

Reflection on Today's Gospel

For too many of us, we mistakenly see Lent as a season of doom and gloom, a time to feel bad about all the ways we are not "measuring up" in our spiritual lives. But this is a


misconception. Lent is a season of profound transformation, refreshment, love, awakening and rebirth.

The Gospel Reading, the parable of the Prodigal Son, is a powerful illustration of this theme of awakening and the extravagant, life-changing love that the Father has for each one of us.

We are all familiar with this fantastic story, the bratty younger son who dares to ask his dad for his inheritance early, only to squander it sinfully away. It makes us bristle instinctively at his nerve when we read it. But isn't that precisely what we do when we selfishly turn away from God (in big or small ways) in our own lives? We squander away the inheritance of grace He has given us.

Desperate from the mess he had made of his life, the son finally "comes to his senses", awakening to the truth that he is a beloved son of a loving and merciful father, and returns home. His contrition is faltering, imperfect, and primarily motivated by his growling stomach, but it is enough for the loving father. As soon as the father catches sight of his son, he is "filled with compassion for him" and immediately sets about preparing a feast and fine clothes for him. The father's actions are an extravagant display of love!

Jesus gives us a beautiful picture of our Father's love and mercy, a love that is unconditional and unwavering. Oh, how this should fill us with gratitude for such a Father! And how it should inspire us, with just the tiniest bit of spiritual "spring cleaning", we can be sure we will be swept up in our Father's loving embrace and feasting in His presence. This opportunity is what Lent presents us: a chance for spiritual growth and renewal in our Father's love. That is what Lent is all about.

The Walk to Mary has become a pilgrimage like no other in the world. We start with St Joseph (at the National Shrine of St Joseph) and walk to Mary (at the National Shrine of Our Lady of Champion) to get to Jesus. Our annual pilgrimage

has impacted lives and filled hearts with many blessings from the Holy Family. "This pilgrimage is a blessing whether you walk a few blocks at the National Shrine or walk 1.7. 7. 14 or 22 miles."

The 22 mile walk spiritually prepares us for our destination, America's only Church-approved Marian apparition site, where in 1859, the Blessed Mother appeared to Adele Brise on the site of the **National Shrine of Our Lady of Champion** in Champion, Wisconsin.

VOTE in the April 1 **Elections for a Wisconsin State Supreme Court** Justice, etc.



On April 1, Wisconsinites will vote to elect a State Supreme Court Justice, as well as a number of other judges (district and county), the State Superintendent of Public Education, and candidates for other public office. Millions of dollars are being spent on the State Supreme Court election between Waukesha County Circuit Court Judge Brad Schimel and Dane County Circuit Court Judge Susan Crawford.

Though officially non-partisan, this election is widely viewed as determining the conservative-liberal balance of the State Supreme Court. Regulations for Fasting & Abstinence

During the Season of Lent:

- 1. Catholics age 14 and older are to "abstain from meat" on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent, and Good Friday.
- 2. In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics in good health, ages 18 to 59, are to "fast" on Ash Wednesday & Good Friday. Fasting consists of eating only one full meal. Two smaller snacks that do not add up to a single full meal is permitted, if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.



Easter Flowers and Candles Donations

Candles and flowers add beauty and meaning to the Easter Liturgical Celebration and you can donate them in honor of a living or deceased loved one.



The "Easter Lily" a symbol of Christ's resurrection, rises from a single bulb representing Christ rising from the tomb. An ancient belief was that white lilies appeared where drops of blood fell from Christ's body after the crucifixion.

Lighted candles take away darkness and are symbolic of Jesus, "the Light of the world". He brought us hope when He rose from the dead!!

To donate Flowers or Candles, provide the following information:

- your name
- the name of the person you are honoring
- indicate if you are donating a flower or candle
- place this information in an envelope along with a donation
- on the outside of the envelope write: "Easter Decorations"
- put envelope in weekend collection, mail or take to Parish Office
