importance of this Holy Day. A few Ecclesiastical Provinces in the U.S. such as those of Boston, Hartford, New York, Omaha, and Philadelphia continue to observe Ascension on a Thursday.

The Acts of the Apostles and the Gospel of Luke (Luke wrote both the Acts and the Gospel) describes the ascension of the Lord as part of God's plan, so that the Holy Spirit might come to strengthen the disciples in their witness to Christ. The second reading from the Letter to the Hebrew speaks of the sacrifice which Christ has made in his own blood for our salvation. This is reason for us to remain steadfast in our hope for heaven.

The Feast of the Ascension marks the end of Christ's mission on earth and celebrates his final entry into the glory of God. He has not gone away from us; he remains with us. In the glory of the Father, he can be close to anyone, always.

The common image that we have is of Jesus launching himself into heaven. To this day there is an operative image of Jesus shooting straight up in the air, as if he took one big jump on the trampoline of earth and catapulted into the glory of God. And the disciples were looking up to heaven as Jesus ascends. Such an image of course presumes that there is a place "up there" to which Jesus ascended. But the image of the disciples "looking up to heaven" is not easy for us to understand, so we run the risk of looking on the feast of the Ascension with our eyes raised up to the skies.

This is exactly the opposite of what we should do: the Ascension is a Feast inviting

us to look down to earth, to people among whom we are called to make present the work of the Master. Yet even though we must look down on the earth, we are reminded that human life is not enclosed and does not end within the narrow confines of this world.

Noting that they were gazing up, we might guess that the apostles wished at that moment that Christ had not just left them again. Just as on that day, He was leaving them in a way that left no earthly reassurance He'd be back. Surely on a human level, they would have at least preferred that He stay with them.

No longer confined to a bodily presence, Jesus will be with his disciples in a new way, through the power of the Holy Spirit. Now that his earthly mission is over, he entrusts the continuation of his work to his friends who believe in him. For the apostles and those who followed him, it meant that their period of formation and training was over, and the time had arrived for the beginning of their mission, a task in which to engage themselves until he returns in glory. They would not be alone for Jesus himself assured them of divine assistance through the Holy Spirit in carrying this mission. Since Jesus gave this mission to his apostles, what has been accomplished up to our days?

The spreading of the Good News to all nations is not a goal that can be attained by dint of human might and craft. That is why Jesus promised to empower his messengers from on high by his abiding presence and the Holy Spirit. The challenge of sharing the Good News with all humankind should, therefore, begin on our knees as we confess that we have often taken matters into our own selfish human hands; let us go down on our knees once again and promise to give the Holy Spirit a chance to work on us. ❖

Today, we celebrate the Ascension of our Lord into heaven. Technically this feast occurs 40 days after his resurrection which would have been last Thursday. But we celebrate it on this 7th Sunday of Easter underlining its importance and allowing more people to participate in the celebration.

Shortly before he was taken up to heaven, Jesus had parting instructions for the apostles and disciples who were with him: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the holy Spirit teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you..," (Matthew 28:19-20). In today's reading from Luke, this commission may not be stated as directly but is nevertheless not to be missed, "...and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things." (Luke 24:47-48)

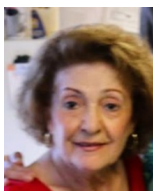

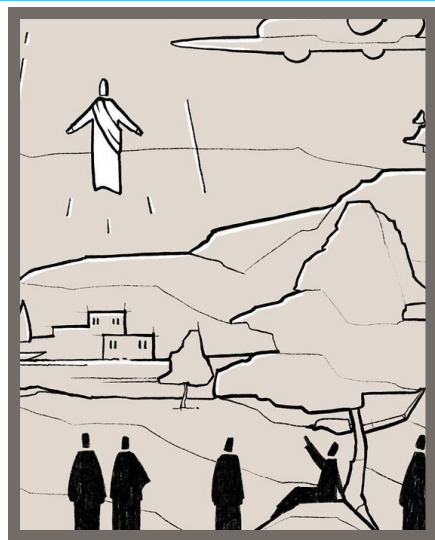

Ascensión del Señor**Primera Lectura: Hechos 1, 1-11****Salmo Responsorial: Salmo 47***– Dios asciende entre aclamaciones, el Señor, al son de trompetas.***Segunda Lectura: Hebreos 9, 24-28; 10, 19-23****Evangelio: Lucas 24, 46-53**

El Día de la Ascensión se celebra 40 días después del Domingo de Pascua, y el 40º día desde el Domingo de Pascua fue el jueves pasado. Sin embargo, muchas Arquidiócesis, incluyendo la Arquidiócesis de Los Ángeles, otras Diócesis, Vicariatos Apostólicos y Prefecturas Apostólicas, trasladaron la celebración a este domingo para permitir una mayor participación y enfatizar la importancia de este Día Santo. Algunas Provincias Eclesiásticas en Estados Unidos, como las de Boston, Hartford, Nueva York, Omaha y Filadelfia, continúan celebrando la Ascensión el jueves.



Los Hechos de los Apóstoles y el Evangelio de Lucas (Lucas escribió tanto los Hechos como el Evangelio) describen la ascensión del Señor como parte del plan de Dios, para que el Espíritu Santo viniera a fortalecer a los discípulos en su testimonio de Cristo. La segunda lectura de la Carta a los Hebreos habla del sacrificio que Cristo hizo con su propia sangre por nuestra salvación. Esta es una razón para que permanezcamos firmes en nuestra esperanza del cielo.

La Fiesta de la Ascensión marca el final de la misión de Cristo en la tierra y celebra su entrada definitiva en la gloria de Dios. Él no se ha alejado de nosotros; permanece con nosotros. En la gloria del Padre, puede estar cerca de todos, siempre.

La imagen común que tenemos es la de Jesús subiendo al cielo. Hasta el día de hoy, existe una imagen vigente de Jesús lanzándose hacia arriba, como si diera un gran salto en el trampolín de la tierra y se catapultara a la gloria de Dios. Y los discípulos miraban al cielo mientras Jesús ascendía. Tal imagen, por supuesto, presupone que existe un lugar "allá arriba" al que Jesús ascendió. Pero la imagen de los discípulos "mirando al cielo" no nos resulta fácil de entender, por lo que corremos el riesgo de contemplar la fiesta de la Ascensión con la mirada puesta en el cielo.

Esto es exactamente lo contrario de lo que deberíamos hacer: la Ascensión es una Fiesta que nos invita a mirar hacia abajo, a las personas entre quienes estamos llamados a hacer presente la obra del Maestro. Sin embargo, aunque debemos mirar hacia abajo, se nos recuerda que la vida humana no está encerrada ni termina en los estrechos confines de este mundo.

Al notar que miraban hacia arriba, podríamos suponer que los apóstoles desearon en ese momento que Cristo no los hubiera dejado simplemente de nuevo. Al igual que ese día, los dejaba de una manera que no les dejaba ninguna seguridad terrenal de su regreso. Seguramente, a nivel humano, al menos habrían preferido que se quedara con ellos.

Ya no confinado a una presencia corporal, Jesús estará con sus discípulos de una manera nueva, por el poder del Espíritu Santo. Ahora que su misión terrenal ha terminado, confía la continuación de su obra a sus amigos que creen en él. Para los apóstoles y quienes lo siguieron, significó que su período de formación y capacitación había terminado, y había llegado el momento de comenzar su misión, una tarea en la que participarían hasta su regreso glorioso. No estarían solos, pues Jesús mismo les aseguró la asistencia divina a través del Espíritu Santo para llevar a cabo esta misión. Ya que Jesús encomendó esta misión a sus apóstoles, ¿qué se ha logrado hasta nuestros días?

La difusión de la Buena Nueva a todas las naciones no es una meta que pueda alcanzarse mediante el poder y la astucia humanos. Por eso Jesús prometió empoderar a sus mensajeros desde lo alto con su presencia constante y el Espíritu Santo. El desafío de compartir la Buena Nueva con toda la humanidad debe, por lo tanto, comenzar de rodillas, al confesar que a menudo hemos tomado las riendas de nuestros propios asuntos, con egoísmo humano. Pongámonos de rodillas una vez más y prometamos darle al Espíritu Santo una oportunidad para trabajar en nosotros.❖

Hoy celebramos la Ascensión de nuestro Señor al cielo. Técnicamente, esta fiesta se celebra 40 días después de su resurrección, que habría sido el jueves pasado. Sin embargo, la celebramos este séptimo domingo de Pascua, lo que subraya su importancia y permite que más personas participen en la celebración.

Poco antes de ascender al cielo, Jesús dio instrucciones de despedida a los apóstoles y discípulos que lo acompañaban: “Vayan, y hagan que todos los pueblos sean mis discípulos, bautizándolos en el nombre del Padre y del Hijo y del Espíritu Santo, y enseñándoles a cumplir todo lo que yo les he mandado...” (Mateo 28,19-20). En la lectura de hoy de Lucas, esta comisión puede que no se exprese tan directamente, pero sin embargo no debe pasarse por alto: “y que en su nombre se había de predicar a todas las naciones, comenzando por Jerusalén, la necesidad de volverse a Dios para el perdón de los pecados. Ustedes son testigos de esto”. (Lucas 24,47-48).

Puede ser casualidad o intencional que ayer, 31 de mayo, el Arzobispo José H. Gómez ordenara a ocho nuevos sacerdotes para la Arquidiócesis de Los Ángeles en la Catedral de Nuestra Señora de los Ángeles. Compartir la buena nueva de Jesucristo y su mensaje de salvación, a menudo mediante la predicación, la enseñanza y otras formas de evangelización, es un aspecto significativo y fundamental del ministerio sacerdotal. En esencia, aquí están estos ocho hombres respondiendo al mandato de las palabras de despedida de Jesús. Nos sentimos bendecidos de que hayan respondido a su llamado. Quizás conozcan a algunos de ellos, ya que figuraban entre los nombres en una hoja de papel que elegimos para apoyarlos con nuestras oraciones durante su formación y discernimiento.

Si desean conocer un poco más sobre estos nuevos sacerdotes, de dónde son, la historia de su llamado y la parroquia que llamarán hogar durante los próximos años, visiten <https://lacatholics.org/ordination/>. Así lo hice, y me impresionó la alegría que irradiaban sus rostros, sus ojos, su entusiasmo al anticipar su ministerio. NATIONAL Eucharistic Revival

Three years ago, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops launched the National Eucharistic Revival, the high point of which was the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis last summer. As the culmination of this three-year initiative, the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage will start in Indianapolis on May 18, 2025 and end in Los Angeles. Eight perpetual pilgrims will travel with the Blessed Sacrament across the country, logging 3,340 miles and passing through 20 dioceses.

On Friday, June 20, 2025, the pilgrimage will travel up the coast to Mission Basilica San Buenaventura and then to Sacred Heart Church in Altadena. The next day, Saturday, June 21, it will stop at St. Vincent de Paul Church and end at Mission San Gabriel. Finally, on **Sunday, June 22, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels will host the Corpus Christi Celebration, with Mass and a Eucharistic procession through downtown Los Angeles.**

St. Charles Lwanga and his companions were a group of Ugandan martyrs who were executed between 1885 and 1887 under the orders of King Mwanga II of Buganda. Lwanga, a convert to Christianity, was a leader among the royal pages and worked to protect young converts from persecution. When the king demanded that Christians renounce their faith, Lwanga and his companions refused, leading to their brutal execution, many by burning. They were canonized as saints by Pope Paul VI in 1964 and are honored as patrons of African Catholic youth.

St. Boniface (c. 675 – June 5, 754) was an English missionary and reformer, often called the Apostle of Germany for his role in the Christianization of the region. Born in Wessex, England, he became a Benedictine monk and later traveled to the European continent to spread Christianity among the Germanic peoples. He was instrumental in organizing the Church in Germany, establishing monasteries, and strengthening ties between the German Church and the papacy. He was martyred in Frisia while preaching solidifying his reputation as a fearless .His influence remains strong, and he is still venerated as a patron saint in Germany and beyond.

St. Norbert of Xanten (c. 1080 – June 6, 1134) was a German bishop and founder of the Premonstratensian Order, also known as the Norbertines. Initially living a worldly life, he experienced a profound conversion after a near-death experience and dedicated himself to religious reform. He became an itinerant preacher, advocating for clerical discipline and devotion. In 1120, he established the Canons Regular of Prémontré, emphasizing community life and service. Later, he reluctantly accepted the role of Archbishop of Magdeburg, where he continued his efforts to strengthen the Church. He was canonized in 1582.

What is a Pilgrimage In the Words of Pope Francis

"Making a Pilgrimage to shrines is one of the most eloquent expressions of the faith of God's people... It would be a mistake to think that those who go on a pilgrimage live a spirituality that is not personal but rather of the masses. The reality is that the pilgrim carries within him his own history and faith and the lights and shadows of his own life. Each person carries within his or her heart a special wish and a particular prayer. Those who enter the shrine immediately feel they are at home, welcomed, understood, and supported. Gazing upon the Crucifix or a image of Our Lady, a prayer is offered with tears in their eyes, brimming with faith. A shrine is truly a privileged space to meet the Lord and physically touch his mercy. To confess in a shrine is to have the experience of physically touching the mercy of God " ~ To those engaged in Pilgrimage Work, January 21, 2016

The Christian Pilgrimage is characterized by three signs:

1. "silence [which] allows one to listen, to listen with the heart, and in this way to find, while one walks, through the effort, the answers that the heart is looking for, because the heart asks questions. Indeed, God speaks in silence, like a gentle breeze..."
2. "the Gospel – always have the Gospel in your pocket ...The pilgrimage is made by re-reading the journey that Jesus took, up to the extreme gift of Self. ... when one reads the Gospel, there is someone beside us. It is the Holy Spirit. It is He who makes us understand well what the Gospel does. "
3. "Matthew 25 Protocol": "Whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me" (Mt 25:40)...doing good, to people who also smaller, the most disadvantaged people. Always do good. Along the way, be attentive to others, especially those who struggle the most, who have fallen, who are in need..." In the Archdiocese of Los Angeles

Local Pilgrimage Sites

Throughout this Holy Year, a plenary Indulgence in the usual form of the Church will be granted to all the faithful who are truly repentant and detached from any sin and confess their sins sacramentally, receive Holy Communion, pray for the intentions of the Holy Father, and go on a pilgrimage visit to the [Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels](#) or [Mission Basilica San Buenaventura](#), or perform corporal or spiritual works of mercy.

What is a plenary indulgence?

God never ceases to offer us his mercy. When we sin, an unhealthy attachment to earthly things remains even after the guilt of sin is forgiven. Such attachments can be purified here on earth through an indulgence or in purgatory; this purification is known as the remission of temporal punishment due to sin (Catechism of the Catholic Church 1472).

During the Jubilee, a plenary indulgence - the complete remission of temporal punishment due to sin (CCC,1471) - in the usual form of the Church will be granted to all the faithful who are truly repentant and confess their sins, receive Holy Communion, pray for the intentions of the Holy Father, and perform one of the following:

1. a pilgrimage visit to the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels or Mission Basilica San Buenaventura to pray;
2. participation in a parish mission or study of the documents of the Second Vatican Council or the Catechism of the Catholic Church;
3. corporal or spiritual works of mercy;
4. penitential practices.

¿Qué es una peregrinación? En palabras del Papa Francisco

Peregrinar a los santuarios es una de las expresiones más elocuentes de la fe del pueblo de Dios... Sería un error pensar que quienes peregrinan viven una espiritualidad no personal, sino de masas. La realidad es que el peregrino lleva en sí su propia historia y fe, así como las luces y sombras de su vida. Cada persona lleva en su corazón un deseo especial y una oración particular. Quienes entran al santuario se sienten inmediatamente como en casa, acogidos, comprendidos y apoyados. Al contemplar el Crucifijo o una imagen de Nuestra Señora, se ofrece una oración con lágrimas en los ojos. Un santuario es verdaderamente un espacio privilegiado para encontrar al Señor y tocar físicamente su misericordia. Confesarse en un santuario es tener la experiencia de tocar físicamente la misericordia de Dios, 21 de enero de 2016.

La peregrinación cristiana se caracteriza por tres signos:

1. "El silencio [que] permite escuchar, escuchar con el corazón, y así encontrar, mientras se camina, mediante el esfuerzo, las respuestas que el corazón busca, porque el corazón se pregunta. En efecto, Dios habla en silencio, como una suave brisa..."
2. "El Evangelio: ten siempre el Evangelio en el bolsillo... La peregrinación se realiza releyendo el camino de Jesús, hasta la entrega extrema de sí mismo... Cuando leemos el Evangelio, hay alguien a nuestro lado. Es el Espíritu Santo. Es Él quien nos hace comprender bien lo que hace el Evangelio."
3. 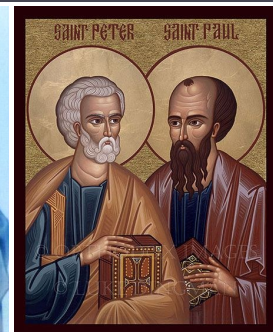
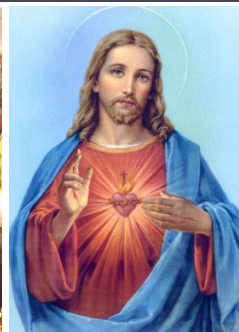

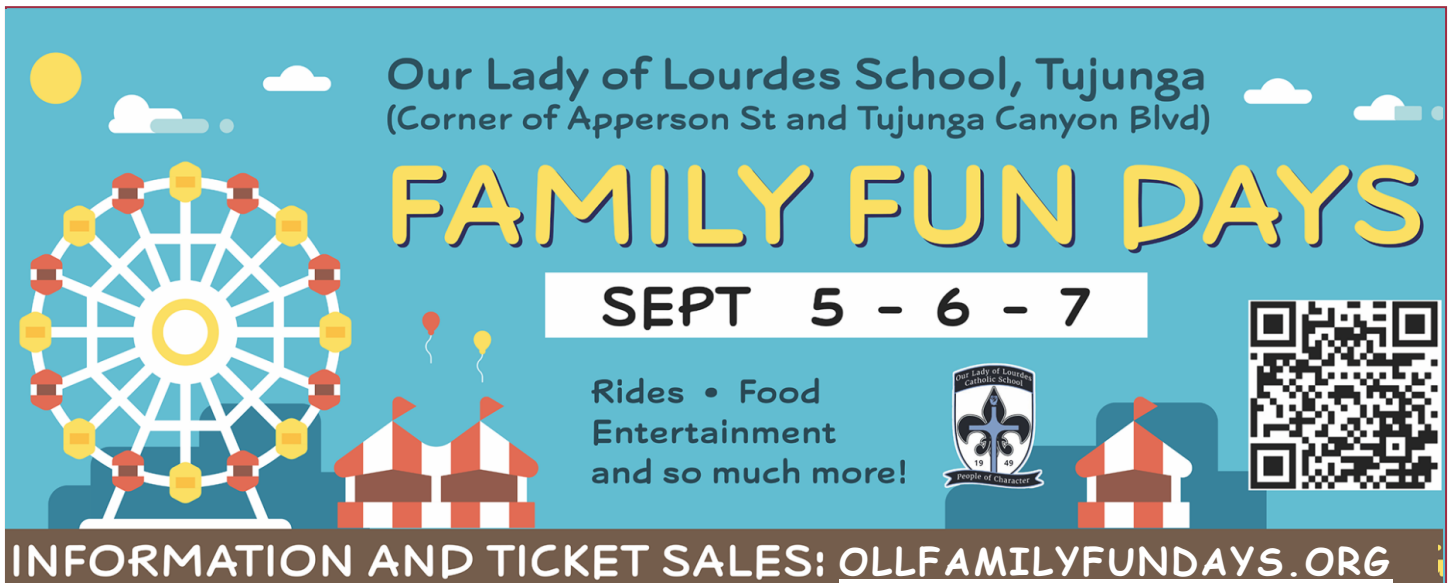
