

STEWARDSHIP AS A WAY OF LIFE



Last week we talked about Stewardship as a way of life. We discussed how all we receive is from God and that giftedness varies from one individual to another -- our giftedness is unique. Not feeling prideful or jealous but

being truly humble for the generosity of God, including for our abilities, interests, and vocations. As stewards (guardians of the parish) we need to be grateful for what we have and responsible in using the gifts we have received. This includes sharing generously and being accountable for how we use our giftedness. Today we continue the reflection on stewardship.

Obstacles to Stewardship as a Way of Life

Fear that if we share our time, we won't have enough to do what we want to do. Fear that if we give our money away, we won't have enough to buy what we want for our loved ones and ourselves. Fear that if we offer our talents, they won't be good enough to meet our expectations.

Fear that if we love without strings, we won't receive enough love in return, etc. Our consumer-driven society tells us we will never have "enough", that we will always have to buy more, do more, be more.

Christian Stewardship is counter-cultural. It has been called the "antidote to materialism". We Christians believe that God gave each of us "enough." That is, exactly what we need to fulfill the plan He has for us.

Collectively too, we know we have been given "enough" if we share with one another! No matter how small or limited our gifts seem, if we share them generously God will make what we offer "enough", just as Jesus did when He took the few loaves and fishes and made it "enough" to feed the multitudes!

Stewardship is a call to discern our wants from our needs, a call to simplicity, a call to prioritize our lives so we spend our precious time and resources on what is truly important. Stewardship is our faith lived out in our daily lives. We must have faith that God will always provide what we need and faith that we can live a disciple's life as He calls us and faith that when we fail because of our human weaknesses, still He will be there to provide comfort, to lift us up and help us to try again.

Time, Talent and Treasure

No matter what our position in life or how many demands are put on us, all of us have exactly the same number of hours available in each day. Making good use of that time requires keeping our priorities straight. Since our time is limited, each time we say 'yes' to one thing, we are forced to say 'no' to something else. We need to make sure our highest priorities get the 'yes'.

A simple but profound way to be a good steward of God's gift of time is to attend Mass regularly and to establish a good prayer life. Even those in your audience who may feel they don't have the means to contribute in any other way can still pray for the needs of the Church, the world, their community and individual members of the community.

We need not excel at something to be talented. Instead of asking "Will you volunteer?" ask "How will you use your gifts to serve others?" A volunteer can say yes or no, but as baptized disciples/followers of Jesus Christ, we are called to use our gifts to serve others and build up the kingdom of God. We are His hands and feet, eyes and ears, mind and heart in the world.

Christian stewardship shows us that everything comes from God, including our wealth and the ability to create our wealth. Letting go of some of what is really only on loan to us anyway is very freeing. It allows us to follow the teachings of Jesus more closely.

Being a good steward of the money and possessions God entrusts to our care requires that we honestly discern our needs from our wants. God always provides what we need, but seldom everything we want.

If we don't make a deliberate plan to return the "first fruits" we receive from God back to Him after taking care of our own needs and many of our selfish wants, we will only have what is leftover for God. This is why making an annual plan is important to the charitable giving aspect of our discipleship. Sometimes people ask what a "minimum" gift is. But why should we even consider a minimum obligation to the God who has given us everything? While our God cannot be outdone in generosity, we at least need to share with others out of profound gratitude and love for God. To make your gift sacred, or sacrificial, it should be enough to make a difference in your lifestyle. Don't "give 'til it hurts," give until it feels good!



After the Catholic funeral Mass and burial of one of my cousins many years ago, a young woman approached me and said, "I'm not Catholic. But I want to be buried with a Catholic funeral service!" She was impressed with the beautiful Catholic funeral liturgy, and especially with the fact that we prayed for the dead. Prayer for the dead is deeply rooted in our Catholic tradition because it is deeply rooted in the Bible, beginning in the Old Testament. The Second Book of Maccabees (12:45-46) states that it is a holy and whole-some thought to pray for the dead, that they might be freed from their sins. This passage shows that Jews in the two centuries before Christ believed in praying for the dead. The apostles and first Christians took this for granted.

Belief in purgatory flows from this practice. If heaven and hell were the only possibilities after death, there would be no reason to pray for the dead. Those in heaven do not need prayers, and those in hell are beyond the reach of prayer. As a result, the Church reasoned to the existence of purgatory, an intermediate state where people can be helped by prayer.

Many New Testament passages show the importance of praying for the dead. For example, Saint Paul's Second Letter to Timothy contains a prayer for one who had died: Paul says of his friend, Onesiphorus: "May the Lord grant him to find mercy from the Lord on that day." As the footnotes in the New American Bible point out, Onesiphorus had died before this letter was written, and Paul's words are a prayer for his deceased friend (2 Timothy 1:16-18).

Christians prayed for the dead from New Testament times, as evidenced by inscriptions in the Roman catacombs. In the fourth century Saint Monica made this deathbed request of her son, Saint Augustine, "One thing only I ask you, that you remember me at the altar of the Lord wherever you may be."

As members of the Association of the Miraculous Medal, we instinctively turn to our Blessed Mother as we pray for our beloved dead. Mary was present at the death of Saint Joseph. She stood at the cross of Jesus. We ask her to pray for us "at the hour of our death," and we entrust our loved ones to her. ...

The month of November reminds us to pray for the souls in purgatory, and testifies to our belief in the communion of saints. By prayer, we are close to our loved ones in purgatory and in heaven. They watch over us and pray for us.




Sunday, November 7th at 4:30 pm - Mass of Remembrance This Mass will fulfill your Sunday obligation.


