Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Genesis 18:20-32

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 138

—Lord, on the day I called for help you answered me.

Second Reading: Colossians 2:12-14

Gospel: Luke 11:1-13

Prayer is a natural and spontaneous thing. We pray for anything and everything. Perhaps even atheists find themselves praying at one time or another.

There are many kinds of prayer, Hindu prayer, Buddhist prayer, Muslims prayer and many others. There is also the Jewish prayer that the disciples of Jesus knew, and the law taught them exactly how to pray. But they saw in Jesus something different.

Jesus' kind of prayer was more intense, more powerful, and more personal. They felt it and so they asked Jesus to teach them how to pray as He did.

The Lord said, "When you pray, say: "Father, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come. Give us each day our daily bread and forgive us our sins for we ourselves forgive everyone in debt to us, and do not subject us to the final test."

It is itself a short and powerful prayer and has become a model of all Christian prayers; other words may be used but the format is patterned after the Lord's prayer. It is also a prayer of unity, the one prayer that all Christians around the world have in common.

A great deal can be said about the Lord's Prayer because it is both a prayer and a school of prayer. We can reflect on the intimacy, the surrender, and the trust it conveys. There is, first of all, the intimacy. Jesus says that when we pray, we should address God as "Father".

As Christian, we have a special relationship with the Father through His Son. We can speak to the Father or "Abba" with all the familiarity it implies. God is also Father of us all.

In today's second reading, St Paul teaches us that we can speak to the Father as Jesus did because we share the very life of Jesus through Baptism. We become what Jesus was by nature. Our baptism has endowed us

with a new, powerful relationship with the Father that no one else in creation has. We have the dignity of being able to call ourselves children of God and being able to turn to God as our Father who will always answer when we call for help.

Secondly, the Lord's Prayer teaches us surrender. It acknowledges that God's name must be hallowed, His kingdom has priority and Mathew's Gospel adds that His will be done. We trust and give ourselves to the care and providence of the Father. We might not fully understand what is happening in our life or why, but we trust that God is always present. And ultimately His will is our peace.

Finally, the Lord's Prayer concludes with the series of petitions through which we present all our needs to the Father. Our prayer should come from the heart, from our real self. The Lord's Prayer teaches us to trust God with the truth about ourselves.

Through a parable, Jesus exhorts us to be persistent and to approach the Father with humility asking Him for what we need. God's way of giving exceeds that of human friends or that of human parents. And the Father will give us His very Spirit, a gift of joy, a gift we could never have earned but is freely given to those who are baptized into the humility of His Son. Thus, God shows that He is not only just, but He is infinitely merciful, coming to meet us in our needs.

We see these elements of intimacy, surrender and trust in the way Abraham prays in today's first reading as he intercedes for the city of Sodom. Our reading offers us an opportunity to relearn how to pray as Jesus did.

Are we hallowing God's name? Are we working for God's kingdom? Do we really want God to forgive us as we forgive others? It is a magnificent gift of Christ to each of us. Doctrine shapes the Catholic mind. The Lord's Prayer shapes the Catholic soul. ♦

Cast into the Deep

Give Us This Day Our Daily Bread

In the communal recitation of the Lord's Prayer, a prayer leader usually starts off, then the congregation joins in, "Give us this day our daily bread...." It appears that the focus shifts from Our Father — thy name, thy Kingdom, thy Will—to our own needs — give us, forgive us, lead us not, deliver us. Responding communally seems to emphasize that shift. However, when we take a closer look at these phrases of the prayer, we realize that there is no shift in focus because our gaze is always on God, our Father. In the second half of the prayer, we are acknowledging, affirming and praying for the grace to be completely dependent on him.

In Matthew's gospel, Jesus says, "Amen, I say to you, unless you turn and become like children, you will not enter the kingdom of heaven." (18:3) The scripture note points out that children are not held up as models because of their innocence but because of their complete dependence on their parents. We, too, therefore in order to enter the kingdom of heaven should be completely dependent on God, our Father. In another passage, Jesus says, "Let the children come to me, and do not prevent them; for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these." (19:14) Jesus is inviting us to come to him, to depend on him for our daily bread.

Give us this day our daily bread. Of course, daily bread in this petition does not mean just food and nourishment. It means all our daily needs. We look to God for all our daily needs. Do we have a decision to make? Ask him for the wisdom and inspiration of the Holy Spirit in our discerning. Are we tired? In pain? Ask Jesus to ease the tiredness or the pain and show us how to bear it in the meantime just as he endured all out of love for us. Did you misplace something? Do you need a parking spot? Are you anticipating a difficult conversation? Can't remember the name of the person talking to you? Taking a test? From the mundane to the sublime, the list goes on. In all our waking moments, we place our lives in the palm of his hands, trusting always in his perfect love. Jesus help me ... be with me... what do i do now... what would you do... please fix it ... if you wish. Indeed, even in our sleeping, we ask God to watch over us.

Give us this day our daily bread. It's interesting that the prayer does not say, Give us today our weekly bread, or our monthly bread. I think it means that we should seek and keep only what we need. It is easy to form attachments to material goods, to ideas, to relationships. So we pray for the grace to recognize what is extraneous and have the courage to detach ourselves from what is not the Divine plan. I once heard a speaker at a retreat say that we should be like the flower in the field that only takes from the earth what it needs to sustain itself.

Another passage in Matthew's gospel comes to mind where Jesus says, "Do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink... what you will wear. The birds in the sky neither sow nor reap and yet God feeds them. Are you not more important than them?... You heavenly Father knows what you need. But seek first the Kingdom of God and his righteousness and all these things will be given you besides." (cf 6: 25-26, 32-33) I think that is key... Seek first the kingdom of God, i.e., let us resolve and endeavor to do only His Holy Will just as an earlier petition in the Prayer says, "Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven."

Sometimes we may get frustrated when do not get the "daily bread" we prayed for; or even if we resolved to love a neighbor because Jesus asked us to love our neighbors only to fail in the doing. We are in good company. St. Paul in his Second Letter to the Corinthians, speaks about a thorn in his flesh that he had asked God three times to remove (cf 12:7-8) and the response he received, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." (12:9) St. Paul then says that for the sake of Christ, he is content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and constraints, "for when I am weak, then I am strong."(12:10)

Give us this day our daily bread. Sustain us with what we need in each moment of our day so that all we do may be according to Your holy will. And for whatever we may be facing today, Your grace is enough.❖

Archbishop Gomez comments on the protests around Los Angeles

XVII Domingo Del Tiempo Ordinario**Primera Lectura:** Génesis 18, 20-32**Salmo Responsorial:** Salmo 138

— Señor, te damos gracias de todo corazón.

Segunda Lectura: Colosenses 2, 12-14**Evangelio:** San Lucas 11, 1-13

La oración es una cosa espontánea y natural. Oramos por cualquier cosa y por todo. Quizás incluso los ateos se encuentran orando en un momento u otro.

Hay muchos tipos de oración, oración Hindú, oración Budista, oración Musulmana y otras muchas. También está la oración judía, que los discípulos de Jesús conocían, y la ley les enseñó exactamente cómo orar. Pero vieron en Jesús algo diferente. El tipo de oración de Jesús era más intenso, más poderoso y más personal. Ellos lo sintieron y le pidieron a Jesús que les enseñara a orar como Él lo hacía.

Entonces el Señor dijo: “Padre, santificado sea tu nombre, venga tu Reino. Danos hoy nuestro pan de cada día y perdona nuestras ofensas, puesto que también nosotros perdonamos a todo aquel que nos ofende, y no nos dejes caer en tentación”.

Es en sí misma una oración corta y poderosa y se ha convertido modelo de todas las oraciones cristianas; se pueden usar otras palabras, pero el formato sigue el modelo de la oración del Señor. También es una oración de unidad, la única oración que todos los cristianos del mundo tienen en común.

Se puede decir mucho sobre el Padrenuestro porque es tanto una oración como una escuela de oración. Podemos reflexionar sobre la intimidad, la entrega y la confianza que transmite.

Está, ante todo, la intimidad. Jesús dice que cuando oremos, debemos dirigirnos a Dios como “Padre”. Como cristianos, tenemos una relación especial con el Padre a través de su hijo. Podemos hablar al Padre o “Abba” con toda la familiaridad que ello implica. Dios también es Padre de todos nosotros.

En la segunda lectura de hoy, San Pablo nos enseña que podemos hablar al Padre como lo hizo Jesús porque compartimos la vida misma de Jesús a través del Bautismo. Llegamos a ser lo que Jesús fue por naturaleza. Nuestro Bautismo nos ha dotado de una nueva y poderosa relación con el Padre que nadie más en la creación tiene. Tenemos la dignidad de poder llamarnos hijos de Dios y poder volvemos a Dios como nuestro Padre que siempre responderá cuando clamemos por ayuda.

En segundo lugar, el Padrenuestro nos enseña a rendirnos. Reconoce que el nombre de Dios debe ser santificado, su Reino tiene prioridad y el evangelio de Mateo añade que su voluntad se cumplirá. Confiamos y nos entregamos al cuidado y providencia del Padre. Es posible que no entendamos completamente lo que está sucediendo en nuestra vida o por qué, pero confiamos en que Dios siempre está presente. Y finalmente su voluntad es nuestra paz.

Finalmente, el Padrenuestro concluye con una serie de peticiones a través de las cuales presentamos todas nuestras necesidades al Padre. Nuestra oración debe venir del corazón, de nuestro ser real. El Padrenuestro nos enseña a confiarle a Dios la verdad sobre nosotros mismos.

A través de una parábola, Jesús nos exhorta a ser persistentes y a acercarnos al Padre con humildad para pedirle lo que necesitamos. La manera de dar de Dios excede la de los amigos humanos o la de los padres humanos. Y el Padre nos dará su mismo Espíritu, un regalo de alegría, un regalo que nunca podríamos haber ganado pero que se da gratuitamente a aquellos que son bautizados en la humildad de su Hijo. Así, Dios muestra que no sólo es justo, sino que es infinitamente misericordioso, viniendo a nuestro encuentro en nuestras necesidades.

Vemos estos elementos de intimidad, entrega y confianza en la forma en que Abraham ora en la primera lectura de hoy mientras intercede por la ciudad de Sodoma.

Nuestras lecturas nos ofrecen una oportunidad de volver a aprender a orar como lo hizo Jesús. ¿Estamos santificando el nombre de Dios? ¿Estamos trabajando para el Reino de Dios? ¿Realmente queremos que Dios nos perdone como nosotros perdonamos a los demás?

Es un don magnífico de Cristo para cada uno de nosotros. La doctrina da forma a la mente católica. El Padrenuestro moldea el alma católica.♦



Pescando en lo Profundo

Danos Hoy Nuestro Pan De Cada Día

En la recitación comunitaria del Padrenuestro, generalmente un líder de oración comienza, luego la congregación se une: "Danos hoy nuestro pan de cada día...". Parece que el enfoque cambia de Nuestro Padre – tu nombre, tu Reino, tu Voluntad – a nuestras propias necesidades – danos, perdónanos, no nos dejes caer, libranos. Responder comunitariamente parece enfatizar ese cambio. Sin embargo, cuando miramos más de cerca estas frases de la oración, nos damos cuenta de que no hay un cambio de enfoque porque nuestra mirada está siempre en Dios, nuestro Padre. En la segunda mitad de la oración, reconocemos, afirmamos y oramos por la gracia de depender completamente de él.

En el evangelio de Mateo, Jesús dice: "Les aseguro que si ustedes no cambian o no se hacen como niños, no entrarán en el Reino de los Cielos". (18, 3) La observación de las Escrituras señala que los niños no son considerados como modelos por su inocencia sino por su total dependencia en sus padres. Por lo tanto, también nosotros, para entrar en el reino de los cielos, debemos depender completamente de Dios, nuestro Padre. En otro pasaje, Jesús dice: "Dejen que los niños se acerquen a mí y no se lo impidan, porque el Reino de Dios es de los que son como ellos". (19, 14) Jesús nos invita a venir a él, a depender de él para nuestro pan de cada día.

Danos hoy nuestro pan de cada día. Por supuesto, el pan de cada día en esta petición no significa sólo alimento y sustento. Significa todas nuestras necesidades diarias. Buscamos a Dios para todas nuestras necesidades diarias. ¿Tenemos una decisión que tomar? Podemos pedir la sabiduría y la inspiración del Espíritu Santo en nuestro discernimiento. ¿Estamos cansados? ¿Con dolor? Pídele a Jesús que alivie el cansancio o el dolor y muéstranos cómo soportarlo mientras tanto, así como él soportó todo por amor a nosotros. ¿Perdiste algo? ¿Necesitas un espacio en el estacionamiento? ¿Estás anticipando una conversación difícil? ¿No recuerdas el nombre de la persona que te habla? ¿Necesitar tomar una prueba? De lo mundano a lo sublime, la lista continúa. En todos nuestros momentos del día, ponemos nuestra vida en la palma de sus manos, confiando siempre en su amor perfecto. Jesús, ayúdame... quédate conmigo... qué hago ahora... qué harías tú... por favor arréglalo... si lo deseas. De hecho, incluso mientras dormimos, le pedimos a Dios que cuide de nosotros.

Danos hoy nuestro pan de cada día. Es interesante que la oración no dice: Danos hoy nuestro pan semanal, o nuestro pan mensual. Creo que significa que debemos buscar y conservar sólo lo que necesitamos. Es fácil formar apegos a los bienes materiales, a las ideas, a las relaciones. Por eso oramos por la gracia de reconocer lo que es irrelevante y tener el coraje de desprendernos de lo que no es el plan Divino. Una vez escuché a un orador en un retiro decir que deberíamos ser como la flor del campo que sólo toma de la tierra lo que necesita para sustentarse.

Me viene a la mente otro pasaje del evangelio de Mateo donde Jesús dice: "No te preocupes por tu vida, qué comerás o beberás... qué vestirás. Los pájaros del cielo no siembran ni cosechan y, sin embargo, Dios los alimenta. ¿No eres tú más importante que ellos? ...Tu Padre celestial sabe lo que necesitas. Pero busca primero el Reino de Dios y su justicia y todas estas cosas te serán dadas por añadidura". (cf. 6: 25-26, 32-33) Creo que esa es la clave... Busquemos primero el reino de Dios, es decir, resolvamos y esforcémonos por hacer sólo su Santa Voluntad tal como una petición anterior en la Oración dice: "Hágase tu voluntad en la tierra como en el cielo".

A veces podemos sentirnos frustrados cuando no recibimos el "pan de cada día" por el que oramos; o incluso si decidimos amar al prójimo porque Jesús nos pidió que amáramos a nuestro prójimo sólo para fracasar en hacerlo. Estamos en buena compañía. San Pablo en su Segunda Carta a los Corintios, habla de un agujón en su carne que había pedido tres veces a Dios que le quitara (cf. 12, 7-8) y la respuesta que recibió: "Te basta mi gracia, porque mi poder triunfa en la debilidad". (12, 9) San Pablo luego dice que por amor a Cristo, se contenta con las debilidades, los insultos, las privaciones, las persecuciones y las angustias, "porque cuando soy débil, entonces soy fuerte" (12, 10).

Danos hoy nuestro pan de cada día. Sostennos con lo que necesitamos en cada momento de nuestro día para que todo lo que hagamos sea conforme a tu santa voluntad. Y para cualquier cosa que estemos enfrentando hoy, tu gracia es suficiente. ♦

What is a Pilgrimage In the Words of Pope Francis

"Making a Pilgrimage to shrines is one of the most eloquent expressions of the faith of God's people... It would be a mistake to think that those who go on a pilgrimage live a spirituality that is not personal but rather of the masses. The reality is that the pilgrim carries within him his own history and faith and the lights and shadows of his own life. Each person carries within his or her heart a special wish and a particular prayer. Those who enter the shrine immediately feel they are at home, welcomed, understood, and supported. Gazing upon the Crucifix or a image of Our Lady, a prayer is offered with tears in their eyes, brimming with faith. A shrine is truly a privileged space to meet the Lord and physically touch his mercy. To confess in a shrine is to have the experience of physically touching the mercy of God " ~ To those engaged in Pilgrimage Work, January 21, 2016

The Christian Pilgrimage is characterized by three signs:

1. "silence [which] allows one to listen, to listen with the heart, and in this way to find, while one walks, through the effort, the answers that the heart is looking for, because the heart asks questions. Indeed, God speaks in silence, like a gentle breeze..."
2. "the Gospel – always have the Gospel in your pocket ...The pilgrimage is made by re-reading the journey that Jesus took, up to the extreme gift of Self. ... when one reads the Gospel, there is someone beside us. It is the Holy Spirit. It is He who makes us understand well what the Gospel does."
3. "Matthew 25 Protocol": "Whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me" (Mt 25:40)...doing good, to people who also smaller, the most disadvantaged people. Always do good. Along the way, be attentive to others, especially those who struggle the most, who have fallen, who are in need..." Throughout this Holy Year, a plenary Indulgence in the usual form of the Church will be granted to all the faithful who are truly repentant and detached from any sin and confess their sins sacramentally, receive Holy Communion, pray for the intentions of the Holy Father, and go on a pilgrimage visit to the [Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels](#) or [Mission Basilica San Buenaventura](#), or perform corporal or spiritual works of mercy.

What is a plenary indulgence?

God never ceases to offer us his mercy. When we sin, an unhealthy attachment to earthly things remains even after the guilt of sin is forgiven. Such attachments can be purified here on earth through an indulgence or in purgatory; this purification is known as the remission of temporal punishment due to sin (Catechism of the Catholic Church 1472).

During the Jubilee, a plenary indulgence - the complete remission of temporal punishment due to sin (CCC,1471) - in the usual form of the Church will be granted to all the faithful who are truly repentant and confess their sins, receive Holy Communion, pray for the intentions of the Holy Father, and perform one of the following:

1. a pilgrimage visit to the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels or Mission Basilica San Buenaventura to pray;
2. participation in a parish mission or study of the documents of the Second Vatican Council or the Catechism of the Catholic Church;
3. corporal or spiritual works of mercy;
4. penitential practices.

¿Qué es una peregrinación? En palabras del Papa Francisco

Peregrinar a los santuarios es una de las expresiones más elocuentes de la fe del pueblo de Dios... Sería un error pensar que quienes peregrinan viven una espiritualidad no personal, sino de masas. La realidad es que el peregrino lleva en sí su propia historia y fe, así como las luces y sombras de su vida. Cada persona lleva en su corazón un deseo especial y una oración particular. Quienes entran al santuario se sienten inmediatamente como en casa, acogidos, comprendidos y apoyados. Al contemplar el Crucifijo o una imagen de Nuestra Señora, se ofrece una oración con lágrimas en los ojos. Un santuario es verdaderamente un espacio privilegiado para encontrar al Señor y tocar físicamente su misericordia. Confesarse en un santuario es tener la experiencia de tocar físicamente la misericordia de Dios, 21 de enero de 2016.

La peregrinación cristiana se caracteriza por tres signos:

1. "El silencio [que] permite escuchar, escuchar con el corazón, y así encontrar, mientras se camina, mediante el esfuerzo, las respuestas que el corazón busca, porque el corazón se pregunta. En efecto, Dios habla en silencio, como una suave brisa..."







This month, we celebrate one of the Church's greatest saints and the first witness to the Resurrection: Saint Mary Magdalene. Once burdened by sin, she encountered Jesus and followed Him faithfully, even to the foot of the Cross. But her story didn't end in sorrow. Mary Magdalene was the first to see the Risen Christ, and she ran to the apostles to share the Good News with joy.

In this Jubilee Year of Hope, we're invited to rediscover that same joy, rooted in the transforming power of Christ alive.

How to Live Out Joy Like Mary Magdalene This Summer

- Be in community. Mary Magdalene didn't walk alone in her Christian faith; she stayed close to Jesus and those He loved, walking where they walked. Joy grows when we journey together.
- Stay present, even when it's hard. Mary stood at the foot of the Cross when most had fled. True joy endures with hope and stays with those who suffer, like the elderly and ill.

A cyberattack every 36 seconds

The University of Maryland found that there is an average of 2,244 cyberattacks per day, which is one every 36 seconds.

43% of SMB lack a cybersecurity defense plan

The International Criminal Police Organization (Interpol) reported that small- and medium-sized businesses (SMB) are being targeted at an increased rate.

\$108 Million lost in only 6-months

The US Federal Trade Commission, in a recent 6-month period, had seen over 128,000 phone-based fraud scams that cost victims a whopping \$108 Million – that's only half a year!

Staying Safe Starts with YOU!


We often assume cybercrime only happens to someone else but hackers know the easiest way to get to your organization's information is through **YOU!**

Here are some actions to stay safe.

- Be careful what you post and share online.
- Don't reuse passwords for multiple sites.
- Follow your organization's security policies and procedures.
- If something seems suspicious, always verify that it's legitimate.

In the time it took you to read this document, there were multiple cyberattacks across the globe. Make sure you stop, look, and think before you take any sort of action.

Estas son algunas medidas para mantenerse seguro:

- No use las mismas contraseñas para diferentes sitios.
- Respete las políticas y los procedimientos de seguridad de su organización.
- Si algo parece sospechoso, siempre verifique que sea legítimo.

En el tiempo que leyó este documento, hubo varios ciberataques en todo el mundo. Asegúrese de detenerse, observar y pensar antes de actuar.

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
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
