### Hospitality for the Glory of God

#### Reflection on Today's Gospel

The concept of hospitality, which is warm and inclusive, is fundamental to a Christian way of life. When we envision hospitality, we naturally think of offering newcomers in our parish a sincere and warm welcome. We

picture inviting them in and helping them feel at home and at ease in our presence, conveying that they are highly valued.

Today's Gospel reading from John invites us to consider hospitality in a slightly different light. In it, we hear Jesus saying this to His disciples: "Whoever loves Me will keep My word, and My Father will love him, and We will come to him and make Our dwelling with him." This passage is not just about love and obedience; it also reflects the hospitality of the heart, inviting God to dwell within us.

Jesus invites us to welcome the Blessed Trinity to dwell within us. This extraordinary request reminds us that our highest and most cherished form of hospitality should be directed toward God Himself.

How does one show hospitality to God? How do we make God "at home and ease" within us? How can we communicate to God that He is "highly valued" by us? Jesus tells us how: We are to keep His word and follow His teachings.

We must know His word to keep it. This requires discipline and effort. We must prioritize studying Scripture and Church teachings in our daily lives; through this study, we gain a deeper understanding of God's word and His teachings, which inspire and motivate us to live Christian lives.

If we want our parish to be a place of genuine Christian hospitality, we must ensure that our hearts are hospitable dwelling places for the Blessed Trinity. Then our smiles, words, greetings, and ministries, each an integral part of our parish community, will radiate with the warmth of God's love. This way, our parish family will become something like Heaven on Earth, and we will all share this larger purpose. This embodies the simplicity and glory of a Christian way of life.



"No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends." Christians are no strangers to sacrifice. Jesus lays down His life for our redemption, martyrs remain faithful to the end, and every believer faces "deaths" in the spiritual life when love requires a re-ordering of preference and priority."

#### WHY DO WE DO THAT? CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

How do I bring God into the work of my daily life?

Whatever your daily work, you have an opportunity to encounter God and to follow His commandments in love. In the New Testament, we see that most of the Apostles didn't have a previous religious position. They were fishermen, tax collectors, and political activists. Among the saints, we have doctors, lawyers, farmers, and stay-at-home moms. No matter your daily tasks, God can be present there!



One way concerns behavior. Start with an examination of conscience. Look at areas where you tend to struggle to imitate Christ at work. Do you gossip? Does brimming frustration become impatience at home? Pick one sin you struggle with, then choose a virtue to strengthen that area. If you tend to speak poorly of co-workers, resolve to stop and to say one kind thing a day instead.

Another way relates to perspective, particularly your perspective of others. Jesus' incarnation reminds us of the value of every human being. Jesus is God, and each of us is created in God's image. When you encounter another person, you have an opportunity to see God in a new place and a new way - in that person in front of you. Genuinely listen to them and be present to their concerns. Loving your neighbor is loving God! Our relationship with God and the love He inspires in our hearts shouldn't remain only at church on Sunday. We can - and should - let our faith animate our lives!




