Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Isaiah 49:3,5-6

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 4

– *Here am I, Lord, I come to do your will.*

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:1-3

Gospel: John 1:29-36

We are at the beginning of the liturgical season in Ordinary Time after the season of Christmas. Today, on this second Sunday in Ordinary Time, the gospel uses the image of the Lamb of God for Jesus to reveal to us the mission of Jesus who has come to take away the sins of the world.

Many images and figures could have been used to define the work that Jesus was about to accomplish. He could have been presented as a legislator or judge or teacher or master, but none of these appear. At the beginning of the Gospel, John the Baptist calls him ‘the Lamb of God’ for this is the image that best sums up all that Jesus is about to do.

When the people of Israel were made slaves in Egypt, on the night they were freed from Pharaoh’s grasp, each family sacrificed a lamb and its blood was used to mark their doorposts. The blood of the lamb saved them from extermination or death from the angel of death.

Also, long before John the Baptist, the prophets spoke of a mysterious servant of God who would someday suffer and die, like a lamb. Describing the death of this suffering servant, Isaiah 53, 7-8 says: “He was treated harshly, but endured it humbly . . . Like a lamb about to be slaughtered . . . he never said a word. He was arrested and sentenced and led off to die . . . He was put to death for the sins of our people.” Isaiah, in the first reading, spoke of the prophetic mission of this Servant: “to raise up the tribes of Jacob . . . I will make you a light to the nations, that my salvation may reach to the ends of the earth.”

By presenting Jesus as the Lamb of God, John the Baptist is trying to tell us that Jesus has come to give up his life and that his blood will free all from sin and from the forces of evil. And like the humiliated Servant in the first reading, the defeat of

Jesus would bring light and salvation to all. This is the mission of Jesus.

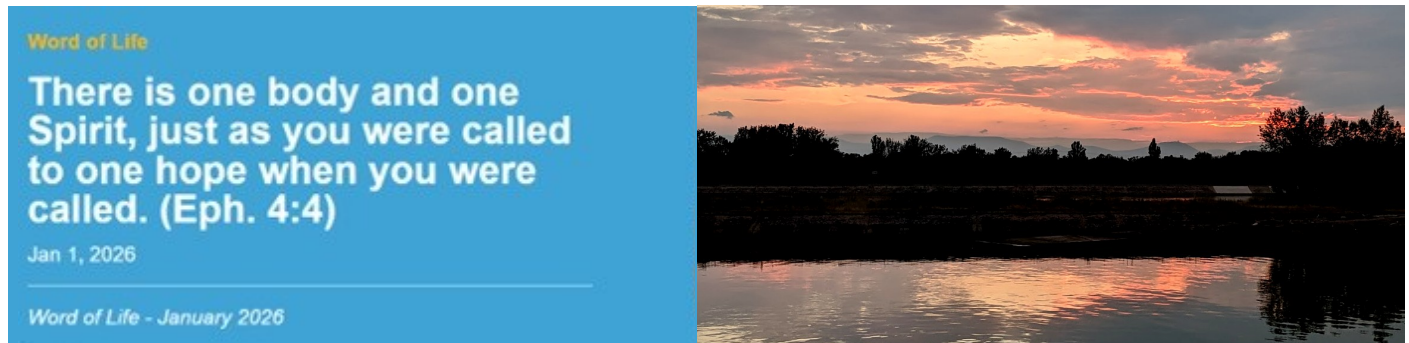
In brief, the title “Lamb of God” conjures up two images: one of affection and love for the lamb and one of suffering and sacrifice by the lamb. Thus, it comes as no surprise that of the many titles of Jesus, like “Prince of Peace”, “Light of the World”, “Good shepherd,” and “Bread of Life”, it is the title “Lamb of God” that we sing just before Communion. And this song for Jesus as the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world is a preview of the moment at the end of time when people of all nations will join the angels of heaven in singing this song to Jesus, the eternal Lamb of God.

The description then of Jesus as the Lamb of God refers to his mission, his vocation. From his vocation and mission is derived our own calling. In saving his people, God called ministers to share in his work. In the old days, he had Israel’s leaders and prophets until he finally sent his Son, Jesus, to become like one of us and establish God’s reign here on earth. Jesus offered himself as the sacrificial lamb of our salvation. His mission continues in us until he comes again. It is now in our hands to carry on the mission for which we have been baptized. We are living in a world where the darkness of hatred, war, greed, and indifference is growing. More and more, God’s mercy and forgiveness are needed. Each of us is called to be an instrument of God’s goodness and love.

Today, let us pray for deeper insight into our role in Christ’s mission. At our Baptism, we were told: “We are to walk always as children of the light, keeping the flame of faith burning brightly within our hearts.” Like the Lamb of God, following Jesus calls us to outstanding and wholehearted service— one that ultimately asks nothing less than everything. ❖

Cast into the Deep “One Body, One Spirit Week of Prayer for Christian Unity

In the northern hemisphere, the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity traditionally takes place from January 18 to 25. For 2026, the prayers and reflections have been prepared by the faithful of the Armenian Apostolic Church, along with their brothers and sisters of the Armenian Catholic and Evangelical Churches. The theme of the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity 2026 is based on a text from the letter of St. Paul to the Ephesians: “There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to one hope when you were called.” (Eph. 4:4)



During the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, we are invited to focus on the theme found in Paul’s letter to the Ephesians. This epistle is one of his so called prison letters, and in it, he exhorts all those who listen to his message to be credible witnesses to their faith through the unity among them. This unity is based on one faith, one spirit and one hope and it is the only means of witnessing to Christ’s followers as his “body.”

There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to one hope when you were called.

So, Paul calls us back to hope. But what is hope and why are we invited to live it? It is not only a seed that develops but also a gift that we can protect, cultivate and bring to fruition for the good of all. “Christian hope sets us upon a narrow mountain ridge that is like a frontier where our vocation asks that we choose to be faithful to God’s faithfulness to us every day and every hour.” (Madeleine Delbr el, [Noi delle Strade](#))

Our vocation, the call to be Christian, is not just an individual matter between each person and God; it is a ‘convocation’, being called together. It is the call to unity among those who are committed to living the Gospel. In Chiara Lubich’s talks and writings [foundress of the Focolare Movement], we often find explicit references to unity as an integral part of her spirituality. It is the fruit of Jesus’ presence among us and this presence is the source of profound happiness.

‘If unity is so important for Christians, then failing to achieve it must be contrary to their vocation. We sin against unity every time we give in to the continual temptation of individualism, which pushes us to do things alone, guided by our own judgement, interests, or personal prestige, and to ignore or even despise others, their needs, and their rights.’ (Chiara Lubich, Word of Life, July 1985)

In Guatemala, there is great collaboration and dialogue between members of different Christian Churches. Ramiro writes, “People from different Churches worked together to organize the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. The program included an arts festival that young people helped to initiate and various celebrations in different churches. This was so successful that the Catholic Bishops’ Conference asked us to continue this initiative in preparation for a gathering with Catholic bishops and believers from many Churches who were travelling from across the Americas for a conference commemorating the 1700th anniversary of the Council of Nicaea. It’s not only during these special activities but whenever we come together I feel we always experience a strong sense of unity among us all and the fruits that it brings: fraternity, joy, and peace.”

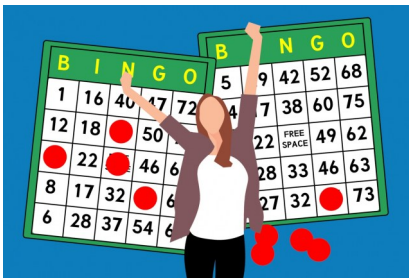

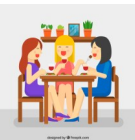

Hoy, intenten reconocer la presencia de Dios a su lado en diferentes momentos del día y recen una sencilla oración de agradecimiento por su amistad y guía.

II Domingo Del Tiempo Ordinario**Primera Lectura: Isaías 49, 3.5-6****Salmo Responsorial: Salmo 4***- Aquí estoy, Señor, para hacer tu voluntad.***Segunda Lectura 1 Corintios 1, 1-3****Evangelio: Juan 1, 29-36**

Aún estamos al comienzo del tiempo litúrgico del Tiempo Ordinario, tras el tiempo de la Navidad. Hoy, en este segundo domingo del Tiempo Ordinario, el evangelio utiliza la imagen del Cordero de Dios para Jesús, para revelarnos la misión de Jesús, quien vino a liberar al mundo del pecado.

Muchas imágenes y figuras podrían haberse usado para definir la obra que Jesús estaba a punto de realizar. Podría haber sido presentado como legislador, juez, maestro o amo, pero ninguna de ellas aparece. Al comienzo del Evangelio, Juan el Bautista lo llama “el Cordero de Dios”, pues esta es la imagen que mejor resume todo lo que Jesús está a punto de hacer.

Cuando el pueblo de Israel fue esclavizado en Egipto, la noche en que fueron liberados del poder del Faraón, cada familia sacrificó un cordero y su sangre se usó para marcar los postes de sus puertas. La sangre del cordero los salvó del exterminio o de la muerte a manos del ángel de la muerte.

Además, mucho antes de Juan el Bautista, los profetas hablaron de un misterioso siervo de Dios que algún día sufriría y moriría, como un cordero. Al describir la muerte de este siervo sufriente, Isaías 53, 7-8 dice: “Fue tratado con dureza, pero lo soportó con humildad... Como un cordero a punto de ser sacrificado... no dijo ni una palabra. Fue arrestado, sentenciado y llevado a morir... Fue condenado a muerte por los pecados de nuestro pueblo”. Isaías, en la primera lectura, habló de la misión profética de este Siervo: “para restablecer a las tribus de Jacob... te voy a convertir en luz de las naciones, para que mi salvación llegue hasta los últimos rincones de la tierra”.

Al presentar a Jesús como el Cordero de Dios, Juan el Bautista intenta decirnos que Jesús vino a entregar su vida y que su sangre liberará a todos del pecado y de las fuerzas del mal. Y, como el Siervo humillado de la primera lectura, la derrota de Jesús traería luz y salvación a todos. Esta es la misión de Jesús.

En resumen, el título de “Cordero de Dios” evoca dos imágenes: una de afecto y amor por el cordero y otra de sufrimiento y sacrificio por parte del cordero. Por lo tanto, no sorprende que, de los muchos títulos de Jesús, como “Príncipe de la Paz”, “Luz del Mundo”, “Buen Pastor” y “Pan de Vida”, sea el de “Cordero de Dios” el que cantamos justo antes de la Comunión. Y este cántico para Jesús como el Cordero de Dios que quita el pecado del mundo es un anticipo del momento, al final de los tiempos, cuando personas de todas las naciones se unirán a los ángeles del cielo para cantar este cántico a Jesús, el eterno Cordero de Dios.

La descripción de Jesús como el Cordero de Dios se refiere, entonces, a su misión, a su vocación. De su vocación y misión se deriva nuestro propio llamado. Al salvar a su pueblo, Dios llamó a ministros a participar en su obra. En la antigüedad, contó con los líderes y profetas de Israel hasta que finalmente envió a su Hijo, Jesús, para que se hiciera como uno de nosotros y estableciera el reino de Dios aquí en la tierra. Jesús se ofreció como el cordero sacrificial de nuestra salvación. Su misión continúa en nosotros hasta su regreso. Ahora está en nuestras manos continuar la misión para la que fuimos bautizados. Vivimos en un mundo donde la oscuridad del odio, la guerra, la codicia y la indiferencia crece. Cada vez más, necesitamos la misericordia y el perdón de Dios. Cada uno de nosotros está llamado a ser instrumento de la bondad y el amor de Dios.

Hoy, oremos para comprender mejor nuestro papel en la misión de Cristo. En nuestro Bautismo, escuchamos: “Debemos caminar siempre como hijos de la luz, manteniendo viva la llama de la fe en nuestros corazones”. Como el Cordero de Dios, seguir a Jesús nos llama a un servicio excepcional y de todo corazón, uno que en última instancia no pide nada menos que todo. ❖

Un Solo Cuerpo, Un Solo Espíritu

La Semana de Oración por la Unidad de los Cristianos

En el hemisferio norte, la Semana de Oración por la Unidad Cristiana se celebra tradicionalmente del 18 al 25 de enero. Para 2026, las oraciones y reflexiones han sido preparadas por los fieles de la Iglesia Apostólica Armenia, junto con sus hermanos y hermanas de las Iglesias Católica Armenia y Evangélica Armenia. El tema de la Semana de Oración por la Unidad Cristiana de 2026 se basa en un texto de la carta de San Pablo a los Efesios: «Hay un solo cuerpo y un solo Espíritu, así como ustedes fueron llamados a una sola esperanza cuando fueron llamados» (Efesios 4:4).

Palabra de Vida - Enero 2026



En la Semana de oración por la unidad de los cristianos [1] estamos invitados a concentrar nuestra atención en un tema en particular, el que se refiere en la Carta de Pablo a los Efesios. En las llamadas cartas de la prisión, Pablo se dirige a sus destinatarios exhortándolos a dar un testimonio creíble de su fe a través de la unidad, basada en una única fe, un solo espíritu y una sola esperanza, solo a través de la cual se da testimonio de Cristo como «cuerpo».

«Un solo Cuerpo y un solo Espíritu, como una es la esperanza a que habéis sido llamados».

Pablo nos llama a la esperanza. ¿Qué es la esperanza y por qué se nos invita a vivirla? Es un brote, un regalo y una tarea que tenemos el deber de custodiar, cultivar y hacer fructificar para bien de todos. «La esperanza cristiana nos encomienda situarnos en la delgada línea del cordal, esa frontera donde nuestra vocación nos exige elegir cada día y en cada momento ser fieles a la fidelidad de Dios por nosotros» (Madeleine Delbrél, *Noi delle Strade*)

Para los cristianos, nuestra vocación, nuestra llamada no es un asunto solo entre el individuo y Dios, sino que es convocación, es decir, somos llamados juntos, es la llamada a la unidad entre quienes se comprometen a vivir el Evangelio. En las intervenciones y escritos de Chiara Lubich [fundadora del Movimiento de los Focolares] encontramos a menudo referencias explícitas a la unidad como aspecto propio de su espiritualidad: esta es fruto de la presencia de Jesús entre nosotros. Y esta presencia es fuente de una profunda felicidad.

«Si la unidad es tan importante para el cristiano, entonces nada se opone tanto a su vocación como el faltar a ella. Y pecamos contra la unidad todas las veces que cedemos a la tentación –que reaparece continuamente– del individualismo, el cual nos impulsa a hacer las cosas por nuestra cuenta, a dejarnos guiar por nuestro juicio, nuestro interés o prestigio personal, ignorando o incluso despreciando a los demás, sus exigencias y sus derechos» (Chiara Lubich, Palabra de Vida, julio 1985)

En Guatemala hay un diálogo muy activo entre los miembros de distintas Iglesias cristianas. Nos escribe Ramiro: «Preparamos la Semana de oración por la unidad de los cristianos junto con un grupo de personas de distintas Iglesias. En el programa se incluyó un festival artístico preparado con los jóvenes y varios actos en las distintas iglesias. La Conferencia Episcopal católica nos pidió que continuásemos con la experiencia preparando también un rato de intercambio con un grupo de obispos católicos y personas de distintas Iglesias que habían confluído desde toda América para un encuentro dedicado al 1700 aniversario del Concilio de Nicea. Más allá de estas actividades, experimentamos muy fuerte la unidad entre todos nosotros y los frutos que esta lleva consigo: fraternidad, alegría y paz».

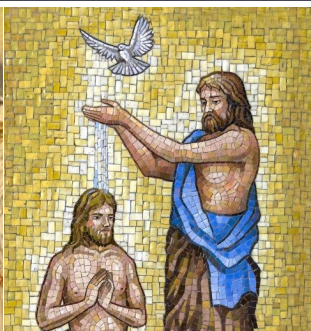
