Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading:

Habakkuk 1:2-3.2:2-4

Responsorial Psalm:

Psalm 95

– *If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts.*

Second Reading:

2 Timothy 1:6-8.13-14

Gospel:

Luke 17:5-10

My dearly beloved brothers and sisters in Christ, on this 27th Sunday in ordinary time, we gather around God's presence praying that He accept our thanksgiving, pardon our lack of faith, and increase our faith so that we may stand firm even when destruction, violence, strife and contention surround us.

"Lord, increase our faith," words of the apostles to Jesus. These are the same words we utter in prayer during trying moments; moments when we feel that we are all alone and desolate, rocked with fear, and moments when we feel God's absence. And this is our constant prayer even when things are going well: "Lord, increase our faith." "If you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you could say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and transplanted into the sea' and it would obey you," says the Lord. A mulberry tree is a tree with deep roots, resistant to great force when one tries to uproot it. The mustard seed is too small a seed to describe a faith strong enough to uproot such a tree. And in some other references, it is said that faith can move mountains. So, what is the call?

Mustard seed against a mulberry tree. Little mustard seeds of faith against mountains of unbelief. Little acts of prayer and short reminders based on Christian values to anyone in a leadership role, small conversations among peers and groups of individuals -- these can move into the sea those mountains of conceit, dishonesty, and disdain.

St. Paul tells us in the second reading from his letter to Timothy: "Therefore, never be ashamed of your testimony to our Lord, nor of me, a prisoner for his sake; but bear your share of hardship for the gospel with the strength that comes from God."

During the time of the prophet, Habakkuk (first reading), when Jehoiakim was king of Israel, the situation of plunder, oppression and injustice was becoming unbearable. The Lord thus tells the people through Habakkuk, the prophet, not to give up because of the

towering difficulties that shake their faith. "Fulfillment of the promise will surely come and if it is delayed, wait for it."

This journey of faith is not always easy; it could even be interrupted. Some may grow tired of believing and pause for a while; some may continue to believe in God but may not yet trust Him fully as they may not have the courage to take certain steps to cross certain bridges. Faith is not something that gives us the right to demand rewards from God. It is because faith is not only a gift but is also something that helps us understand life and foster our happiness.

The parable in the gospel reading speaks of this. Here, Jesus talks about a servant, who, after a long day's work under the heat of the sun, comes home exhausted. The master, instead of telling his servant to rest awhile, orders him to serve first; only after he finishes may the servant help himself. This means that in front of God, we should not presume that if we serve Him -- as a good parent, a good husband or wife, a good priest -- we are entitled to some form of merit or reward.

Of course, God is more generous than we can imagine but let us not so much as think of meriting a good life for being a faithful servant. We are simply doing God's will. We serve God for the sake of serving God, for we are merely his servants. Even after a hard day's work that may leave us tired and exhausted, one must repeat the servant's words in the gospel: "I am just a useless servant; I only did what I had to do." While merits and rewards are good -- and they will surely come -- let us grow our faith as a commitment to follow Jesus for there is joy in discipleship. Furthermore, let us not forget to thank God even for the little good things that we do and the little good words that we say and live by. Then our faith, the size of a mustard seed, can move mountains of death so that deeply rooted trees of hatred and division are uprooted. ❖

Cast into the Deep

The Fruits of the Joyful Mysteries

Do you remember kneeling on the hardwood floor, as the family prayed the rosary? The Hail Marys and the Our Fathers came easily enough but to a young child, each repetition was not exactly a favorite part of the day. Fidgeting, falling asleep, being admonished to keep still — these were very understandable experiences of a 6-yr-old child. But as we grew in maturity, we began to understand more about prayer, about the rosary and how it should be prayed. St. John XXIII said that “Prayer is the raising of the mind to God....The actual words matter less.” (p.3) Hence, in saying the Rosary, if all we do is voice the words of the prayers, it would be as if we had gone back to the cold hardwood floor, fidgeting and fighting off sleep.



The rosary instead should bring us closer to God, to know Jesus and Mary better and lead us to live our lives in imitation of their lives as they had lived it in the mysteries. We are asked to pray the Our Father reflecting on the love and Mercy of the Father and to pray the Hail Marys meditating on each mystery with each decade. Each Mystery of the Rosary is an event or passage in Scripture. Reflect on that passage as you pray the decade of Hail Marys. See it in your mind's eye and let it lift you up into the Father's bosom, or kneeling at the feet of Christ. We pray as well for the fruit of the mystery to be a reality in our lives.

For the month of October, we will devote this space to the scripture reflection associated with each mystery and the fruit of the mystery.

The Annunciation

“In the sixth month, the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a town of Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the house of David, and the virgin's name was Mary.” (Luke 1:26-27)

The fruit of this mystery is Humility. Mary in her humility, gave her ready “yes” when she was called by God to be the mother of our Savior. She did not say, “What's in it for me?” No WIFMs for Mary. We do not read about Mary name-dropping either... “Well, yes, as you know my son Jesus, you know... God.” No, she lived her life completely in tune with God's Will.

The Visitation

“During those days Mary set out and traveled to the hill country in haste to a town of Judah, where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the infant leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth, filled with the holy Spirit, cried out in a loud voice and said, ‘Most blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb.’” (Luke 1:39-42)

The fruit of this mystery is Love of Neighbor. Mary took the initiative to go to her cousin Elizabeth and offered to help her as she prepared for the birth of John. She did not wait for a note from Elizabeth to please come. May we also be attentive and responsive to every opportunity to love.

The Nativity

“In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that the whole world should be enrolled. This was the first enrollment, when Quirinius was governor of Syria. So all went to be enrolled, each to his own town. And Joseph too went up from Galilee from the town of Nazareth to Judea, to the

city of David that is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and family of David, to be enrolled with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. While they were there, the time came for her to have her child, and she gave birth to her firstborn son. She wrapped him in swaddling clothes and laid him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn.” (Luke 2:1-7)

The fruit of the mystery is Poverty. Imagine God, the King of the universe, in swaddling clothes, born in a stable, no crib for a bed. A Christmas Hymn reminds us, “Who is this who lives with the lowly, sharing their sorrows, knowing their hunger? This is Christ revealed to the world in the eyes of a child, a child of the poor.” May this mystery inspire us to live in this consumeristic society, detached from our worldly possessions with an openness and generosity to share with those in need.

The Presentation in the Temple

“When eight days were completed for his circumcision, he was named Jesus, the name given him by the angel before he was conceived in the womb. When the days were completed for their purification according to the law of Moses, they took him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord, just as it is written in the law of the Lord, ‘Every male that opens the womb shall be consecrated to the Lord,’ and to offer the sacrifice of ‘a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons,’ in accordance with the dictate in the law of the Lord.” (Luke 2:21-24)

The fruit of this mystery is Obedience. Mary, the sinless one, had no need to go to the temple to be purified but she did. Jesus, who is God himself, did not need to be presented and consecrated to the Lord, but they did... “in accordance with the dictate of the law...” We pray for the grace to live our lives according to God's Holy Will at all times and in all situations.

The Finding in the Temple

“Each year his parents went to Jerusalem for the feast of Passover, and when he was twelve years old, they went up according to festival custom. After they had completed its days, as they were returning, the boy Jesus remained behind in Jerusalem, but his parents did not know it. Thinking that he was in the caravan, they journeyed for a day and looked for him among their relatives and acquaintances, but not finding him, they returned to Jerusalem to look for him. After three days they found him in the temple, sitting in the midst of the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions, and all who heard him were astounded at his understanding and his answers.” (Luke 2:41-47)

The fruit of the mystery is Piety, Devotion to Jesus. Mary and Joseph were looking for him. Were they worried? We can just imagine what thoughts went through their minds when they discovered that Jesus was not with them. They went back and searched for him... and searched for him. When they finally found him there was great joy. And Jesus went back with them to Nazareth. Piety is defined as a devotion to religion so as Christians or followers of Christ, Piety is a devotion to Jesus—to live a Christ-centered life. If we find moments where he is missing in our heart, in our midst, we must search for him, assiduously, as Mary and Joseph did until he is enthroned once more in our heart and restored at the center of our life.

We complete each decade by glorifying God, who with his tender love and mercy is the author of the salvation history we relive in the Mysteries of the Holy Rosary. ❖

“Why Go To Confession? The Healing Power of the Sacrament of Reconciliation”

XXVII Domingo Del Tiempo Ordinario**Primera Lectura: Habacuc 1, 2-3; 2, 2-4****Salmo Responsorial: Salmo 95***– Ojalá escuchen hoy la voz del Señor: “No endurezcan el corazón”***Segunda Lectura: 2 Timoteo 1, 6-8. 13-14****Evangelio: Lucas 17, 5-10**

Mis queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo, en este Vigésimo Septo domingo del tiempo ordinario, nos reunimos en torno a la presencia de Dios orando para que Él acepte nuestra gratitud, perdone nuestra falta de fe y aumente nuestra fe para que podamos permanecer firmes incluso cuando la destrucción, la violencia, la lucha y la contienda nos rodeen.

“Señor, aumenta nuestra fe”, palabras de los apóstoles a Jesús. Estas son las mismas palabras que pronunciamos en oración en momentos difíciles; momentos en que nos sentimos solos y desolados, abrumados por el miedo, y momentos en que sentimos la ausencia de Dios. Y esta es nuestra oración constante incluso cuando todo va bien: “Señor, auméntanos nuestra fe”, “Si tuvieran fe, aunque fuera tan pequeña como una semilla de mostaza, podrían decir a ese árbol frondoso: ‘Arráncate de raíz y plántate en el mar’, y lo obedecería”, dice el Señor. Una morera es un árbol con raíces profundas, resistente a una gran fuerza cuando se intenta arrancarlo. La semilla de mostaza es demasiado pequeña para describir una fe lo suficientemente fuerte como para arrancar un árbol así. Y en otras referencias, se dice que la fe puede mover montañas. Entonces, ¿cuál es el llamado?

Una semilla de mostaza contra un árbol de moras. Pequeñas semillas de mostaza de fe contra montañas de incredulidad. Pequeños actos de oración y breves recordatorios basados en valores cristianos para cualquier persona en un rol de liderazgo, pequeñas conversaciones entre compañeros y grupos de personas – todo esto puede mover al mar esas montañas de vanidad, deshonestidad y desdén.

San Pablo nos dice en la segunda lectura de su carta a Timoteo: “No te avergüences, pues, de dar testimonio de nuestro Señor, ni te avergüences de mí, que estoy preso por su causa. Al contrario, comparte conmigo los sufrimientos por la predicación del Evangelio, sostenido por la fuerza de Dios.

Durante la época del profeta Habacuc (primera lectura), cuando Joacim era rey de Israel, la situación de saqueo, opresión e injusticia se estaba volviendo insoportable. El Señor, a través del profeta Habacuc, le dice al pueblo que no se rinda ante las enormes dificultades que debilitan su fe. “El cumplimiento de la promesa llegará sin duda; si se tarda, espéralo, pues llegará sin falta”.

Este camino de fe no siempre es fácil; incluso podría interrumpirse. Algunos pueden cansarse de creer y detenerse por un tiempo; otros pueden seguir creyendo en Dios, pero aún no confiar plenamente en Él, ya que no tienen el valor de dar ciertos pasos para cruzar ciertos puentes. La fe no nos da derecho a exigir recompensas de Dios. Es porque la fe no es solo un don, sino también algo que nos ayuda a comprender la vida y a fomentar nuestra felicidad.

La parábola del Evangelio habla de esto. Jesús habla de un siervo que, tras una larga jornada de trabajo bajo el calor del sol, llega a casa exhausto. El amo, en lugar de decirle que descanse un rato, le ordena que sirva primero; solo después de terminar, el siervo puede servirse a sí mismo. Esto significa que, ante Dios, no debemos presumir que le servimos — como buen padre, buen esposo o esposa, buen sacerdote — tenemos derecho a algún tipo de mérito o recompensa.

Claro que Dios es más generoso de lo que imaginamos, pero no pensemos siquiera en merecer una buena vida por ser un siervo fiel. Simplemente hacemos la voluntad de Dios. Servimos a Dios por el simple hecho de servirle, pues somos simplemente sus siervos. Incluso después de una ardua jornada de trabajo que puede dejarnos cansados y exhaustos, debemos repetir las palabras del siervo del Evangelio: “No somos más que siervos, sólo hemos hecho lo que teníamos que hacer”. Aunque los méritos y las recompensas son buenos, y sin duda llegarán, cultivemos nuestra fe como compromiso para seguir a Jesús, pues hay alegría en el discipulado. Además, no olvidemos agradecer a Dios incluso por las pequeñas cosas buenas que hacemos y las pequeñas palabras buenas que decimos y vivimos. Entonces nuestra fe, del tamaño de un grano de mostaza, puede mover montañas de muerte para arrancar árboles de odio y división profundamente arraigados. ❖



Pescando en lo Profundo

Los Frutos de los Misterios Gozosos

¿Recuerdas arrodillarte en el suelo de madera mientras la familia rezaba el rosario? Los Avemarías y los Padrenuestros se rezaban con facilidad, pero para un niño pequeño, cada repetición no era precisamente su momento favorito del día. Inquietarse, quedarse dormido, que le avisaran que se quedara quieto – estas eran experiencias muy comprensibles para un niño de 6 años. Pero a medida que crecíamos, empezamos a comprender más sobre la oración, sobre el rosario y cómo debía rezarse. San Juan XXIII dijo que “La oración es la elevación de la mente a Dios... Las palabras en sí importan menos” (p. 3). Por lo tanto, al rezar el rosario, si solo dijéramos las palabras, sería como si hubiéramos vuelto al frío suelo de madera, inquietos y luchando contra el sueño.

En cambio, el rosario debería acercarnos a Dios, a conocer mejor a Jesús y a María, y llevarnos a vivir nuestras vidas imitando sus vidas, tal como la vivieron en los misterios. Se nos pide rezar el Padrenuestro reflexionando sobre el amor y la Misericordia del Padre, y rezar las Avemarías meditando cada misterio con cada decena. Cada Misterio del Rosario es un acontecimiento o pasaje de la Escritura. Reflexionen sobre ese pasaje al rezar la decena de Avemarías. Visualícenlo en su mente y permitan que los eleve al seno del Padre, o arrodillen a los pies de Cristo. Oramos también para que el fruto del misterio se haga realidad en nuestras vidas.

Durante el mes de octubre, dedicaremos este espacio a la reflexión bíblica asociada con cada misterio y su fruto.

La Anunciación

“Al sexto mes, el ángel Gabriel fue enviado por Dios a una ciudad de Galilea llamada Nazaret, a una virgen desposada con un hombre llamado José, de la casa de David; el nombre de la virgen era María”. (Lucas 1, 26-27)

El fruto de este misterio es la Humildad. María, en su humildad, dio su “sí” sin reservas cuando Dios la llamó para ser la madre de nuestro Salvador. No dijo: “¿Qué gano yo con esto?”. María no pensó si le convenía. Tampoco leemos que María mencione nombres como: “Bueno, sí, como ustedes saben mi hijo es Jesús, ustedes saben... Dios”. No, ella vivió su vida en completa sintonía con la voluntad de Dios.

La Visitación

“En aquellos días, María se puso en camino y se dirigió apresuradamente a la región montañosa, a un pueblo de Judá. Allí entró en casa de Zacarías y saludó a Isabel. Al oír Isabel el saludo de María, el niño saltó en su vientre, e Isabel, llena del Espíritu Santo, exclamó a gran voz: ‘¡Bendita tú entre las mujeres y bendito el fruto de tu vientre!’” (Lucas 1, 39-42)

El fruto de este misterio es el Amor al prójimo. María tomó la iniciativa de ir a ver a su prima Isabel y se ofreció a ayudarla mientras se preparaba para el nacimiento de Juan. No esperó recibir una nota de Isabel para que la atendiera. Que también nosotros estemos atentos y receptivos a toda oportunidad de amar.

La Natividad

“En aquellos días se promulgó un decreto de César Augusto para que todo el mundo se empadronara. Este primer empadronamiento se realizó siendo Quirino gobernador de Siria. Así que todos fueron a empadronarse, cada uno a su ciudad. José también subió de Galilea, de la ciudad de Nazaret, a Judea, a la ciudad de David, llamada Belén,

por ser de la casa y familia de David, para empadronarse con María, su prometida, que estaba encinta. Mientras estaban allí, se le cumplieron los días del parto, y dio a luz a su hijo primogénito. Lo envolvió en pañales y lo acostó en un pesebre, porque no había lugar para ellos en el mesón”. (Lucas 2, 1-7)

El fruto del misterio es la pobreza. Imaginemos a Dios, Rey del universo, en pañales, nacido en un establo, sin cuna. Un himno navideño nos recuerda: “¿Quién es este que vive con los humildes, compartiendo sus penas, conociendo su hambre? Este es Cristo revelado al mundo en los ojos de un niño, un hijo de los pobres”. Que este misterio nos inspire a vivir en esta sociedad consumista, desprendidos de nuestras posesiones terrenales con la apertura y la generosidad de compartir con los necesitados.

La Presentación en el Templo

“Cuando se cumplieron los ocho días para su circuncisión, le pusieron por nombre Jesús, el nombre que le había dado el ángel antes de ser concebido. Cuando se cumplieron los días para su purificación, según la ley de Moisés, lo llevaron a Jerusalén para presentarlo al Señor, tal como está escrito en la ley del Señor: ‘Todo varón primogénito será consagrado al Señor’, también debían ofrecer un sacrificio de un par de tórtolas o de pichones de paloma, conforme a lo prescrito en la ley del Señor”. (Lucas 2, 21-24)

El fruto de este misterio es la obediencia. María, la inmaculada, no necesitaba ir al templo para purificarse, pero sí lo hizo. Jesús, que es Dios mismo, no necesitaba ser presentado y consagrado al Señor, pero ellos sí... “conforme a lo que dicta la ley...”. Oramos por la gracia de vivir conforme a la Santa Voluntad de Dios en todo momento y en toda situación.

El hallazgo en el templo

“Cada año sus padres iban a Jerusalén para la fiesta de la Pascua, y cuando cumplió doce años, subieron según la costumbre. Al cumplirse los días de la fiesta, al regresar, el niño Jesús se quedó en Jerusalén, pero sus padres no lo supieron. Pensando que estaba en la caravana, caminaron un día y lo buscaron entre sus parientes y conocidos; pero al no encontrarlo, regresaron a Jerusalén a buscarlo. Después de tres días lo encontraron en el templo, sentado en medio de los maestros, escuchándolos y haciéndoles preguntas, y todos los que lo oían se maravillaban de su entendimiento y de sus respuestas”. (Lucas 2, 41-47)

El fruto del misterio es la Piedad, la devoción a Jesús. María y José lo buscaban. ¿Estaban preocupados? Podemos imaginarnos lo que pensaron al descubrir que Jesús no estaba con ellos. Regresaron y lo buscaron... y lo buscaron. Cuando finalmente lo encontraron, sintieron una gran alegría. Y Jesús regresó con ellos a Nazaret. La piedad se define como la devoción a la religión; por lo tanto, como cristianos o seguidores de Cristo, la piedad es una devoción a Jesús: vivir una vida centrada en Cristo. Si encontramos momentos en los que él falta en nuestro corazón, en medio de nosotros, debemos buscarlo asiduamente, como lo hicieron María y José, hasta que vuelva a estar entronizado en nuestro corazón y sea restaurado en el centro de nuestra vida.

Completamos cada decena glorificando a Dios, quien con su tierno amor y misericordia es el autor de la historia de la salvación que revivimos en los Misterios del Santo Rosario. ❖

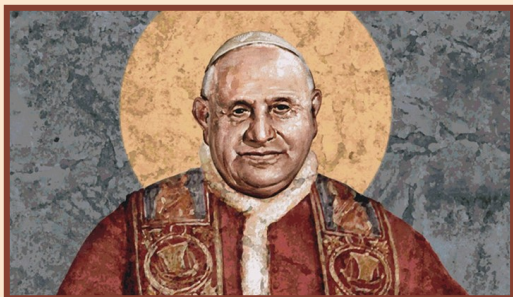

What is a Pilgrimage In the Words of Pope Francis

"Making a Pilgrimage to shrines is one of the most eloquent expressions of the faith of God's people... It would be a mistake to think that those who go on a pilgrimage live a spirituality that is not personal but rather of the masses. The reality is that the pilgrim carries within him his own history and faith and the lights and shadows of his own life. Each person carries within his or her heart a special wish and a particular prayer. Those who enter the shrine immediately feel they are at home, welcomed, understood, and supported. Gazing upon the Crucifix or a image of Our Lady, a prayer is offered with tears in their eyes, brimming with faith. A shrine is truly a privileged space to meet the Lord and physically touch his mercy. To confess in a shrine is to have the experience of physically touching the mercy of God " ~ To those engaged in Pilgrimage Work, January 21, 2016

The Christian Pilgrimage is characterized by three signs:

1. "silence [which] allows one to listen, to listen with the heart, and in this way to find, while one walks, through the effort, the answers that the heart is looking for, because the heart asks questions. Indeed, God speaks in silence, like a gentle breeze..."
2. "the Gospel – always have the Gospel in your pocket ...The pilgrimage is made by re-reading the journey that Jesus took, up to the extreme gift of Self. ... when one reads the Gospel, there is someone beside us. It is the Holy Spirit. It is He who makes us understand well what the Gospel does."
3. "Matthew 25 Protocol": "Whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me" (Mt 25:40)...doing good, to people who also smaller, the most disadvantaged people. Always do good. Along the way, be attentive to others, especially those who struggle the most, who have fallen, who are in need..." To the Italian pilgrims of the The Way of St James, December 19, 2024.

Local Pilgrimage Sites

Throughout this Holy Year, a plenary Indulgence in the usual form of the Church will be granted to all the faithful who are truly repentant and detached from any sin and confess their sins sacramentally, receive Holy Communion, pray for the intentions of the Holy Father, and go on a pilgrimage visit to the [Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels](#) or [Mission Basilica San Buenaventura](#), or perform corporal or spiritual works of mercy.

What is a plenary indulgence?

God never ceases to offer us his mercy. When we sin, an unhealthy attachment to earthly things remains even after the guilt of sin is forgiven. Such attachments can be purified here on earth through an indulgence or in purgatory; this purification is known as the remission of temporal punishment due to sin (Catechism of the Catholic Church 1472). During the Jubilee, a plenary indulgence - the complete remission of temporal punishment due to sin (CCC, 1471) - in the usual form of the Church will be granted to all the faithful who are truly repentant and confess their sins, receive Holy Communion, pray for the intentions of the Holy Father, and perform one of the following:

1. a pilgrimage visit to the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels or Mission Basilica San Buenaventura to pray;
2. participation in a parish mission or study of the documents of the Second Vatican Council or the Catechism of the Catholic Church;
3. corporal or spiritual works of mercy;
4. penitential practices.

¿Qué es una peregrinación? En palabras del Papa Francisco

Peregrinar a los santuarios es una de las expresiones más elocuentes de la fe del pueblo de Dios... Sería un error pensar que quienes peregrinan viven una espiritualidad no personal, sino de masas. La realidad es que el peregrino lleva en sí su propia historia y fe, así como las luces y sombras de su vida. Cada persona lleva en su corazón un deseo especial y una oración particular. Quienes entran al santuario se sienten inmediatamente como en casa, acogidos, comprendidos y apoyados. Al contemplar el Crucifijo o una imagen de Nuestra Señora, se ofrece una oración con lágrimas en los ojos. Un santuario es verdaderamente un espacio privilegiado para encontrar al Señor y tocar físicamente su misericordia. Confesarse en un santuario es tener la experiencia de tocar físicamente la misericordia de Dios, 21 de enero de 2016.

La peregrinación cristiana se caracteriza por tres signos:

1. "El silencio [que] permite escuchar, escuchar con el corazón, y así encontrar, mientras se camina, mediante el esfuerzo, las respuestas que el corazón busca, porque el corazón se pregunta. En efecto, Dios habla en silencio, como una suave brisa..."
2. "El Evangelio: ten siempre el Evangelio en el bolsillo... La peregrinación se realiza releyendo el camino de Jesús, hasta la entrega extrema de sí mismo... Cuando leemos el Evangelio, hay alguien a nuestro lado. Es el Espíritu Santo. Es Él quien nos hace comprender bien lo que hace el Evangelio."
3. "Protocolo Mateo 25": "Todo lo que hicieron con uno de estos hermanos míos más pequeños, conmigo lo hicieron" (Mt 25,40)...haciendo el bien, también a las personas más pequeñas, a las más desfavorecidas. Haz siempre el bien. En el camino, estad atentos a los demás, especialmente a los que más luchan, a los que han caído, a los que están necesitados... A los peregrinos italianos del Camino de Santiago, 19 de diciembre de 2024.

¿Qué es una indulgencia plenaria?

Durante el Jubileo, se concederá la indulgencia plenaria -la remisión completa de la pena temporal debida por los pecados (CIC, 1471)- en la forma habitual de la Iglesia a todos los fieles que, verdaderamente arrepentidos, confiesen sus pecados, reciban la Sagrada Comunión, oren por las intenciones del Santo Padre y realicen alguna de las siguientes acciones:

1. una visita de peregrinación a la Catedral de Nuestra Señora de los Ángeles o a la Misión Basílica de San Buenaventura para orar;
2. participación en una misión parroquial o estudio de los documentos del Concilio Vaticano II o del Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica;
3. obras de misericordia corporales o espirituales;
4. prácticas penitenciales.

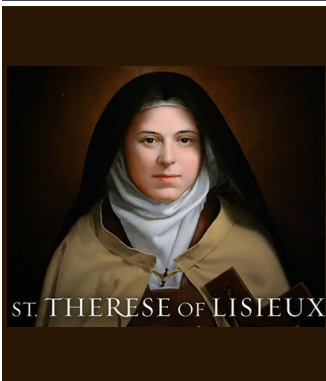

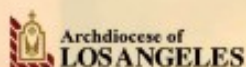

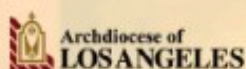
