Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

First Reading: 2 Samuel 5:1-3
Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 122
– *Let us go rejoicing in the house of the Lord.*
Second Reading: Colossians 1:12-20
Gospel: Luke 23:35-43

It's the Solemnity of our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, commonly called the Feast of Christ the King. In celebration of this feast, the Church draws upon lessons in Scriptures to tell us that the kingship of any human being comes from God who appointed kings in the Old Testament to act as shepherds to his people and that the fulfillment of His Kingdom is in Jesus Christ, the King of the universe, crucified out of love for humanity.

Ancient Israel was a nomadic people, a people without a place to call home. Eventually, they recognized the need to be united against their enemies. And so, kings were appointed by God, beginning with Saul, the first king of Israel. When Saul died in battle, the kingdom of Israel was divided into North and South. The Southern part of Israel chose David as their king while the Northern part chose Ishbaal, the son of King Saul. Ishbaal was inept and after seven years of chaos, the northern tribes turned to David and asked him to be their king.

This is the context of our first reading. David was anointed king over all Israel. His kingdom became a great and powerful kingdom -- admired, feared, and respected by all. After David was Solomon. He succeeded in keeping the kingdom of his father united but after some time, the tribes broke away, and the kingdom was once again reduced to small kingdoms. The people of Israel had only one dream: the restoration of the powerful kingdom of David. They prayed daily to God to send them a messiah who would fulfill their great dream and ambition. Jesus was God's answer to their prayers and expectations.

In the gospel of today, we see how God has fulfilled these expectations. We are on Mount Calvary. Jesus is nailed on the cross, flanked by two thieves, and over his head was the inscription: "INRI" *Jesus, Nazareus, Rex Iudeorum* -- Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews.

What we see on the cross, however, is a defeated man, incapable of defending himself. The People of Israel were hoping for a great

king on a golden throne, clothed in grandeur and echoing the victories and triumphs of David. Doubtless, if Jesus were to come down from the cross, they would be ready to believe. They believed in a strong and powerful God who defeats and humbles His enemies, who counters the provocations of the wicked, who instills fear and respect. But this is not the Messiah of God. For if Jesus were to come down from the cross, he would be betraying his mission: he would be approving the false idea of God according to how the leaders of Israel think. If Jesus were to come down from the cross, he would be confirming the kind of God which the powerful of this world worship, a god who is like them: strong, arrogant, oppressive, and vindictive.

Yet, even today, we Christians have this kind of God in our hearts and minds, a God who shows his power to punish the evil of this world. At the foot of the cross were the soldiers. They just follow orders. They are just poor people who, for money, are sent to comply with the orders of their superiors and in the process, lose all human feelings as they repeat what their superiors say, "If you are the king of the Jews, save yourself."

And yet, hanging next to Jesus, is one who recognized the Messiah and cried out: "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." This man was a sinner, a thief who deserved to die. And this thief understood that he can address Jesus by name because he saw in Jesus a Messiah who has a heart for those who have gone astray. He recognized the Messiah as a companion who, though upright, has accepted to undergo the fate of the sinful. To him, Jesus promises: "Today, you will be with me in paradise."

The story of this sinner hanging beside Jesus is the story of each one of us, as we may have behaved like him. After causing harm to others by our hatred, calumnies, and slander, after being a cause of disaster to society, family and community, we end up alone and in despair. And so, we call on him, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." ❖

Cast into the Deep Happy Thanksgiving Nelle Orsburn



On Thursday, this week, we will be celebrating Thanksgiving Day. Just thinking about it causes a sensory overload. Images of dressing, baking and basting turkey; pumpkin, apple and pecan pies baking in the oven. I can almost smell the aroma. Then, I can see in my mind's eye the feast itself, family coming from near and far, eagerly sharing their stories that did not make it to their social media, the children excitedly playing with one another. I can almost hear the happy chatter and infectious laughter.

Here's a Thanksgiving trivia. Did you know that even before the Mayflower folks had a Thanksgiving feast with the Wampanoag Native Americans, there were most likely earlier Thanksgiving celebrations with the settlers inviting their friendly Native American neighbors to join? More often than not, the thanksgiving feast was to thank God for their surviving the voyage to the new land, or the famine or the war. In fact, in 1789 George Washington proclaimed the First National Thanksgiving Day as "... a day of public thanksgiving and prayer to be observed by acknowledging with grateful hearts the many signal favors of Almighty God ..." At the outset, Thanksgiving Day was not an annual celebration but occurred if proclaimed by the President and it did not have to be celebrated in November. It was only in 1863 that Abraham Lincoln proclaimed an annual observance of Thanksgiving, "...therefore [I] invite my fellow-citizens in every part of the United States, and also those who are at sea and those who are sojourning in foreign lands, to set apart and observe the last Thursday of November next, as a day of Thanksgiving and Praise to our beneficent Father who dwelleth in the Heavens." In 1941, President Roosevelt signed the bill that would fix the day of Thanksgiving on the Fourth Thursday of November as we have it today.

It is a good reminder that the original intent of the Holiday is to give thanks to God, "our beneficent Father" for all the gifts, the favors that He has given us.

But we don't have to wait for Thanksgiving to give thanks to our God. Our life can be a constant Thank You. From the lofty, thanking God for having created me and making me a Christian; for sending Jesus to save us from our sins, to the mundane, "Thank you God for this parking spot. Thank you for holding my hands through this root canal. Thank you for this delicious meal." At a long ago retreat I attended, the Jesuit priest who gave the talk told us that the moment he opens his eyes in the morning, he utters a word or phrase of praise to God. "I love You Dear God and I adore You." It's not a bad idea to follow this with a Thanksgiving. "Thank you, Lord. Thank you for giving me life. Thank you for keeping me safe through the night."

But it is not enough to say thank you. It is noteworthy that in the 1789 Proclamation of Thanksgiving Day, Washington enjoins the people as their duty "...to acknowledge the providence of Almighty God, to obey his will, to be grateful for his benefits, and humbly to implore his protection and favor..." So together with the Thanksgiving prayer is a prayer for the grace to do His Holy Will and to be kept safe during our waking and sleeping moments.

And God's Holy Will is to love our neighbor.

Gratitude therefore is a dynamic action and reaction, giving thanks and praise in one breath and loving the neighbor in the next breath. We may say that gratitude is an attitude of thanksgiving and love.

Solemnidad de Nuestro Señor Jesucristo, Rey del Universo**Primera Lectura: 2 Samuel 5, 1-3****Salmo Responsorial: Salmo 122**– *Qué alegría cuando me dijeron: “Vamos a la casa del Señor”.***Segunda Lectura: Colosenses 1, 12-20****Evangelio: Lucas 23, 35-43**

Es la Solemnidad de nuestro Señor Jesucristo, Rey del Universo, comúnmente llamada la Fiesta de Cristo Rey. En la celebración de esta fiesta, la Iglesia recurre a las enseñanzas de las Sagradas Escrituras para explicarnos que la realeza de todo ser humano proviene de Dios, quien designó reyes en el Antiguo Testamento para que pastorearan a su pueblo, y que la plenitud de su Reino se encuentra en Jesucristo, Rey del universo, crucificado por amor a la humanidad.

El antiguo Israel era un pueblo nómada, sin un lugar al que llamar hogar. Con el tiempo, reconocieron la necesidad de unirse contra sus enemigos. Así, Dios designó reyes, comenzando con Saúl, el primer rey de Israel. Cuando Saúl murió en batalla, el reino de Israel se dividió en Norte y Sur. La parte sur de Israel eligió a David como su rey, mientras que la parte norte eligió a Isbaal, hijo del rey Saúl. Isbaal era inepto y, tras siete años de caos, las tribus del norte se volvieron hacia David y le pidieron que fuera su rey.

Este es el contexto de nuestra primera lectura. David fue ungido rey de todo Israel. Su reino se convirtió en un reino grande y poderoso, admirado, temido y respetado por todos. Después de David vino Salomón. Logró mantener unido el reino de su padre, pero al cabo de un tiempo, las tribus se separaron y el reino se redujo una vez más a pequeños reinos. El pueblo de Israel solo tenía un sueño: la restauración del poderoso reino de David. Oraban diariamente a Dios pidiéndole que les enviara un mesías que cumpliera su gran sueño y ambición. Jesús fue la respuesta de Dios a sus oraciones y expectativas.

En el evangelio de hoy, vemos cómo Dios ha cumplido estas expectativas. En el monte Calvario. Jesús fue clavado en la cruz, con dos ladrones, uno a cada lado, y sobre su cabeza se leía la inscripción: “INRI” Iesus, Nazarenus, Rex Iudeorum —Jesús de Nazaret, Rey de los Judíos.

Sin embargo, lo que vemos en la cruz es a un hombre derrotado, incapaz de defenderse. El pueblo de Israel esperaba un gran rey en un trono de oro, revestido de grandeza y que evocara las victorias y los triunfos de David. Sin duda, si Jesús bajara de la cruz, estarían dispuestos a creer. Creían en un Dios fuerte y poderoso que vence y humilla a sus enemigos, que contrarresta las provocaciones de los malvados, que infunde temor y respeto. Pero este no es el Mesías de Dios. Porque si Jesús bajara de la cruz, estaría traicionando su misión: estaría aprobando la falsa idea de Dios según la mentalidad de los líderes de Israel. Si Jesús bajara de la cruz, estaría confirmando el tipo de Dios que adoran los poderosos de este mundo, un dios que es como ellos: fuerte, arrogante, opresivo y vengativo.

Sin embargo, aún hoy, nosotros, los cristianos, llevamos en nuestros corazones y mentes a este Dios, un Dios que muestra su poder para castigar la maldad de este mundo. Al pie de la cruz estaban los soldados. Simplemente seguían órdenes. Eran gente pobre que, por dinero, era enviada a cumplir las órdenes de sus superiores y, en el proceso, perdían toda humanidad al repetir lo que las autoridades decían: “Si tú eres el rey de los judíos, sálvate a ti mismo”.

Y, sin embargo, colgando junto a Jesús, había uno que reconoció al Mesías y clamó: “Señor, cuando llegues a tu Reino, acuérdate de mí”. Este hombre era un pecador, un ladrón que merecía morir. Y este ladrón comprendió que podía dirigirse a Jesús por su nombre porque vio en él a un Mesías con compasión por los que eligieron el mal camino. Reconoció al Mesías como un compañero que, aunque íntegro, había aceptado el destino del pecador. A él, Jesús le promete: “Yo te aseguro que hoy estarás conmigo en el paraíso”.

La historia de este pecador colgado junto a Jesús es la historia de cada uno de nosotros, pues quizá nos hayamos comportado como él. Tras dañar a otros con nuestro odio, calumnias y difamación, tras ser causa de calamidad para la sociedad, la familia y la comunidad, terminamos solos y desesperados. Y entonces le suplicamos: “Señor, cuando llegues a tu Reino, acuérdate de mí”. ❖



Pescando en lo Profundo

Feliz Día de Acción de Gracias

Este jueves celebraremos el Día de Acción de Gracias. Solo pensarlo me envuelve una sobrecarga sensorial. Me imagino preparando el pavo, horneándolo y rociándolo con su jugo; los pais de calabaza, manzana y nuez horneando en el horno. Casi puedo oler el aroma. Luego, visualizo el banquete en sí, a la familia llegando de cerca y de lejos, compartiendo con entusiasmo historias que no llegaron a las redes sociales, a los niños jugando alegremente. Casi puedo oír las conversaciones alegres y las risas contagiosas.

Aquí les dejo una curiosidad sobre el Día de Acción de Gracias. ¿Sabían que incluso antes de que los pasajeros del Mayflower celebraran un banquete de Acción de Gracias con los nativos americanos Wampanoag, probablemente hubo celebraciones anteriores en las que los colonos invitaban a sus vecinos nativos americanos? Generalmente, el banquete de Acción de Gracias era para agradecer a Dios por haber sobrevivido al viaje a la nueva tierra, o a la hambruna o la guerra. De hecho, en 1789, George Washington proclamó el primer Día Nacional de Acción de Gracias como "...un día de acción de gracias y oración pública, para ser observado reconociendo con corazones agradecidos las muchas y señaladas bendiciones del Dios Todopoderoso..." En sus inicios, el Día de Acción de Gracias no era una celebración anual, sino que se conmemoraba si el Presidente lo proclamaba, y no tenía por qué celebrarse en noviembre. Fue hasta 1863 cuando Abraham Lincoln proclamó la observancia anual del Día de Acción de Gracias: "...por lo tanto, invito a mis conciudadanos en todas partes de los Estados Unidos, así como a quienes se encuentran en alta mar y a quienes residen en tierras extranjeras, a que aparten y observen el último jueves de noviembre próximo como un día de Acción de Gracias y alabanza a nuestro Padre bondadoso que mora en los cielos". En 1941, el presidente Roosevelt firmó la ley que fijaría el Día de Acción de Gracias el cuarto jueves de noviembre, como lo conocemos hoy.

Es un buen recordatorio de que el propósito original de esta festividad es dar gracias a Dios, "nuestro Padre bondadoso" por todos los dones y favores que nos ha concedido.

Pero no tenemos que esperar al Día de Acción de Gracias para agradecerle. Nuestra vida puede ser un constante agradecimiento. Desde lo sublime, agradecerle a Dios por haberme creado y hecho cristiano, por enviar a Jesús a salvarnos de nuestros pecados, de lo mundano, "Gracias, Dios, por este lugar para estacionar. Gracias por sostenerme en el dentista. Gracias por esta deliciosa comida". En un retiro al que asistí hace mucho tiempo, el sacerdote jesuita que dio la charla nos contó que, al despertar, pronuncia una palabra o frase de alabanza a Dios: "Te amo, querido Dios, y te adoro". No es mala idea continuar dando gracias. "Gracias, Señor. Gracias por darme la vida. Gracias por protegerme durante la noche".

Pero no basta con decir gracias. Es significativo que en la Proclamación del Día de Acción de Gracias de 1789, Washington exhorta al pueblo a que sea su deber "...reconocer la providencia del Dios Todopoderoso, obedecer su voluntad, agradecer sus beneficios e implorar humildemente su protección y favor...". What is a Pilgrimage In the Words of Pope Francis

“Making a Pilgrimage to shrines is one of the most eloquent expressions of the faith of God’s people... It would be a mistake to think that those who go on a pilgrimage live a spirituality that is not personal but rather of the masses. The reality is that the pilgrim carries within him his own history and faith and the lights and shadows of his own life. Each person carries within his or her heart a special wish and a particular prayer. Those who enter the shrine immediately feel they are at home, welcomed, understood, and supported. Gazing upon the Crucifix or a image of Our Lady, a prayer is offered with tears in their eyes, brimming with faith. A shrine is truly a privileged space to meet the Lord and physically touch his mercy. To confess in a shrine is to have the experience of physically touching the mercy of God ” ~ To those engaged in Pilgrimage Work, January 21, 2016

The Christian Pilgrimage is characterized by three signs:

1. “silence [which] allows one to listen, to listen with the heart, and in this way to find, while one walks, through the effort, the answers that the heart is looking for, because the heart asks questions. Indeed, God speaks in silence, like a gentle breeze...”
2. “the Gospel – always have the Gospel in your pocket ...The pilgrimage is made by re-reading the journey that Jesus took, up to the extreme gift of Self. ... when one reads the Gospel, there is someone beside us. It is the Holy Spirit. It is He who makes us understand well what the Gospel does. “
3. “Matthew 25 Protocol”: “Whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me” (Mt 25:40)...doing good, to people who also smaller, the most disadvantaged people. Always do good. Along the way, be attentive to others, especially those who struggle the most, who have fallen, who are in need...” To the Italian pilgrims of the The Way of St James, December 19, 2024.

Local Pilgrimage Sites

Throughout this Holy Year, a plenary Indulgence in the usual form of the Church will be granted to all the faithful who are truly repentant and detached from any sin and confess their sins sacramentally, receive Holy Communion, pray for the intentions of the Holy Father, and go on a pilgrimage visit to the [Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels](#) or [Mission Basilica San Buenaventura](#), or perform corporal or spiritual works of mercy.

What is a plenary indulgence?

God never ceases to offer us his mercy. When we sin, an unhealthy attachment to earthly things remains even after the guilt of sin is forgiven. Such attachments can be purified here on earth through an indulgence or in purgatory; this purification is known as the remission of temporal punishment due to sin (Catechism of the Catholic Church 1472).

During the Jubilee, a plenary indulgence - the complete remission of temporal punishment due to sin (CCC, 1471) - in the usual form of the Church will be granted to all the faithful who are truly repentant and confess their sins, receive Holy Communion, pray for the intentions of the Holy Father, and perform one of the following:

1. a pilgrimage visit to the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels or Mission Basilica San Buenaventura to pray;
2. participation in a parish mission or study of the documents of the Second Vatican Council or the Catechism of the Catholic Church;
3. corporal or spiritual works of mercy;
4. penitential practices.

¿Qué es una peregrinación? En palabras del Papa Francisco

Peregrinar a los santuarios es una de las expresiones más elocuentes de la fe del pueblo de Dios... Sería un error pensar que quienes peregrinan viven una espiritualidad no personal, sino de masas. La realidad es que el peregrino lleva en sí su propia historia y fe, así como las luces y sombras de su vida. Cada persona lleva en su corazón un deseo especial y una oración particular. Quienes entran al santuario se sienten inmediatamente como en casa, acogidos, comprendidos y apoyados. Al contemplar el Crucifijo o una imagen de Nuestra Señora, se ofrece una oración con lágrimas en los ojos. Un santuario es verdaderamente un espacio privilegiado para encontrar al Señor y tocar físicamente su misericordia. Confesarse en un santuario es tener la experiencia de tocar físicamente la misericordia de Dios, 21 de enero de 2016.

La peregrinación cristiana se caracteriza por tres signos:

1. "El silencio [que] permite escuchar, escuchar con el corazón, y así encontrar, mientras se camina, mediante el esfuerzo, las respuestas que el corazón busca, porque el corazón se pregunta. En efecto, Dios habla en silencio, como una suave brisa..."
2. "El Evangelio: ten siempre el Evangelio en el bolsillo... La peregrinación se realiza releyendo el camino de Jesús, hasta la entrega extrema de sí mismo... Cuando leemos el Evangelio, hay alguien a nuestro lado. Es el Espíritu Santo. Es Él quien nos hace comprender bien lo que hace el Evangelio."
3. "Protocolo Mateo 25": "Todo lo que hicieron con uno de estos hermanos míos más pequeños, conmigo lo hicieron" (Mt 25,40)...haciendo el bien, también a las personas más pequeñas, a las más desfavorecidas. Haz siempre el bien. En el camino, estad atentos a los demás, especialmente a los que más luchan, a los que han caído, a los que están necesitados... 





STATEMENT ON IMMIGRATION ISSUES BY ARCHBISHOP JOSÉ H. GOMEZ

Statements and actions from the new administration in Washington have caused fear in our parishes, schools, and communities. That is not good for anybody. I pray that our leaders will proceed with restraint and compassion, with respect for the law, and with respect for the rights and dignity of all concerned.

No one wants violent criminals living in our communities. But any enforcement actions should be prudent, and should be matched by immediate action in Congress to fix our immigration system, which has been broken for decades now.

The Catholic Church has long been committed to working with our national leaders for immigration reform that is just and humane. My commitment also continues, and we look forward to working with the new administration and Congress.
