




## Why is June the Month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus?

June is known as the month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus most simply because the solemnity of the Sacred Heart is celebrated during this month. This year, the solemnity falls on June 16. The date changes each year because it is celebrated on the Friday after the Corpus Christi octave, or the Friday after the second Sunday after Pentecost. However, other reasons exist as to why June is dedicated to the Sacred Heart.

The feast dates back to 1673, when a French nun who belonged to the Order of the Visitation of Holy Mary (Visitandines) in eastern France began to receive visions about the Sacred Heart. Jesus appeared to Sister Margaret Mary Alacoque and revealed ways to venerate His Sacred Heart and explained the immense love He has for humanity, appearing with His heart visible outside his chest, on fire, and surrounded by a crown of thorns.

These different ways include partaking in a holy hour on Thursdays and the reception of the Eucharist on the first Friday of every month. Jesus told Sister Margaret Mary: "My Sacred Heart is so intense in its love for men, and for you in particular, that not being able to contain within it the flames of its ardent charity, they must be transmitted through all means." These visions continued for 18 months.

On June 16, 1675, Jesus told Sister Margaret Mary to promote a feast that honored His Sacred Heart. He also gave Sister Margaret Mary 12 promises made to all who venerate and promote the devotion of the Sacred Heart. He said: "I ask of you that the Friday after the octave of Corpus Christi be set apart for a special feast to honor My Heart, by communicating on that day, and making reparation to it by a solemn act, in order to make amends for the indignities which it has received during the time it has been exposed on the altars. I promise you that My Heart shall expand itself to shed in abundance the influence of its divine love upon those who shall thus honor it, and cause it to be honored."

Sister Margaret Mary died in 1690 and was canonized by Pope Benedict XV on May 13, 1920.

# Fostering a Personal Relationship With the Eucharistic Lord

Do you believe Jesus wants a deep, personal relationship of love with you? Do you believe He is at the door of your heart at this moment, and at every moment, longing for you to be united with Him?

Place your name at the beginning of this sentence from the Gospel of John: "[Name], as the Father loves Me, so I also love you. Remain in My love" (John 15:9). Be assured that Jesus means that message for *you* as He declares that He is the Vine and we are the branches. So emphatic is He, that in the space of ten short verses He repeats "remain in My love," or "remain in Me," *seven times*. Notice that He doesn't ask us to remain *with* Him, but rather to remain *in* Him, indicating the closest possible union. In His Divine nature, Jesus is infinitely capable of entering into deep, one-on-one communion with every single person who has ever lived, or will ever live, all at the same time.

Speaking of Communion, it is in the Eucharist that this invitation is profoundly fulfilled. Indeed, in chapter six of this same Gospel, Jesus declares: "Whoever eats My Flesh and drinks My Blood *remains in Me* and I in him" (John 6:56). We have all heard that passage multiple times at Mass, but have we let it really sink in? It should make our hearts burn with joyful longing!

To strengthen our faith that it is truly the Body of Christ that we receive in Holy Communion, Jesus has worked extraordinary Eucharistic miracles over the centuries, turning the consecrated host into literal flesh and blood. Some of the most striking examples have happened in our own day — in Argentina, Poland, Mexico. In every case, scientific analysis has determined the flesh to be heart tissue, with the rare blood type AB (the same as that found on the Shroud of Turin). In addition, the flesh has continued to exhibit the properties of *living* tissue months and even years after the miracle first occurred, a fact that science is utterly unable to explain.

Is it not clear what Jesus is telling us here? He is saying, "I give you My very Heart, pierced on the Cross and poured out for you. Receive Me, join My Heart to yours." Let this be our meditation each time we receive Him in Holy Communion. Dear Jesus, *remain in us*, and help us to *remain in You*!

#### Questions for reflection:

The late Pope Benedict XVI said in one of his Wednesday Audiences: "Faith is first and foremost a personal, intimate encounter with Jesus, it is having an experience of His closeness, His friendship and His love."

- How would you describe your current relationship with Jesus, and what might you do to nurture it? Consider how you have developed and deepened other relationships in your life.
- 2. Do you do anything in particular to prepare yourself to receive Holy Communion at Mass and to give thanks afterwards? What might you do?

#### Ideas:

- 1. Take time to adore Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, whether at one of the adoration chapels around the diocese or before the tabernacle in your parish church. (see diolc.org/adoration)
- Make a habit of praying to prepare your heart to receive Jesus in Holy Communion, and of praying in thanksgiving afterwards. For some suggested prayers, visit diolc.org/eucharist/pray.






