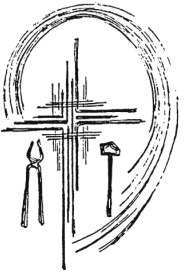

Wednesday, April 16: Chrism Mass
LAKE CHARLES — Everyone is invited to attend the Chrism Mass at 10:00 a.m. Wednesday, April 16, in the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception, 935 Bilbo Street. Bishop Glen John Provost will gather with all of the priests of the diocese to bless the Sacred Oils to be used in the coming year. There is also a renewal of priestly promises during the Chrism Mass.


This annual Mass has been celebrated in the Catholic Church for more than 1,000 years and is marked by the ceremonial blessing of the Oil of Catechumens (used during the Sacrament of Baptism), the Oil of the Sick (used during the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick), and the consecration of the Oil of Chrism (a mixture of oil and balsam), which are all used throughout the year. After Mass, the oils are distributed to representatives of each parish. The oils are taken back to the parishes and used for the Sacraments.

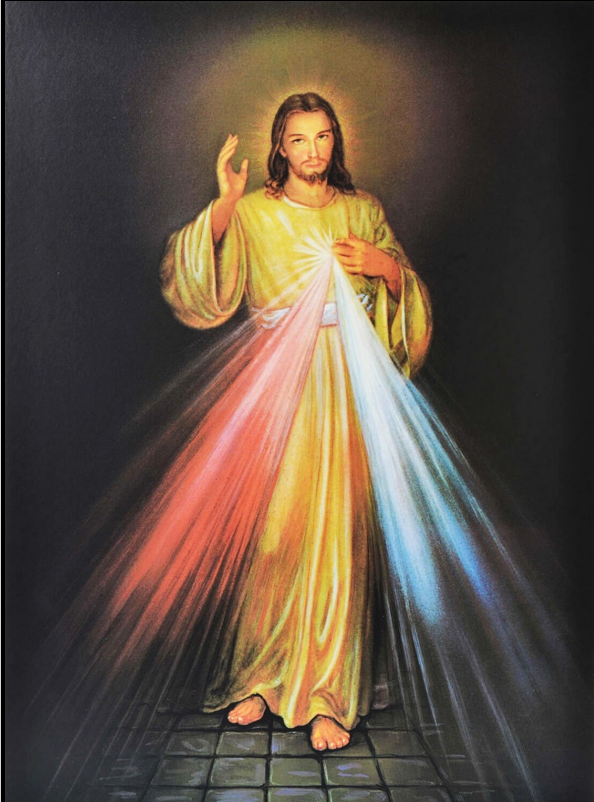

Divine Mercy Sunday & Novena

Divine Mercy is a feast day celebrated on the second Sunday of Easter, which falls on April 27th, 2025. This celebration was instituted to honor God’s mercy and compassion, revealed through the life and mission of Jesus Christ. In preparation for Divine Mercy Sunday, a 9 day novena is prayed, beginning on Good Friday. Each day of the novena has a different intention that is dear to the Heart of Jesus. The novena is intended to bring these souls to the “ocean of mercy” and to beg God for the graces needed for their salvation and well-being.

- Day 1 Good Friday, April 18th: All mankind, sinners**
- Day 2 Holy Saturday, April 19th: The souls of priests and religious**
- Day 3 Easter Sunday, April 20th: All devout and faithful souls**
- Day 4 Easter Monday, April 21st: Those who do not believe in God and those who do not yet know Jesus**
- Day 5 Easter Tuesday, April 22nd: The souls who have separated themselves from the Church**
- Day 6 Easter Wednesday, April 23rd: The meek and humble souls and the souls of little children**
- Day 7 Easter Thursday, April 24th: The souls who especially venerate and glorify His mercy**
- Day 8 Easter Friday, April 25th: The souls who are detained in purgatory**
- Day 9 Easter Saturday, April 26th: The souls who have become lukewarm**

In the 1930’s, Jesus chose a humble Polish nun, St. Maria Faustina Kowalska, to receive private revelations concerning Divine Mercy that were recorded in her Diary. St. Faustina’s Diary records 14 occasions when Jesus requested that a Feast of Mercy (Divine Mercy Sunday) be observed.
My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the Fount of My Mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment... Let no soul fear to draw near to Me. ...It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the First Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy.

-St. Faustina, Diary, no.699

Jesus encouraged the devotion to His Divine Mercy through three principle means: the image of Divine Mercy, the Feast of the Divine Mercy, and the Chaplet of the Divine Mercy. The Chaplet of Divine Mercy is often prayed during the novena. This novena and the celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday are intended to help individuals and communities deepen their understanding of God’s mercy and to encourage them to trust in His love and forgiveness.
