Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

First Reading:

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 8

– O Lord, our God, how wonderful your name in all the earth.

Second Reading:

Romans 5:1-5

Gospel:

John 16:12-15

We begin our Mass, we baptize, we give blessings, all in the name of the Most Holy Trinity. The Holy Trinity is fundamental to our Christian faith, understandable more with our hearts than through any form of reasoning because God cannot be fully grasped by the human intellect. The idea that God is Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and yet one God, is a revealed doctrine of faith and has been there since the time of Jesus and the apostles. Jesus spoke of His Father and He as the Son, and the Holy Spirit, “the Advocate, whom the Father will send in my name . . .” It is Jesus who revealed God as Trinity when he spoke about the Father who sent him through the mystery of the incarnation and the Holy Spirit who will glorify the Son as we heard from the Gospel reading today.

Human reason will never adequately explain who God is as Trinity because human understanding is limited. The God we worship is beyond human comprehension. If so, He would not be a God at all. Thus, attempts were made using symbols and one of those figures used was the Shamrock by St. Patrick of Ireland in the 5th century. It is said that St. Patrick used the three leaved Shamrock to explain the concept of the Holy Trinity to the pagan Irish then.

God became human in Jesus through Mary. In order to become human, God used Mary who gave the Son of God flesh and blood. As God became man through Mary, we can go to her Son through her as Mother of God. This is simple syllogism: If Jesus is God and Mary is the Mother of Jesus, then Mary is the Mother of God. It

was in Jesus that we can understand the three Divine Persons in one God. The wonderful thing about the Incarnation is that God looked down upon us, made the first move and became one of us in all things but sin. God became man in Jesus who experienced the life, and yes, the whole life of humanity.

God, in three Persons, invites us to live in the awareness of the presence of the three Persons sharing the same Divine nature in one God. That means, “each Divine Person is God, yet there is still only one God.” (Catechism of the Catholic Church#234, 253 – 256)

There is an old story about a man who goes up to the mountain to meet a guru or wise man respected by the villagers. He finds the guru sitting and half nodding off. The man shoves him a little bit and wakes him up. The wise man says, “What can I do for you?”

“Well”, says the man, “I came to see you since I heard of your wisdom. What I really want is for you to explain to me who God is so that I will do my best to worship Him the way you do.” The wise man replies, “A god that you can explain is not a god that you should worship.”

The Holy Trinity is therefore not just a doctrine to be fully understood. It is a way of relating and living with the great God now revealed by Jesus as Creator, Redeemer and Savior. To know who God is and what He does and how He works starts from the heart where He dwells, and the name of that place is Love. ❖

Body safety information for young children



Children should know the difference between "okay" and "not okay" or "good" and "bad" touches – touches that are welcome and comforting, and those that are intrusive, unwanted, painful, or uncomfortable. Children should know that they have the right to say "no" to being touched, even to adults, and that no children or adults should touch their private parts unless in very specific circumstances, and for a healthy purpose. This is where it can be helpful to discuss "safe adults," like doctors, who check our bodies

Archbishop Gomez comments on the protests around Los Angeles

"I am troubled by today's immigration enforcement raids in Los Angeles, and I am praying for our community," Archbishop Gomez said in a statement. "I pray tonight that everyone involved will exercise restraint and calm. "We all agree that we don't want undocumented immigrants who are known terrorists or violent criminals in our communities. But there is no need for the government to carry out enforcement actions in a way that provokes fear and anxiety among ordinary, hard-working immigrants and their families."

Información sobre seguridad corporal para niños pequeños

Los niños deben conocer la diferencia entre tacto bueno y tacto malo – los tactos bienvenidos y reconfortantes contra los que son intrusivos, no deseadas, dolorosas y/o incómodas. Los niños deben saber que tienen el derecho de decir “no” a cualquier tipo de contacto no deseado incluso a los adultos, y que ningún niño o adulto deben tocar las partes íntimas salvo en circunstancias muy concretas y con fines sanitarios o médicos. Puede ser útil hablar de “adultos de confianza”, como los doctores que revisan nuestros cuerpos para ayudar a mantenernos sanos, y sólo en presencia de un padre o un adulto de confianza. Solemnidad de la Santísima Trinidad**Primera Lectura: Proverbios 8, 22-31****Salmo Responsorial: Salmo 8***– Señor, dueño nuestro, ¡qué admirable es tu nombre en toda la tierra!***Segunda Lectura: Romanos 5, 1-5****Evangelio: Juan 16, 12-15**

Comenzamos nuestra misa, bautizamos, bendecimos, todo en nombre de la Santísima Trinidad. La Santísima Trinidad es fundamental para nuestra fe cristiana, comprensible más con el corazón que con cualquier razonamiento, ya que Dios no puede ser comprendido plenamente por el intelecto humano. La idea de que Dios es Padre, Hijo y Espíritu Santo, y sin embargo un solo Dios, es una doctrina revelada de fe y ha existido desde los tiempos de Jesús y los apóstoles. Jesús habló de su Padre y de él como el Hijo, y del Espíritu Santo, “el Consolador, a quien el Padre enviará en mi nombre...” Fue Jesús quien reveló a Dios como Trinidad al hablar del Padre que lo envió mediante el misterio de la encarnación y del Espíritu Santo que glorificará al Hijo, como escuchamos en el Evangelio de hoy.

La razón humana nunca podrá explicar adecuadamente quién es Dios como Trinidad, porque el entendimiento humano es limitado. El Dios que adoramos está más allá de la comprensión humana. Si así fuera, no sería Dios en absoluto. Por ello, se intentó usar símbolos, y una de esas figuras fue el trébol de San Patricio de Irlanda en el siglo V. Se dice que San Patricio usó el trébol de tres hojas para explicar el concepto de la Santísima Trinidad a los paganos irlandeses de la época.



Dios se hizo humano en Jesús a través de María. Para hacerse humano, Dios usó a María, quien dio carne y sangre al Hijo de Dios. Así como Dios se hizo hombre a través de María, podemos llegar a su Hijo a través de ella como Madre de Dios. Este es un silogismo simple: si Jesús es Dios y María es la Madre de Jesús, entonces María es la Madre de Dios. Fue en Jesús que podemos comprender las tres Personas Divinas en un solo Dios. Lo maravilloso de la Encarnación es que Dios nos miró, dio el primer paso y se hizo uno de nosotros en todo menos en el pecado. Dios se hizo hombre en Jesús, quien experimentó la vida, y sí, toda la vida de la humanidad.

Dios, en tres Personas, nos invita a vivir conscientes de la presencia de las tres Personas que comparten la misma naturaleza Divina en un solo Dios. Esto significa que “cada Persona Divina es Dios, pero aun así hay un solo Dios”. (Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica, #234, 253-256)

Hay una antigua historia sobre un hombre que subió a la montaña para encontrarse con un gurú o sabio respetado por los aldeanos. Encontró al gurú sentado, medio dormido. El hombre lo empujó un poco y lo despertó. El sabio le preguntó: “¿Qué puedo hacer por usted?”

“Bueno”, respondió el hombre, “vine a verte porque supe de tu sabiduría. Lo que realmente quiero es que me expliques quién es Dios para que pueda hacer todo lo posible por adorarlo como tú lo haces”. El sabio respondió: “Un dios que puedes explicar no es un dios al que debas adorar”.

La Santísima Trinidad, por lo tanto, no es solo una doctrina que se debe comprender plenamente. Es una forma de relacionarnos y vivir con el gran Dios, ahora revelado por Jesús como Creador, Redentor y Salvador. Saber quién es Dios, qué hace y cómo obra comienza en el corazón donde ÉL mora, y el nombre de ese lugar es Amor.❖

Las declaraciones y acciones de la nueva administración en Washington han causado miedo en nuestras parroquias, escuelas y comunidades. Eso no es bueno para nadie. Rezo para que nuestros líderes procedan con moderación y compasión, con respeto por la ley y con respeto por los derechos y la dignidad de todos los involucrados.

Nadie quiere criminales violentos viviendo en nuestras comunidades. Pero cualquier acción coercitiva debe ser prudente y debe ir acompañada de una acción inmediata en el Congreso para arreglar nuestro sistema de inmigración, que ya no funciona desde hace décadas.

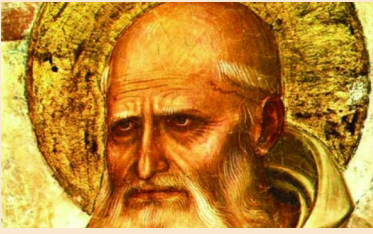

Celebrating our Saints of the week

Saint Romuald, Abbot

June 19

In the midst of a wasted youth, Romuald watched his father kill a relative in a duel over property. In horror he fled to a monastery near Ravenna. After three years, some of the monks found him to be uncomfortably holy and eased him out.

Romuald spent the next 30 years going about Italy, founding monasteries and hermitages. He longed to give his life to Christ in martyrdom, and got the pope's permission to preach the gospel in Hungary. But he was struck with illness as soon as he arrived, and the illness recurred as often as he tried to proceed.

During another period of his life, Romuald suffered great spiritual dryness. One day as he was praying Psalm 31 ("I will give you understanding and I will instruct you"), he was given an extraordinary light and spirit which never left him.

The most famous of the monasteries Romuald founded was that of the Camaldoli in Tuscany. Here began the Order of the Camaldolese Benedictines, uniting the monastic and eremitical lives. In later life Romuald's own father became a monk, wavered, and was kept faithful by the encouragement of his son.

Saint Aloysius Gonzaga, Religious

St. Aloysius was born in Castiglione, Italy. The first words St. Aloysius spoke were the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary. He was destined for the military by his father (who was in service to Philip II), but by the age of 9 Aloysius had decided on a religious life, and made a vow of perpetual virginity. To safeguard himself from possible temptation, he would keep his eyes persistently downcast in the presence of women. St. Charles Borromeo gave him his first Holy Communion. A kidney disease prevented St. Aloysius from a full social life for a while, so he spent his time in prayer and reading the lives of the saints. Although he was appointed a page in Spain, St. Aloysius kept up his many devotions and austerities, and was quite resolved to become a Jesuit.

His family eventually moved back to Italy, where he taught catechism to the poor. When he was 18, he joined the Jesuits, after finally breaking down his father, who had refused his entrance into the order. He served in a hospital during the plague of 1587 in Milan, and died from it at the age of 23, after receiving the last rites from St. Robert Bellarmine. The last word he spoke was the Holy Name of Jesus. St. Robert wrote the Life of St. Aloysius.

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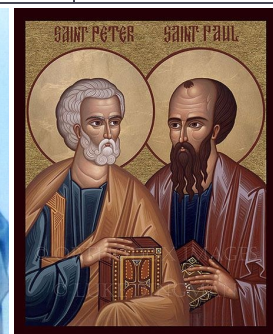
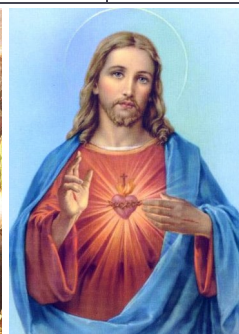

What is a Pilgrimage In the Words of Pope Francis

"Making a Pilgrimage to shrines is one of the most eloquent expressions of the faith of God's people... It would be a mistake to think that those who go on a pilgrimage live a spirituality that is not personal but rather of the masses. The reality is that the pilgrim carries within him his own history and faith and the lights and shadows of his own life. Each person carries within his or her heart a special wish and a particular prayer. Those who enter the shrine immediately feel they are at home, welcomed, understood, and supported. Gazing upon the Crucifix or a image of Our Lady, a prayer is offered with tears in their eyes, brimming with faith. A shrine is truly a privileged space to meet the Lord and physically touch his mercy. To confess in a shrine is to have the experience of physically touching the mercy of God " ~ To those engaged in Pilgrimage Work, January 21, 2016

The Christian Pilgrimage is characterized by three signs:

1. "silence [which] allows one to listen, to listen with the heart, and in this way to find, while one walks, through the effort, the answers that the heart is looking for, because the heart asks questions. Indeed, God speaks in silence, like a gentle breeze..."
2. "the Gospel – always have the Gospel in your pocket ...The pilgrimage is made by re-reading the journey that Jesus took, up to the extreme gift of Self. ... when one reads the Gospel, there is someone beside us. It is the Holy Spirit. It is He who makes us understand well what the Gospel does. "
3. "Matthew 25 Protocol": "Whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me" (Mt 25:40)...doing good, to people who also smaller, the most disadvantaged people. Always do good. Along the way, be attentive to others, especially those who struggle the most, who have fallen, who are in need..." Local Pilgrimage Sites

Throughout this Holy Year, a plenary Indulgence in the usual form of the Church will be granted to all the faithful who are truly repentant and detached from any sin and confess their sins sacramentally, receive Holy Communion, pray for the intentions of the Holy Father, and go on a pilgrimage visit to the [Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels](#) or [Mission Basilica San Buenaventura](#), or perform corporal or spiritual works of mercy.

What is a plenary indulgence?

God never ceases to offer us his mercy. When we sin, an unhealthy attachment to earthly things remains even after the guilt of sin is forgiven. Such attachments can be purified here on earth through an indulgence or in purgatory; this purification is known as the remission of temporal punishment due to sin (Catechism of the Catholic Church 1472).

During the Jubilee, a plenary indulgence - the complete remission of temporal punishment due to sin (CCC, 1471) - in the usual form of the Church will be granted to all the faithful who are truly repentant and confess their sins, receive Holy Communion, pray for the intentions of the Holy Father, and perform one of the following:

1. a pilgrimage visit to the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels or Mission Basilica San Buenaventura to pray;
2. participation in a parish mission or study of the documents of the Second Vatican Council or the Catechism of the Catholic Church;
3. corporal or spiritual works of mercy;
4. penitential practices.

¿Qué es una peregrinación? En palabras del Papa Francisco

Peregrinar a los santuarios es una de las expresiones más elocuentes de la fe del pueblo de Dios... Sería un error pensar que quienes peregrinan viven una espiritualidad no personal, sino de masas. La realidad es que el peregrino lleva en sí su propia historia y fe, así como las luces y sombras de su vida. Cada persona lleva en su corazón un deseo especial y una oración particular. Quienes entran al santuario se sienten inmediatamente como en casa, acogidos, comprendidos y apoyados. Al contemplar el Crucifijo o una imagen de Nuestra Señora, se ofrece una oración con lágrimas en los ojos. Un santuario es verdaderamente un espacio privilegiado para encontrar al Señor y tocar físicamente su misericordia. Confesarse en un santuario es tener la experiencia de tocar físicamente la misericordia de Dios, 21 de enero de 2016.

La peregrinación cristiana se caracteriza por tres signos:

1. "El silencio [que] permite escuchar, escuchar con el corazón, y así encontrar, mientras se camina, mediante el esfuerzo, las respuestas que el corazón busca, porque el corazón se pregunta. En efecto, Dios habla en silencio, como una suave brisa..."
2. "El Evangelio: ten siempre el Evangelio en el bolsillo... La peregrinación se realiza releyendo el camino de Jesús, hasta la entrega extrema de sí mismo... Cuando leemos el Evangelio, hay alguien a nuestro lado. Es el Espíritu Santo. Es Él quien nos hace comprender bien lo que hace el Evangelio."
3. "Protocolo Mateo 25": "Todo lo que hicieron con uno de estos hermanos míos más pequeños, conmigo lo hicieron" (Mt 25,40)...haciendo el bien, también a las personas más pequeñas, a las más desfavorecidas. 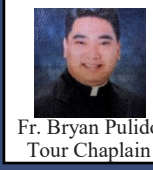

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NATIONAL Eucharistic Revival

Three years ago, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops launched the National Eucharistic Revival, the high point of which was the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis last summer. As the culmination of this three-year initiative, the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage will start in Indianapolis on May 18, 2025 and end in Los Angeles. Eight perpetual pilgrims will travel with the Blessed Sacrament across the country, logging 3,340 miles and passing through 20 dioceses.

On Friday, June 20, 2025, the pilgrimage will travel up the coast to Mission Basilica San Buenaventura and then to Sacred Heart Church in Altadena. The next day, Saturday, June 21, it will stop at St. Vincent de Paul Church and end at Mission San Gabriel. Finally, on **Sunday, June 22, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels will host the Corpus Christi Celebration, with Mass and a Eucharistic procession through downtown Los Angeles.**
