

Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles

First Reading: Acts 12:1-11
Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 34
– *The Lord delivered me from all my fears.*
Second Reading: 2 Timothy 4:6-8,17-18
Gospel: Matthew 16: 13-19

Today is the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, the two great apostles. They are also known as the two pillars of the Church. Both died in Rome on different years.

Peter and Paul represent two complementary dimensions of the Church. Peter was an apostle to the Jews and Paul was an apostle to the gentiles or non-Jews. Peter maintains the traditions while Paul represents the drive to adapt, expand and amplify the Gospel. Peter is the centripetal force pulling the Church to the center while Paul is the centrifugal force that reaches to embrace different cultures and peoples with his missionary journeys.

Both Peter and Paul had sinful pasts. It is well known that Peter denied Jesus three times on that fateful night when Jesus was brought to trial before Pilate. Paul, as we find in his letter to the Galatians (Gal 1:13), “went to extremes in persecuting the church of God and tried to destroy it.”

The Church needs both Peter and Paul. Without the centering of Peter, the Church would have been a loose collection of fragmented sects and without the expansive force of Paul, the Church would have stayed as a Jewish group in Jerusalem.

The same is true for us and much truer in regard to our spiritual lives. Peter, through the many bishops of Rome who succeeded him and his present successor, Pope Leo XIV, holds us to the center of Christianity, not only in terms of leadership in the Church but also to the core of our faith which is our relationship with Christ. With Paul, who was a missionary to the gentiles, we gather new insights and understandings of discipleship and of our Lord and even

develop new spiritual practices as the seasons of our lives change. Because of Peter and Paul, our ancient faith is not dormant but a living faith.

In today’s Gospel passage, Peter professes his faith in Jesus as “the Christ, the Son of the living God,” while others say that he is John the Baptist, Elijah, Jeremiah or one of the prophets. And Jesus even pointed out that this profession of faith by Peter was not revealed through flesh and blood but a revelation from the heavenly Father.

Jesus speaks of building his Church upon Peter, the Rock, and “the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it”. The Church that Jesus built on Peter is a community of believing disciples built on an unshakeable foundation. This means that it is the Lord who keeps on building his Church. While Peter is the foundation stone, Christ’s followers are the building stones who are in themselves the living stones of the Church.

All of us, Christ’s followers, are the living and building stones of the Church and are mere instruments of Christ in His mission to build up His Church. It is Christ who is the Builder of the Church, and we are just his servants and instruments. Thus, the need to be joined to Him as branches to the vine lest our efforts to be instruments of Christ would be in vain. Furthermore, we are called to open ourselves to God’s grace and this entails using our God-given gifts in order to build up the Christian communities.

Then, when all is said and done, we can say with St. Paul, “The time of my dissolution is near. I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith.” ❖

Cast into the Deep Do You Love Me Nelle Orsburn

As we celebrate the solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, I am reminded of the scene in the gospels when Jesus and Peter were engaged in a compelling and almost uncomfortable dialogue. For Jesus asked Simon Peter three times 'Simon, son of John, do you love me?' And while Peter answered in the affirmative, Jesus persisted in asking a second and a third time. "Peter was distressed that he had said to him a third time" Was Peter reminded that he had denied Jesus three times? With each "yes" that Peter gave, Jesus successively replied, "Feed my lambs", "Tend my sheep." and "Feed my sheep." (cf John 21:15-17)



This passage suggests multiple themes for reflection: Forgiveness and restoration — it was an opportunity for Peter to declare his love three times after having denied Jesus three times; Apostolic leadership — Not only did Jesus accept his declaration, he also commissioned Peter to take care of his flock and feed them; A call to love — And once we have openly said our yes, then God manifests himself and his will which is to love our neighbor. It is interesting to note that Jesus used the words feed and tend, as well as starting the triad with the lamb (young sheep) and going on to sheep.

Recently, at a Bible Study session, I learned that in the original Greek version of John's gospel, two different words for love were used, "*agape*" and "*phileo*." *Agape* refers to an unconditional, selfless love while *phileo* refers to friendship or brotherly love. Thus in the original Greek, the conversation went like this:

Jesus: Peter, do you love [*agape*] me? Peter: Yes, Lord I love [*phileo*] you

Therefore, it appears that in Jesus' first two questions, he is expecting a kind of love from Peter that is self-sacrificing and unconditional. However, Peter responds and is only able to give a brotherly sort of love, a friendship. By the third question, Jesus asks instead, Peter do you love [*phileo*] me?

Ideally, our love should be selfless, just as God loves us, sending his beloved Son to take the form of man to bring us back to him; just as Jesus loves us, giving up his life for our salvation. However Peter was not there yet and could only offer the love of a brother, a friend. When Jesus, the third time around, asks for a brotherly love [*phileo*], I understood that Jesus meets us where we are. Even in our struggles and failures, God does not abandon us. He is there to see us through, to take our hand and lead us as we start again.

This fills us with hope.


In 2 Corinthians, St. Paul recounted his conversation with God, begging him, '... that [the thorn in his flesh] might leave me,' But then he heard God say, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." (2 Corinthians 12:15). So, if like Peter, we can only say I love [*phileo*] you, this is the grace of God for that moment.

As we celebrate Saints Peter and Paul today, let us pray for the grace to love in a selfless and unconditional way, ready to die for our neighbor just as Christ died for us. But if we're not there yet, let us continue to love in the measure of God's grace for the moment. For His grace is enough for us.❖

Solemnidad de San Pedro y San Pablo, Apóstoles

Primera Lectura: Hechos 12, 1-11

Salmo Responsorial: Salmo 34

– *El Señor me libró de todas mis ansias.*

Segunda Lectura: 2 Timoteo 4, 6-8. 17-18

Evangelio: Mateo 16, 13-19

Hoy se celebra la solemnidad de los santos Pedro y Pablo, los dos grandes apóstoles. También se les conoce como los dos pilares de la Iglesia. Ambos fallecieron en Roma en años diferentes.

Pedro y Pablo representan dos dimensiones complementarias de la Iglesia. Pedro fue apóstol de los judíos y Pablo de los gentiles o no judíos. Pedro mantiene las tradiciones, mientras que Pablo representa el impulso para adaptar, expandir y amplificar el Evangelio. Pedro es la fuerza centrípeta que impulsa a la Iglesia hacia el centro, mientras que Pablo es la fuerza centrífuga que abarca diferentes culturas y pueblos con sus viajes misioneros.

Tanto Pedro como Pablo tuvieron un pasado pecaminoso. Todos sabemos que Pedro negó a Jesús tres veces en aquella fatídica noche en que Jesús fue llevado a juicio ante Pilato. Pablo, como leemos en su carta a los Gálatas (Gal 1,13), “llegó a los extremos persiguiendo a la iglesia de Dios y tratando de destruirla”.

La Iglesia necesita tanto a Pedro como a Pablo. Sin el liderazgo de Pedro, la Iglesia habría sido un conjunto disperso de sectas fragmentadas, y sin la fuerza expansiva de Pablo, la Iglesia se habría mantenido como un grupo judío en Jerusalén.


Lo mismo es cierto para nosotros, y mucho más cierto en lo que respecta a nuestra vida espiritual. Pedro, a través de los numerosos obispos de Roma que lo sucedieron y de su actual sucesor, el papa León XIV, nos mantiene en el centro del cristianismo, no solo en términos de liderazgo en la Iglesia, sino también en la esencia de nuestra fe, que es nuestra relación con Cristo. Con Pablo, quien fue misionero entre los gentiles, adquirimos nuevas perspectivas y entendimientos del discipulado y de nuestro Señor, e incluso desarrollamos nuevas prácticas espirituales a medida que cambian las etapas de nuestra vida. Gracias a Pedro y Pablo, nuestra antigua fe no es una fe inactiva, sino viva.

En el pasaje del Evangelio de hoy, Pedro profesa su fe en Jesús como “el Mesías, el Hijo de Dios vivo”, mientras que otros dicen que es Juan el Bautista, Elías, Jeremías o uno de los profetas. Jesús incluso señaló que esta profesión de fe de Pedro no fue revelada mediante carne y sangre, sino una revelación del Padre celestial.

Jesús habla de edificar su Iglesia sobre Pedro, la Roca, y “los poderes del infierno no prevalecerán sobre ella”. La Iglesia que Jesús edificó sobre Pedro es una comunidad de discípulos creyentes, cimentada sobre un fundamento inquebrantable. Esto significa que es el Señor quien sigue edificando su Iglesia. Si bien Pedro es la piedra fundamental, los seguidores de Cristo son las piedras de edificación, siendo en sí mismos las piedras vivas de la Iglesia.

Todos nosotros, los seguidores de Cristo, somos las piedras vivas y edificadoras de la Iglesia, y meros instrumentos de Cristo en su misión de edificarla. Es Cristo quien edifica la Iglesia, y nosotros somos solo sus siervos e instrumentos. De ahí la necesidad de unirnos a Él como sarmientos a la vid, para que nuestros esfuerzos por ser instrumentos de Cristo no sean en vano. Además, estamos llamados a abrirnos a la gracia de Dios, lo que implica usar los dones que Dios nos ha dado para edificar las comunidades cristianas.

Entonces, cuando todo esté dicho y hecho, podremos decir con San Pablo: “Se acerca el momento de mi partida. He luchado bien en el combate, he corrido hasta la meta, he perseverado en la fe”. ❖



Pescando en lo Profundo

¿Me Amas?

Al celebrar la solemnidad de los santos Pedro y Pablo, recuerdo la escena de los evangelios en la que Jesús y Pedro entablaron un diálogo apasionante y casi incómodo. Jesús le preguntó tres veces a Simón Pedro: “Simón, hijo de Juan, ¿me amas?”. Y aunque Pedro respondió afirmativamente, Jesús insistió en preguntar una segunda y una tercera vez. “Pedro se entristeció de que le preguntara por tercera vez”. ¿Recordó Pedro que había negado a Jesús tres veces? A cada “sí” que Pedro daba, Jesús respondía sucesivamente: “Apacienta mis corderos”, “Apacienta mis ovejas” y “Apacienta mis ovejas” (cf. Juan 21,15-17).



Este pasaje sugiere múltiples temas de reflexión: Perdón y restauración – Pedro tuvo la oportunidad de declarar su amor tres veces después de haber negado a Jesús tres veces;

Liderazgo apostólico – Jesús no solo aceptó su declaración, sino que también le encargó cuidar de su rebaño y alimentarlo; Un llamado al amor – Una vez que hemos dicho abiertamente nuestro sí, Dios se manifiesta y manifiesta su voluntad de amar al prójimo. Es interesante notar que Jesús usó las palabras apacienta y cuidar, además de comenzar la tríada con el cordero (oveja joven) y continuar con las ovejas.

Recientemente, en una sesión de estudio bíblico, aprendí que en la versión griega original del Evangelio de Juan se usaban dos palabras diferentes para amor: “*ágape*” y “*phileo*”. *Ágape* se refiere a un amor incondicional y desinteresado, mientras que *phileo* se refiere a la amistad o el amor fraternal. Por lo tanto, en el griego original, la conversación fue así:

Jesús: Pedro, ¿me amas [*ágape*]? Pedro: Sí, Señor, te amo [*phileo*]

Por lo tanto, parece que, en las dos primeras preguntas de Jesús, esperaba de Pedro un amor abnegado e incondicional. Sin embargo, Pedro responde y solo puede ofrecer un amor fraternal, una amistad. En la tercera pregunta, Jesús pregunta: Pedro, ¿me amas [*phileo*]?

Idealmente, nuestro amor debería ser desinteresado, como Dios nos ama, enviando a su Hijo amado a tomar la forma humana para traernos de vuelta a él; como Jesús nos ama, entregando su vida por nuestra salvación. Sin embargo, Pedro aún no estaba allí y solo podía ofrecer el amor de un hermano, un amigo. Cuando Jesús, por tercera vez, me pide un amor fraternal [*phileo*], comprendí que Jesús nos encuentra donde estamos. Incluso en nuestras luchas y fracasos, Dios no nos abandona. Él está ahí para ayudarnos, para tomarnos de la mano y guiarnos en nuestro nuevo comienzo.

Esto nos llena de esperanza.

En 2 Corintios, San Pablo relató su conversación con Dios, rogándole: “...que me librara de [la espina en su carne]”. Pero entonces escuchó a Dios decir: “Te basta mi gracia, pues mi poder se perfecciona en la debilidad” (2 Corintios 12:15). Así que, si como Pedro, solo podemos decir “te amo [*phileo*]”, esta es la gracia de Dios para ese momento.

Al celebrar hoy a los santos Pedro y Pablo, oremos por la gracia de amar de forma desinteresada e incondicional, dispuestos a morir por el prójimo como Cristo murió por nosotros. Pero si aún no hemos llegado a ese punto, sigamos amando en la medida de la gracia de Dios por el momento. Porque su gracia nos basta. STATEMENT ON IMMIGRATION ISSUES BY ARCHBISHOP JOSÉ H. GOMEZ

What is a Pilgrimage In the Words of Pope Francis

“Making a Pilgrimage to shrines is one of the most eloquent expressions of the faith of God’s people... It would be a mistake to think that those who go on a pilgrimage live a spirituality that is not personal but rather of the masses. The reality is that the pilgrim carries within him his own history and faith and the lights and shadows of his own life. Each person carries within his or her heart a special wish and a particular prayer. Those who enter the shrine immediately feel they are at home, welcomed, understood, and supported. Gazing upon the Crucifix or a image of Our Lady, a prayer is offered with tears in their eyes, brimming with faith. A shrine is truly a privileged space to meet the Lord and physically touch his mercy. To confess in a shrine is to have the experience of physically touching the mercy of God ” ~ To those engaged in Pilgrimage Work, January 21, 2016

The Christian Pilgrimage is characterized by three signs:

1. “silence [which] allows one to listen, to listen with the heart, and in this way to find, while one walks, through the effort, the answers that the heart is looking for, because the heart asks questions. Indeed, God speaks in silence, like a gentle breeze...”
2. “the Gospel – always have the Gospel in your pocket ...The pilgrimage is made by re-reading the journey that Jesus took, up to the extreme gift of Self. ... when one reads the Gospel, there is someone beside us. It is the Holy Spirit. It is He who makes us understand well what the Gospel does. “
3. “Matthew 25 Protocol”: “Whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me” (Mt 25:40)...doing good, to people who also smaller, the most disadvantaged people. Always do good. Along the way, be attentive to others, especially those who struggle the most, who have fallen, who are in need...” To the Italian pilgrims of the The Way of St James, December 19, 2024.

Throughout this Holy Year, a plenary Indulgence in the usual form of the Church will be granted to all the faithful who are truly repentant and detached from any sin and confess their sins sacramentally, receive Holy Communion, pray for the intentions of the Holy Father, and go on a pilgrimage visit to the [Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels](#) or [Mission Basilica San Buenaventura](#), or perform corporal or spiritual works of mercy.

What is a plenary indulgence?

God never ceases to offer us his mercy. When we sin, an unhealthy attachment to earthly things remains even after the guilt of sin is forgiven. Such attachments can be purified here on earth through an indulgence or in purgatory; this purification is known as the remission of temporal punishment due to sin (Catechism of the Catholic Church 1472).

During the Jubilee, a plenary indulgence - the complete remission of temporal punishment due to sin (CCC,1471) - in the usual form of the Church will be granted to all the faithful who are truly repentant and confess their sins, receive Holy Communion, pray for the intentions of the Holy Father, and perform one of the following:

1. a pilgrimage visit to the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels or Mission Basilica San Buenaventura to pray;
2. participation in a parish mission or study of the documents of the Second Vatican Council or the Catechism of the Catholic Church;
3. corporal or spiritual works of mercy;
4. penitential practices.

¿Qué es una peregrinación? En palabras del Papa Francisco

Peregrinar a los santuarios es una de las expresiones más elocuentes de la fe del pueblo de Dios... Sería un error pensar que quienes peregrinan viven una espiritualidad no personal, sino de masas. La realidad es que el peregrino lleva en sí su propia historia y fe, así como las luces y sombras de su vida. Cada persona lleva en su corazón un deseo especial y una oración particular. Quienes entran al santuario se sienten inmediatamente como en casa, acogidos, comprendidos y apoyados. Al contemplar el Crucifijo o una imagen de Nuestra Señora, se ofrece una oración con lágrimas en los ojos. Un santuario es verdaderamente un espacio privilegiado para encontrar al Señor y tocar físicamente su misericordia. Confesarse en un santuario es tener la experiencia de tocar físicamente la misericordia de Dios, 21 de enero de 2016.

La peregrinación cristiana se caracteriza por tres signos:

1. "El silencio [que] permite escuchar, escuchar con el corazón, y así encontrar, mientras se camina, mediante el esfuerzo, las respuestas que el corazón busca, porque el corazón se pregunta. En efecto, Dios habla en silencio, como una suave brisa..."




