Twenty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading:

Sirach 3:17-18.20.28-29

Responsorial Psalm:

Psalm 68

– *God, in your goodness, you have made a home for the poor.*

Second Reading:

Hebrews 12:18-19.22-24a

Gospel:

Luke 14:2.7-14

We are in the 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time. The spiritual journey in Ordinary Time is a journey of discovery as we focus on Christ's life and teachings.

The passage from Sirach in the first reading shows the value of humility in Jewish teachings. It teaches that true humility is about knowing our place before God. Sirach's wisdom is still relevant today, especially in understanding humility. It teaches that humility is essential for spiritual growth. It's about our relationship with God and others.

The second reading from the Letter to the Hebrews deeply explores the nature of Christ and the Church. It was written to a community facing hard times, urging them to stay strong in their faith. The Christian community belongs to the new covenant in Christ. This community believes in Jesus Christ and joins the heavenly Jerusalem. The author encourages believers to approach God confidently, thanks to Jesus' sacrifice. In practical terms, this means the Church should show the values of the heavenly Jerusalem. These values include love, compassion, and humility.

Humility does not get good publicity these days. In a world of power, prestige and privilege, where the fittest survive and those who push themselves forward succeed, humility does not rate highly. In our times, humility is often associated with weakness and a poor self-image. Even in Jesus' time, where a person sat in an assembly or table was important. We may not be as conscious of that today but, probably, not any humbler than the people of Jesus' time. We live in a world where "status" is key and "rank" defines

worth. Frequently, then, quality suffers in the race to achieve success.

Jesus told the people of his time, "When you are invited by someone to a wedding party, do not recline at table in the place of honor. A more distinguished guest than you may have been invited by him, and the host who invited both of you may approach you and say, 'Give your place to this man,' and then you would proceed with embarrassment to take the lowest place." He warns the people against all forms of pride and self-glorification. Pride is a road going nowhere.

Jesus' teaching on humility comes when he tells us about inviting the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind who cannot repay you, "not your friends or your brothers, or your relatives or your wealthy neighbors."

"Who are the poor, the crippled, the lame and the blind," we ask ourselves. The answer: They are those who did something wrong in their lives. They also stand for those who are walking without the light of the gospel and therefore stumble, fall, and hurt themselves and others with them. They may also stand for those who lead irregular lives, who perhaps have been in prison, or people who may have had their marriage broken up, men and women who pass from error to error.

They are to be loved because Jesus has shown us that it is wonderful to be able to love like God, without expecting anything in return. When we are able to love without strings attached, we become like the Father in heaven as we experience His joy. And as Jesus has promised, "You will have a great reward, and you will be children of the Most High." ❖

Thus, tantamount to the mission and life of the Parish is the support she gives to the School by providing spiritual, human and financial resources to keep the doors of the School open and sustain itself as a Catholic Educational Institution. Similarly, Our Lady of Lourdes School provides an avenue for our children to receive Catholic Education which is a great investment for their future. Thus, poverty should not be a hindrance to Catholic Education in Our Lady of Lourdes School. Various options on how to pay for your child's education in a Catholic School in an affordable manner are laid out by this School's administration.



As a Catholic School, Our Lady of Lourdes is guided and driven by a clearly communicated mission that embraces a Catholic identity rooted in Gospel values, centered on the Eucharist and committed to faith formation, academic excellence and service. While perceptions may have changed with many bringing their children to Catholic Schools due to their high academic prospects, our mission remains: to provide **a rigorous academic program for religious studies and catechesis in the Catholic faith, set within a total academic curriculum that integrates faith, culture and life** (emphasis provided). Catholic doctrines especially on faith and morals are not seen as separate subjects to be taught and learned but are within the academic curriculum of Catholic Education. Thus, the role of the staff, faculty and administration of our school at Our Lady of Lourdes is more of a ministry that protects and promotes everyone's sense of right and responsibility by providing an environment for the teaching of doctrine and Sacred Scripture, the building and experiencing of community, the serving of others, and the opportunity for worship.

These do not happen just inside the classroom. In fact, it is our task and mission to provide opportunities outside the classroom, as well, for student faith formation, participation in liturgical and communal prayer and action in the service of mercy and charity.

We affirm the message of the Pontifical Congregation on Catholic Education, viz., that the intellectual development of the person and his/her growth as a Christian go forward hand in hand with each other. Rooted in the mission of the Church, Our Lady of Lourdes School strives to bring faith, culture and life together and in harmony with each other. In 2005, the bishops noted that "young people of the third millennium must be a source of energy and leadership in our Church and in our nation. And therefore, we must provide young people with an academically rigorous and doctrinally sound program of education" (Renewing Our Commitment to Catholic Elementary and Secondary School in the Third Millennium, 2005).

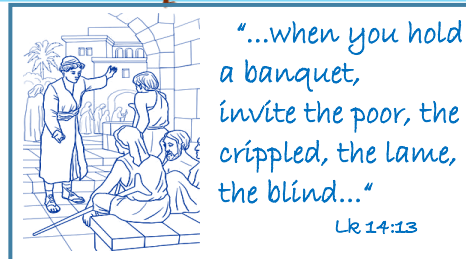

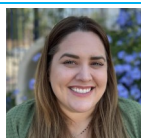

Archbishop Gomez comments on the protests around Los Angeles

"I am troubled by today's immigration enforcement raids in Los Angeles, and I am praying for our community," Archbishop Gomez said in a statement. "I pray tonight that everyone involved will exercise restraint and calm. "We all agree that we don't want undocumented immigrants who are known terrorists or violent criminals in our communities. But there is no need for the government to carry out enforcement actions in a way that provokes fear and anxiety among ordinary, hard-working immigrants and their families."

XXII Domingo Del Tiempo Ordinario**Primera Lectura: Eclesiástico (Sirácides) 3, 17-18. 20. 28-29****Salmo Responsorial: Salmo 68***– Has preparado, Señor, tu casa a los desvalidos***Segunda Lectura: Hebreos 12, 18-19. 22-24a****Evangelio: Lucas 14, 1. 7-14**

Estamos en el Vigésimo Segundo Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. El camino espiritual del Tiempo Ordinario es un viaje de descubrimiento que nos centra en la vida y las enseñanzas de Cristo.

El pasaje del Sirácide en la primera lectura muestra el valor de la humildad en las enseñanzas judías. Enseña que la verdadera humildad consiste en reconocer nuestro lugar ante Dios. La sabiduría del Sirácide sigue vigente hoy en día, especialmente para comprender la humildad. Enseña que la humildad es esencial para el crecimiento espiritual. Se trata de nuestra relación con Dios y con los demás.

La segunda lectura de la Carta a los Hebreos explora profundamente la naturaleza de Cristo y la Iglesia. Fue escrita a una comunidad que atravesaba momentos difíciles, instándola a mantenerse firme en su fe. La comunidad cristiana pertenece a la nueva alianza en Cristo. Esta comunidad cree en Jesucristo y se une a la Jerusalén celestial. El autor anima a los creyentes a acercarse a Dios con confianza, gracias al sacrificio de Jesús. En la práctica, esto significa que la Iglesia debe mostrar los valores de la Jerusalén celestial. Estos valores incluyen el amor, la compasión y la humildad.



La humildad no es muy popular hoy en día. En un mundo donde brilla el poder, el prestigio y el privilegio, donde los más aptos sobreviven y quienes se esfuerzan triunfan, la humildad no es una prioridad. En nuestros tiempos, la humildad a menudo se asocia con la debilidad y una baja autoestima. Incluso en tiempos de Jesús, era importante el lugar donde una persona se sentaba ante una asamblea o mesa. Puede que hoy no seamos tan conscientes de ello, pero probablemente no seamos más humildes que la gente de la época de Jesús. Vivimos en un mundo donde el estatus es clave y el rango es esencial. Con frecuencia, entonces, la calidad sufre en la carrera por alcanzar el éxito.

Jesús les dijo a las personas de su tiempo: “Cuando te inviten a un banquete de bodas, no te sientes en el lugar principal, no sea que haya algún otro invitado más importante que tú, y el que los invitó a los dos venga a decirte: ‘Déjale el lugar a éste’, y tengas que ir a ocupar, lleno de vergüenza, el último asiento”. Advierte a la gente contra toda forma de orgullo y autoglorificación. El orgullo es un camino sin salida.

La enseñanza de Jesús sobre la humildad surge cuando nos habla de invitar a los pobres, a los lisiados, a los cojos y a los ciegos que no tienen con que pagarte, “no invites a tus amigos, ni a tus hermanos, ni a tus parientes, ni a los vecinos ricos”.

Nos preguntamos: “¿Quiénes son los pobres, los lisiados, los cojos y los ciegos?”. La respuesta: Son aquellos que hicieron algo malo en sus vidas. También representan a quienes caminan sin la luz del evangelio y, por lo tanto, tropiezan, caen y se lastiman a sí mismos y a otros con ellos. También pueden representar a quienes llevan vidas irregulares, a quienes tal vez han estado en prisión, o a quienes han fracasado en su matrimonio, hombres y mujeres que pasan de un error a otro.

Debemos amarlos porque Jesús nos mostró que es maravilloso poder amar como Dios, sin esperar nada a cambio. Cuando somos capaces de amar sin condiciones, nos volvemos como el Padre celestial al experimentar su alegría. Y como Jesús prometió: “Tendrán una gran recompensa y serán hijos del Altísimo”. ♦

Educación Católica: Sentando las Bases para el Futuro de nuestros hijos

Tras las vacaciones de verano, padres e hijos, el Personal y el Profesorado de la Escuela, y la Comunidad Parroquial de Nuestra Señora de Lourdes, afrontamos un nuevo año escolar abiertos a lo que nos depara el nuevo año. Con gran esperanza, basada en la fe en el Señor, fuente de todo, y con caridad, iniciamos un nuevo año, creando oportunidades académicas para compartir, aprender y reaprender las verdades sobre Dios y el mundo que nos rodea.

La Escuela de Nuestra Señora de Lourdes existe con y para la Parroquia. Comparte la misión y la vida de la Iglesia Católica Universal, que se encuentra concretamente en la Parroquia Nuestra Señora de Lourdes. Por lo tanto, un elemento fundamental de la misión y la vida de la Parroquia es el apoyo que brinda a la escuela, proporcionando recursos espirituales, humanos y financieros para mantenerla abierta y sostenerse como Institución Educativa Católica. De igual manera, la Escuela de Nuestra Señora de Lourdes ofrece a nuestros niños una vía para recibir educación católica, lo cual constituye una gran inversión para su futuro. Por lo tanto, la pobreza no debe ser un obstáculo para la educación católica en la Escuela Nuestra Señora de Lourdes. La administración de esta escuela ofrece varias opciones sobre cómo pagar la educación de su hijo en una escuela católica de una manera asequible.



Como Escuela Católica, Nuestra Señora de Lourdes se guía e impulsa por una misión claramente comunicada que abraza una identidad católica arraigada en los valores del Evangelio, centrada en la Eucaristía y comprometida con la formación en la fe, la excelencia académica y el servicio. Si bien la percepción puede haber cambiado, ya que muchos traen a sus hijos a escuelas católicas debido a sus altas perspectivas académicas, nuestra misión sigue vigente: ofrecer un programa académico riguroso *de estudios religiosos y catequesis en la fe católica, enmarcado en un currículo académico integral que integra fe, cultura y vida* (énfasis añadido). Las doctrinas católicas, especialmente la fe y la moral, no se consideran materias separadas que se enseñen y aprendan, sino que forman parte del currículo académico de la Educación Católica. Por lo tanto, la función del personal, el profesorado y la administración de nuestra Escuela en Nuestra Señora de Lourdes es más bien un ministerio que protege y promueve el sentido de derecho y responsabilidad de todos, proporcionando un entorno para la enseñanza de la doctrina y la Sagrada Escritura, la construcción y vivencia de la comunidad, el servicio a los demás y la oportunidad de celebrar el culto.

Esto no solo ocurre dentro del aula. De hecho, es nuestra tarea y misión brindar oportunidades también fuera del aula para la formación en la fe de los estudiantes, la participación en la oración litúrgica y comunitaria, y la acción al servicio de la misericordia y la caridad.

Afirmamos el mensaje de la Pontificia Congregación para la Educación Católica: que el desarrollo intelectual de la persona y su crecimiento como cristiano van de la mano. Enraizado en la misión de la Iglesia, la Escuela Nuestra Señora de Lourdes se esfuerza por unir la fe, la cultura y la vida en armonía. En 2005, los obispos señalaron que “los jóvenes del tercer milenio deben ser una fuente de energía y liderazgo en nuestra Iglesia y en nuestra nación. Por lo tanto, debemos brindarles un programa educativo académicamente riguroso y doctrinalmente sólido” (Renovando nuestro compromiso con la escuela primaria y secundaria católica en el tercer milenio, 2005).

Si bien tenemos una visión positiva para la Escuela Nuestra Señora de Lourdes, para que pueda continuar su misión, necesitamos las oraciones y el apoyo de cada uno para nuestra Escuela Parroquial. St Gregory the Great, Pope & Doctor of the Church September 3

Saint Gregory the Great (Latin: Sanctus Gregorius Magnus; Italian: Santo Gregorio Magno), was the 64th Bishop of Rome from 3 September 590 until his death on 12 March 604. He is known for instituting the first recorded large-scale mission from Rome, the Gregorian mission, to convert the then largely pagan Anglo-Saxons to Christianity. Gregory is also well known for his writings, which were more prolific than those of any of his predecessors as pope. The epithet Saint Gregory the Dialogist has been attached to him in Eastern Christianity because of his Dialogues. English translations of Eastern texts sometimes list him as Gregory "Dialogos" from the Greek διάλογος (dialogos, conversation), or the Anglo-Latinate equivalent "Dialogus". He is the second of the three Popes listed in the Annuario Pontificio with the title "the Great", alongside Popes Leo I and Nicholas I.



St. Rose of Viterbo

St. Rose was born in Viterbo, Italy, to poor but devout parents. From a young age, she showed deep devotion, praying fervently and caring for the poor. At age 7, she reportedly received visions from the Virgin Mary and was called to join the Third Order of St. Francis. She began preaching repentance and loyalty to the Church at just 12 years old. During a time of conflict between the pope and Emperor Frederick II, Rose publicly supported the papacy. Her outspoken stance led to her family's exile from Viterbo.

Known for miraculous acts, including reportedly raising her aunt from the dead and surviving flames during a public trial of faith. Rose died at age 17 after being denied entry to a convent due to poverty. She foretold she would be accepted posthumously—and her remains were later enshrined there. Her body is still venerated in Viterbo, where an annual festival honors

better known as Mother Teresa or Saint Mother Teresa,[a] was an Albanian-Indian Catholic nun, founder of the Missionaries of Charity and is a Catholic saint. Born in Skopje, then part of the Ottoman Empire, she was raised in a devoutly Catholic family. At the age of 18, she moved to Ireland to join the Sisters of Loreto and later to India, where she lived most of her life and carried out her missionary work. On 4 September 2016, she was canonized by the Catholic Church as Saint Teresa of Calcutta. The anniversary of her death, 5 September, is now observed as her feast day.

What is a Pilgrimage In the Words of Pope Francis

"Making a Pilgrimage to shrines is one of the most eloquent expressions of the faith of God's people... It would be a mistake to think that those who go on a pilgrimage live a spirituality that is not personal but rather of the masses. The reality is that the pilgrim carries within him his own history and faith and the lights and shadows of his own life. Each person carries within his or her heart a special wish and a particular prayer. Those who enter the shrine immediately feel they are at home, welcomed, understood, and supported. Gazing upon the Crucifix or a image of Our Lady, a prayer is offered with tears in their eyes, brimming with faith. A shrine is truly a privileged space to meet the Lord and physically touch his mercy. To confess in a shrine is to have the experience of physically touching the mercy of God " ~ To those engaged in Pilgrimage Work, January 21, 2016

The Christian Pilgrimage is characterized by three signs:

1. "silence [which] allows one to listen, to listen with the heart, and in this way to find, while one walks, through the effort, the answers that the heart is looking for, because the heart asks questions. Indeed, God speaks in silence, like a gentle breeze..."
2. "the Gospel – always have the Gospel in your pocket ...The pilgrimage is made by re-reading the journey that Jesus took, up to the extreme gift of Self. ... when one reads the Gospel, there is someone beside us. It is the Holy Spirit. It is He who makes us understand well what the Gospel does. "
3. "Matthew 25 Protocol": "Whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me" (Mt 25:40)...doing good, to people who also smaller, the most disadvantaged people. Always do good. Along the way, be attentive to others, especially those who struggle the most, who have fallen, who are in need..." Local Pilgrimage Sites

Throughout this Holy Year, a plenary Indulgence in the usual form of the Church will be granted to all the faithful who are truly repentant and detached from any sin and confess their sins sacramentally, receive Holy Communion, pray for the intentions of the Holy Father, and go on a pilgrimage visit to the [Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels](#) or [Mission Basilica San Buenaventura](#), or perform corporal or spiritual works of mercy.

What is a plenary indulgence?

God never ceases to offer us his mercy. When we sin, an unhealthy attachment to earthly things remains even after the guilt of sin is forgiven. Such attachments can be purified here on earth through an indulgence or in purgatory; this purification is known as the remission of temporal punishment due to sin (Catechism of the Catholic Church 1472). During the Jubilee, a plenary indulgence - the complete remission of temporal punishment due to sin (CCC,1471) - in the usual form of the Church will be granted to all the faithful who are truly repentant and confess their sins, receive Holy Communion, pray for the intentions of the Holy Father, and perform one of the following:

1. a pilgrimage visit to the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels or Mission Basilica San Buenaventura to pray;
2. participation in a parish mission or study of the documents of the Second Vatican Council or the Catechism of the Catholic Church;
3. corporal or spiritual works of mercy;
4. penitential practices.

¿Qué es una peregrinación? En palabras del Papa Francisco

Peregrinar a los santuarios es una de las expresiones más elocuentes de la fe del pueblo de Dios... Sería un error pensar que quienes peregrinan viven una espiritualidad no personal, sino de masas. La realidad es que el peregrino lleva en sí su propia historia y fe, así como las luces y sombras de su vida. Cada persona lleva en su corazón un deseo especial y una oración particular. Quienes entran al santuario se sienten inmediatamente como en casa, acogidos, comprendidos y apoyados. Al contemplar el Crucifijo o una imagen de Nuestra Señora, se ofrece una oración con lágrimas en los ojos. Un santuario es verdaderamente un espacio privilegiado para encontrar al Señor y tocar físicamente su misericordia. Confesarse en un santuario es tener la experiencia de tocar físicamente la misericordia de Dios, 21 de enero de 2016.

La peregrinación cristiana se caracteriza por tres signos:

1. "El silencio [que] permite escuchar, escuchar con el corazón, y así encontrar, mientras se camina, mediante el esfuerzo, las respuestas que el corazón busca, porque el corazón se pregunta. En efecto, Dios habla en silencio, como una suave brisa..."
2. "El Evangelio: ten siempre el Evangelio en el bolsillo... La peregrinación se realiza releyendo el camino de Jesús, hasta la entrega extrema de sí mismo... Cuando leemos el Evangelio, hay alguien a nuestro lado. Es el Espíritu Santo. Es Él quien nos hace comprender bien lo que hace el Evangelio."
3. "Protocolo Mateo 25": "Todo lo que hicieron con uno de estos hermanos míos más pequeños, conmigo lo hicieron" (Mt 25,40)...haciendo el bien, también a las personas más pequeñas, a las más desfavorecidas. Haz siempre el bien. En el camino, estad atentos a los demás, especialmente a los que más luchan, a los que han caído, a los que están necesitados... 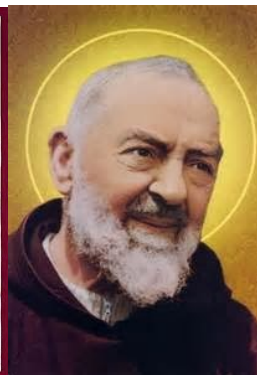

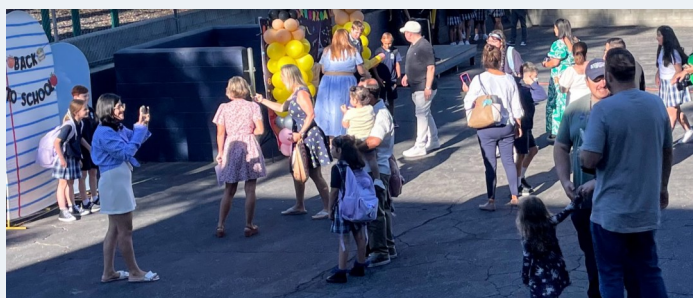

- This email is from **someone outside my organization and it's not related to my job responsibilities**.
- This email was sent from **someone inside the organization** or from a customer, vendor, or partner and is **very unusual or out of character**.
- Is the sender's email address from a **suspicious domain** (like micorsoft-support.com)?
- I **don't know the sender personally** and they **were not vouched for** by someone I trust.
- I **don't have a business relationship** nor any past communications with the sender.
- This is an **unexpected or unusual email** with an **embedded hyperlink or an attachment** from someone I haven't communicated with recently.

TO

- I was cc'd on an email sent to one or more people, but I **don't personally know** the other people it was sent to.
- I received an email that was also sent to an **unusual mix of people**. For instance, it might be sent to a random group of people at my organization whose last names start with the same letter, or a whole list of unrelated addresses.

HYPERLINKS

- I hover my mouse over a hyperlink that's displayed in the email message, but the **link-to address is for a different website**. (This is a **big red flag**.)
- I received an email that only has **long hyperlinks with no further information**, and the rest of the email is completely blank.
- I received an email with a **hyperlink that is a misspelling** of a known website. For instance, www.bankofamerica.com — the "m" is really two characters — "r" and "n."

DATE

- Did I receive an email that I normally would get during regular business hours, but it was **sent at an unusual time** like 3 a.m.?

SUBJECT

- Did I get an email with a subject line that is **irrelevant or does not match** the message content?
- Is the email message a reply to something I **never sent or requested**?

ATTACHMENTS

- The sender included an email attachment that I **was not expecting** or that **makes no sense** in relation to the email message. (This sender doesn't ordinarily send me this type of attachment.)
- I see an attachment with a possibly **dangerous file type**.

CONTENT

- Is the sender asking me to click on a link or open an attachment to **avoid a negative consequence** or to **gain something of value**?
- Is the email **out of the ordinary**, or does it have **bad grammar** or **spelling errors**?
- Is the sender asking me to click a link or open up an attachment that **seems odd** or **illogical**?
- Do I have an **uncomfortable gut feeling** about the sender's request to open an attachment or click a link?
- Is the email asking me to look at a **compromising or embarrassing picture** of myself or someone I know?

DE

- No reconozco el correo electrónico del remitente como el de alguien **con quien me comunico normalmente**.
- Este correo electrónico es de **alguien externo a mi organización y no se relaciona con mis responsabilidades laborales**.
- Este correo electrónico fue enviado por **alguien dentro de la organización** o por un cliente, proveedor o socio y es **muy extraño o está fuera de lugar**.
- ¿Es **sospechoso el dominio** de la dirección del correo electrónico del remitente (como micorsoft-support.com)?
- No conozco al remitente personalmente y no fue avalado por alguien en quien confío.
- No tengo una **relación laboral** ni comunicaciones anteriores con el remitente.
- Este es un **correo electrónico imprevisto o extraño** con un **hipervínculo incrustado o un archivo adjunto** de alguien con quien no me he comunicado recientemente.

PARA

- Soy un destinatario con copia en un correo electrónico enviado a una o más personas, pero **no conozco personalmente** a ninguna de ellas.
- Recibí un correo electrónico que fue enviado también a un **grupo extraño de personas**. Por ejemplo, puede ser enviado a un grupo de personas aleatorias de mi organización cuyos apellidos comienzan con la misma letra, o una lista completa de direcciones sin relación alguna.

HIPERVÍNCULOS

- Paso el cursor sobre el hipervínculo que aparece en el cuerpo del correo electrónico, pero la **dirección del enlace es una página web diferente**. (Esto es una **gran señal de advertencia**).
- Recibí un correo electrónico que solo contenía **hipervínculos largos sin otra información**, y el resto del mensaje está completamente vacío.
- Recibí un correo electrónico que contiene un **hipervínculo con un error ortográfico** de un sitio web conocido. Por ejemplo, en el enlace www.bankofamerica.com, la "m" corresponde, en realidad, a dos caracteres, "r" y "n".

FECHA

- ¿Recibí un correo electrónico que normalmente recibiría en horario laboral normal, pero fue **enviado en un horario extraño** como las 3 a. m.?

ASUNTO

- ¿Recibí un correo electrónico con un asunto **irrelevante o que no coincide** con el contenido del mensaje?
- ¿Es el mensaje del correo electrónico una respuesta a algo que **nunca envié o solicité**?

ARCHIVOS ADJUNTOS

- El remitente incluyó un archivo adjunto que **yo no esperaba** o que **no tiene conexión** con el mensaje del correo electrónico. (Este remitente no me envía normalmente este tipo de archivos adjuntos).
- Veo un archivo adjunto con un **tipo de archivo posiblemente peligroso**.

CONTENIDO

- ¿Me pide el remitente que haga clic en un enlace o que abra un archivo adjunto para **evitar una consecuencia negativa** o para **obtener algo de valor**?
- ¿Es el correo electrónico **poco habitual**, o tiene **errores de gramática o de ortografía**?
- ¿Me pide el remitente que haga clic en un enlace o que abra un archivo adjunto que **parece extraño o ilógico**?
- ¿Tengo una **sensación incómoda** sobre el pedido del remitente de que abra un archivo adjunto o haga clic en un enlace?
- ¿Se me pide que mire una foto **comprometedora o vergonzosa** mía o de alguien que conozco?
