I desire to know You more, to contemplate You in the Gospel, to be with You and learn from You and from the charity with which You allowed Yourself to be touched by all forms of poverty.


You showed us the Father's love by loving us without measure with Your divine and human heart.



Will you gather your family for 10 minutes a day to pray one Decade of the Rosary? The Rosary is a Scripture-based prayer. It begins with the Apostles' Creed, which summarizes the great mysteries of our Catholic faith. The Our Father, which introduces each mystery, is from the Gospels. The first part of the Hail Mary is the angel's words announcing Christ's birth and Elizabeth's greeting to Mary and the second part is asking Mary to pray for us. The Mysteries of the Rosary center on the events of Christ's life. The repetition in the Rosary is meant to lead us into restful prayer, providing guidance to situations that we face. The gentle repetition of the words helps us to enter into the silence of our hearts, where Jesus dwells.
