

Saint Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Although St Joseph never spoke a word in Scripture, his silent example of faithfulness, obedience and care for the Holy Family during Jesus' formative years made him one of the most beloved saints of Christianity.

It is estimated that devotion to Jesus' adoptive father began in the 3rd or 4th century. But according to the Pietá prayer book, there is a prayer to Saint Joseph that dates from the year 50:

O St Joseph, whose protection is so great, so strong, so prompt before the throne of God, I place in you all my interests and desires.

O St Joseph, do assist me by your powerful intercession, and obtain for me from your divine Son all spiritual blessings through Jesus Christ, our Lord, so that having engaged here below your heavenly power I may offer my thanksgiving and homage to the most loving of Fathers.

O St Joseph, I never weary contemplating you and Jesus asleep in your arms. I dare not approach while He reposes near your heart.

Press Him in my name and kiss His fine head for me and ask Him to return the kiss when I draw my dying breath.

St Joseph, Patron of departing souls - Pray for me.



Reflection on Today's Readings

Today's Gospel passage reminds us that life is precious and the gift of time on this earth is just that, a gift. Let's take a moment to reflect on this

profound truth. None of us knows how much time we have, so we must use this gift intentionally to glorify God and serve our neighbor.

Jesus offers the parable of the fig tree to illustrate this truth further. The owner of the orchard came searching for fruit on a fig tree he had planted in his orchard. Finding no fruit on the tree after three years, he told the gardener to cut it down. But the gardener intercedes and asks for one more year to cultivate and fertilize the tree, hoping it will bear fruit. The fig tree was not dying; it simply wasn't doing much of anything at all. Can this be said of us and our lives as well?

The season of Lent is a time to carefully reflect on how we spend our time. Do we make God our priority, tending to our spiritual growth and sacramental life with diligence? Do we give the next priority to our loved ones, focusing intentionally on them each day without distractions from phones, screens, or thoughts of work? If not, now is the moment to repent of our waste of time or misplaced priorities on our use of time.

Remember, God is merciful but just. Let's turn to Him and ask Him to make our lives fruitful while we still have time, knowing that our potential for spiritual growth is limitless with His grace.



CALIX: A Catholic Substance Abuse Recovery Support Group:

It is not a substitute for AA or AI -Anon, which are strongly recommended, but it provides a Catholic perspective for these 12-step programs. "Calix" is Latin for "chalice," and it was founded in Minneapolis in 1947 by a group of five men, all recovering alcoholics, who saw their Catholic faith as a sure path to serenity without alcohol. On April 1, Wisconsinites will vote to elect a State Supreme Court Justice, as well as a number of other judges (district and county), the State Superintendent of Public Education, and candidates for other public office. Millions of dollars are being spent on the State Supreme Court election between Waukesha County Circuit Court Judge Brad Schimel and Dane County Circuit Court Judge Susan Crawford.

Though officially non-partisan, this election is widely viewed as determining the conservative-liberal balance of the State Supreme Court. The Walk to Mary has become a pilgrimage like no other in the world. We start with St Joseph (at the National Shrine of St Joseph) and walk to Mary (at the National Shrine of Our Lady of Champion) to get to Jesus. Our annual pilgrimage has

impacted lives and filled hearts with many blessings from the Holy Family. "This pilgrimage is a blessing whether you walk a few blocks at the National Shrine or walk 1.7, 7, 14 or 22 miles."

The 22 mile walk spiritually prepares us for our destination, America's only Church-approved Marian apparition site, where in 1859, the Blessed Mother appeared to Adele Brise on the site of the **National Shrine of Our Lady of Champion** in Champion, Wisconsin.



Eucharistic Revival - A Minute with Jesus

Spend Time In Jesus' Presence And You Will Gradually Come To Know That Jesus Is Indeed There

The desire to strengthen your faith requires some action on your part. It helps to go to the Church and spend time, with the mindset that Jesus is there. Take your

problems and speak with Jesus. Even if you leave without anything seemingly having happened, you will gradually come to know Jesus *is* indeed there.

Let's pray this right now and every day this week:

"Lord, help me to spend a few minutes in Church and talk with You."

This week, read how Jesus appears to Thomas who was not present when He first appeared to the Apostles after His Resurrection. Thomas, when He does see Jesus, falls before Him and says "My Lord and My God". John 20:19-29





Regulations for Fasting & Abstinence

During the Season of Lent:

- 1. Catholics age 14 and older are to "abstain from meat" on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent, and Good Friday.
- 2. In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics in good health, ages 18 to 59, are to "fast" on Ash Wednesday & Good Friday. Fasting consists of eating only one full meal. Two smaller snacks that do not add up to a single full meal is permitted, if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.



Easter Flowers and Candles Donations

Candles and flowers add beauty and meaning to the Easter Liturgical Celebration and you can donate them in honor of a living or deceased loved one.



The "Easter Lily" a symbol of Christ's resurrection, rises from a single bulb representing Christ rising from the tomb. An ancient belief was that white lilies appeared where drops of blood fell from Christ's body after the crucifixion.

Lighted candles take away darkness and are symbolic of Jesus, "the Light of the world". He brought us hope when He rose from the dead!!

To donate Flowers or Candles, provide the following information:

- your name
- the name of the person you are honoring
- indicate if you are donating a flower or candle
- place this information in an envelope along with a donation
- on the outside of the envelope write: "Easter Decorations"
- put envelope in weekend collection, mail or take to Parish Office


